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

VP provided general restatement of concern vis-a-vis the terrorist threat against U.S. commercial aviation. Offered floor for comments. TWA noted general pleasure at Government's handling of the TWA 847 incident. Pan Am (and others) noted displeasure with the skymarshal program which ADM Engen mentioned. As noted by one ATA member, "it's a dumb idea." ATA recognizes that there's nothing they can do about it.

As a broad summary, the VP ensured all present that the Task Force is working the problem (a problem which is complex and not likely to go away anytime soon).

Other topics addressed included drug trafficing on U.S. commercial air, air controller shortages and other topics not related to the terrorism issue. In sum, a very interesting meeting.



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
