- 1. ACCORDING TO THE LATEST NEWS REPORTS, 13 PERSONS WERE KILLED DURING THE TERRORIST ATTACK AT FIUMICINO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, INCLUDING ONE AMERICAN CITIZEN GIRL. SOME 40-50 PERSONS REPORTEDLY WERE WOUNDED. WE HAVE HEARD OF SEVEN AMERICANS INJURED.
- 2. AMONG THE KILLED WERE THREE OF THE "MIDDLE EASTERN" TERRORISTS. A FOURTH WAS WOUNDED AND CAPTURED. THE FIRST RESULTS OF THE EXAMINATION OF THIS MAN SHOWED THAT THE THREE BULLETS THAT HIT HIM HAD NOT AFFECTED ANY VITAL ORGAN; HE REPORTEDLY HAD NOT LOSS CONSCIOUSNESS. HE WAS DESCRIBED AS A LITTLE OVER 20 YEARS OLD.
- 3. THE FOUR (SOME REPORTS SAID FIVE) TERRORISTS ATTACKED IN THE CHECK-IN AREA OF TWA AND EL AL, WHICH IS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC BEFORE PERSONS AND BAGGAGE ARE CHECKED. THE PASSENGERS WERE HEADING FOR EL AL FLIGHT 386 DUE TO DEPART AT 1125 LOCAL FOR TEL AVIV, AND TWA FLIGHT 840 DUE TO DEPART AT 1045 LOCAL FOR ATHENS.
- 4. AN INTERIOR MINISTRY SPOKESMAN IS QUOTED AS SAYING THAT THE TERRORISTS THREW HAND GRENADES AND THEN OPENED FIRE WITH SUBMACHINE-GUNS. AIRPORT POLICE AND ISRAELI SECURITY PERSONNEL RETURNED FIRE. THE AIRPORT WAS CLOSED FOR AN HOUR OR SO, AND IS NOW (123Ø LOCAL) OPEN, WITH BOARDING FOR FLIGHTS SCHEDULED TO RECOMMENCE ABOUT 163Ø LOCAL.

DOMESTIC, POREIGN POLICY RADICALIZED

[Text] There has again been a see-saw in domestic Libyan politics. The radicals are back. As we revealed earlier (see AC Vol 25 No 1), plans for the construction of a 2,000km pipeline to carry water from aquifers undar the Sahara in southern Libya to its Mediterranean coast led to a moderation of Col Mommar Gadaffi's rhatoric, at home and abroad. Pragnatism was in the air and technocrats valued more highly than theoreticians.

However it seems that phase is over. Gadaffi had more difficulty than he imagined obtaining financial and diplomatic support from Saudi Arabia and the Gulf for his "man-made river" project. As a result only \$160m in advance payment had been made to the main contractors, Dong Ah of South Korea by early January, as we expected. Now the Libyans are talking somewhat unconvincingly of syndicating the remaining \$87.5m advance payment and performance bonds amongst "a consortium of Arab and South Korean banks."

More importantly, there has been a revival of the influence of the apparently extra-legal 'revolutionary committees' involved in the killings of prominent Libyan exiles four years ago.

One sign of this has been a deterioration of Libyan relations with its neighbours, particularly in the Arab world. Last week Jordan broke diplomatic relations with Libya after its embassy in Tripoli was sacked by a mob which had apparently been officially summoned to protest against King Hussein's diplomacy with Washington and attitude to the Palestiniane. Jordan has never been particularly close to Libya, and relations were not helped by the defection last year of the Libyan ambassador to Jordan, Dr Aziz Omar Shennif, to the main Libyan opposition movement, the National Front for the Salvation of Libya (NFSL). However this official rupture only highlights Gadaffi's difficulty in finding common ground with Arab countries.

Gadaffi appears to be in trouble in Lebanon. He has long supported radical — Palestinian groups there against the PLO and various Muslim militias against the Phalange-dominated political status quo. However the main emerging Muslim group, the Shias and their Amal militia, have a long-standing dispute with Gadaffi over the disappearance of their spiritual leader, the Imam Musa Sadr during a visit to Libya in 1979. For months Gadaffi has refused to comment on this issue.

However in an impassioned outburst during the minth ordinary session of the General People's Congress (GPC) on 15 February Gadaffi broke his accustomed silence, denying any role in the Imam's death but at the same time accusing him of being an agent of the Shan of Iran. "This statement might explode the situation and create uproar in Lebanon," the Libyan news agency JANA quoted Gadaffi as saying. "But I am insistent on saying it so that Libya is no longer accused of Sadr's disappearance. Thousands of 'Sadra' have died in Lebanon and the Arab world. Why should we cry only for Musa Sadr, the agent of the Shah?" This rendering of events will hardly have improved Gadaffi's hand in the Middle East.

Closer to home, the recently improved relations with his Mabhreb neighbours have been underwined by Gadaffi's support for January's anti-government riots in Tunisis and his reluctance to back Algerian initiatives in Western Sahara and Chad. It was at the latest meeting of the GPC that the full extent of Gadaffi's frustration and the changes in political direction became apparent.

On the domestic front Gadaffi lashed out at some of the decisions of the Basic Congresses (gatherings of Libyans in their places of work) which happened to differ from his own. He particularly_disliked their rejection of his proposals for the military training of women, for a (budget-saving) increase in the proportion of primary education conducted in the home and for changes in family law.

Gadaffi, as leader of the revolution, was able to demonstrate his displeasure by reshuffling the GPC, his cabinet. The moderate prime minister Jeddalah Talhi and foreign minister Abdel Ati al Obeidi have been eacked. In their stead Mohammed Zarouq Rajab, formerly secretary-general of the GPC (a body which stems from the Basic Congresses) has been appointed secretary of the GPC (prime minister), while Ali Treiki has been recalled from his post es Libya's permanent representative to the UN to take over the foreign liaison bureau (ie foreign minister).

Amongst a number of changes in his 'cabinet,' Gadeffi has introduced a new minister for security, Col Younis Bilgasim Ali. Quite what this post requires has not been spelled out, but Libyan exiles fear it signals a stepping-up of actions against themselves, particularly as Younis's assistants have been identified as Ahmad Cadafadam Gadaffi's cousin end international fixer Abdallah Squeunsi who headed internal security in 1980-81, Sasid Rashid who was arrested last year in France for terrorist activities and International fixer receased, and Musa Kusa former head of the Libyan People's Bureau in Tondon. (He was asked to leave by the British government in 1979).

These changes have already led to the expected Shake-up in People's Bureaux staff abroad. In London, bureau chief (Adam Keeiri) and his cultural attache. Abda hamid bin Mausea) have been recalled to Tripoli, while the direction of the bureau has been placed in the hands of a four-man committee with well-known revolutionary committee pasts, (Abda Qader Baghdad) (Ali Bugaziah, Martaug Martaug) and Salih al Mabrouk) This type of appointment serves two purposes: to step up the ideology and to intimidate potential opponents.

The Attacks

The Vienna attack was conducted by three Arab-looking gunmen who hurled grenades and sprayed automatic weapons fire in the area in front of the El Al counter. One of the gunmen was subsequently killed by local authorities; the remaining two were wounded and are in custody. The Rome attack was conducted by five gunmen—three were killed and two were wounded and are in custody. As of 1600 hours, casualty counts are as follows: In Rome, 117 wounded, among them 25 US citizens, and 17 dead, among them 3 US citizens. In Vienna, there were no American casualties among the three dead and 40 wounded.

Abu Nidal Responsibility

AS OF 1300 EST DECEMBER 27, 1965

Occurring within minutes of each other, terrorists attacked the Rome and Vienna International Airports about 9:10 AM local time December 27. Both attacks seemed to target Israeli national airline, EL Al ticket counters. In both cases the terrorists used hand grenades and automatic weapons.

In Vienna one (possibly two) Austrian citizen was killed on a total of 16 persons were seriously injured. Austrian authorities report that there were no known American casualties. There were reportedly three Improvists: one was killed and two were seriously wounded. Both are being held by authorities.

Embrasy Rome reports a total 11 persons of several mationalities were killed, including the eleven, war old American citizen daughter of AP correspondent Vic Simpson. Also among the dead are a flexican diplomat and an Israeli security officer. There may possibly be two additional U.S. citizen causalties. A total of 77 persons were injured in Rome, of whom 16 were Americans. Three of the five known terrorists were killed: two wounded terrorists were apprehended. A sixth terrorist may have escaped, but this has not yet been confirmed.

Italian police reportedly believe the terrorists were members of the Abu Nidal organization, but so far have no supporting evidence.

- SECRETARY GENERAL TSIMAS OF MINISTRY OF INTERIOR AND PUBLIC ORDER JUST CALLED DCM TO PASS ON LATEST INFORMATION HE HAS RECEIVED TELEPHONICALLY FROM ROME ON THE TERRORIST ATTACK THERE. 
