Dear Eloise:

I think the CIPC Terrorism Working Group has produced a draft report that is, overall, a positive contribution. I do, however, have several suggestions:

- -- Because it has been so long delayed, several sections have been overtaken by events.
- -- Repeated reference is made to the DCI response to NSDD 138. The response went to the NSC last summer. An update on its reception and status is required.
- -- The FY86 budget, which this was designed to impact, is a <u>fait</u>

  accompli. An analysis of what is and is not included should set the stage for an impact on FY87. Even there, we have missed the opportunity to impact DCI guidance for FY87.

Also, I feel that the characterization of the terrorist threat should be strengthened. In sum, I would favor a harder-hitting approach, including

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several strong recommendations on which we would want the DCI's immediate approval.

I recognize that this report will soon be considered by the CIPC itself and that the current draft is only a working group report and does not have Committee approval. Given the concerns that I have about the report, I believe we should have an early meeting to discuss its long-term potential ramifications. If agreeable with you, I propose that we meet for about an hour so that you and I could agree as to what changes are vital as well as those which can be compromised in order to avoid much more delay, given the lateness of the paper.

Meanwhile, I have provided your staff with extensive line-in/line-out changes which I believe will strengthen the report.
