3. IN DUBAI DECEMBER 9, AS PART OF CONTINUING DEMARCHE IN SUPPORT OF REF B INSTRUCTIONS, I CALLED UPON SHAIKH MAKTOUM BIN RASHID, UAE DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER AND DUBAI CROWN PRINCE TO DISCUSS KU221 HIJACK. I EXPLAINED KUWAITI AMBASSADOR AND HAD BEEN COORDINATING OUR ACTIVITIES IN THIS REGARD. I ADDED THAT, KUWAIT WAS STATE PRIMARILY TARGETED BY THIS HIJACK, BUT SINCE U.S. CITIZENS HAD BEEN SINGLED OUT FOR MURDEROUS ABUSE ALONG WITH KUWAITIS, AND OF COURSE BECAUSE NUMBER OF AMERICANS FALLING BEFORE SCOURGE OF TERRORISM IN MIDDLE EAST CONTINUES TO RISE, USG WAS INTENSELY INTERESTED IN BRINGING AGONY OF KU221 TO AS QUICK AND SAFE AN END AS POSSIBLE.







FOLLOWING ARE NOTES BASED ON CONVERSATION WITH AMCIT PASSENGER WHO ARRIVED IN KARACHI FROM TEHRAN DECEMBER 6 AT 1700 HOURS LOCAL ABOARD SPECIAL IRAN AIR FLIGHT (KARACHI 10342).

- FoIA(b)(b) 3. JACKERS: INDICATED TO US THAT THERE WERE FIVE HI-TWO ENTERED THE AIRCRAFT AT KUWAIT, TWO ENTERED AT DUBAL AND THE FIFTH ENTERED AT AN UNKNOWN LOCATION. SHE INDICATED THAT THE HIJACKERS WERE ALL WEARING BLACK LEATHER JACKETS AND JEANS BUT LATER CHANGED INTO DIFFERENT CLOTHES WHICH INCLUDED ONE IN A JOGGING SUIT, THREE IN DENIM JACKETS AND DENIM PANTS, THE FIFTH HIJACKER WAS SEEN VERY LITTLE BUT SHE SAID THAT HE WAS DRESSED DIFFERENTLY FROM ALL THE DTHERS AND APPEARED TO SPEND MOST OF HIS TIME IN THE COCKPIT. THREE OF THE HIJACKERS SEEMED TO BE THE MOST VISIBLE AND MOVED AROUND THE PLANE THE MOST. THEY WERE ALL DESCRIBED AS BEING IN THEIR EARLY TO MID-TWENTIES, AND VERY PROFESSIONAL. LOOKED IDENTICAL BUT THE LEADER WAS DESCRIBED AS "MORE HEALTHY AND HAVING A ROUND FACE."
- 4. HIJACKERS HAD AT LEAST A PISTOL APIECE AND ONE HAD A GRENADE. SOURCE DID NOT SEE ANY OTHER EXPLOSIVES THOUGH THEY WERE TOLD THAT THE HIJACKERS WOULD BLOW
  THE PLANE UP IF THEIR DEMANDS WERE NOT MET. ALL
  CONVERSATIONS WITH THE HIJACKERS WERE CARRIED ON IN
  ARABIC WITH TRANSLATIONS BEING DONE BY THE AIR HOSTESSES AND STEWARDS. THE HIJACKERS SPOKE LITTLE ENGLISH WITH THE EXCEPTION OF WORDS LIKE AMERICANO OR PASSPORTS. SOURCE ALSO DESCRIBED A WEAPON WHICH WAS POSSIBLY IDENTI-FIED AS AN EMERGENCY AXE BEING WORN IN THE BELT OF CHE OF THE HIJACKERS.

SOURCE INDICATED THAT SECURITY AT KUWAIT AIRPORT WAS EXTREMELY LAX, THAT NONE OF HER BAGS WERE CHECKED, AND THAT SHE SAW NO ONE ELSE'S HAND-CARRIED BAGS BEING . THEY WERE NOT ALLOWED TO LEAVE THE PLANE IN BUT SOURCE SAW TWO OF THE HIJACKERS ENTER CHECKED. DUBAI. THERE AS THEY STOPPED NEAR THE SEAT TO ASK DIRECTIONS OF THE AIR HOSTESS. SHORTLY AFTER DINNER, SOURCE NOTICED WHAT APPEARED TO BE A FIGHT AND SOMETHING WAS SAID IN ARABIC WHICH WAS TRANSLATED THAT THERE WAS A THE HIJACKERS IDENTIFIED A KUWAITI AND A GUARD HIJACK. (SOURCE FELT THAT THE GUARD MAY HAVE BEEN ASSOCIATED WITH THE KUWAITI AND NOT ASSIGNED TO THE AIRCRAFT). THE HIJACKERS PULLED THE GUARD OFF TO THE SIDE, TOOK HIS GUN AND SHOT HIM THREE TIMES. THE HIJACKERS THEN ORDERED ALL THE FIRST CLASS PASSENGERS TO MOVE TO THE ECONOMY THE HIJACKERS CAUTIONED PASSENGERS TO REMAIN SECTION. CALM AND TO SAY AND DO NOTHING. AT THIS TIME THEY FIRED IN THE AIR THREE OR FOUR TIMES. THEY COLLECTED ALL THE SPOONS AND KNIVES FROM THE DINNER TRAYS AND ORDERED ALL THE MEN TO PUT THEIR HANDS UP. THE HIJACKERS THEN ASKED FOR THE PASSENGERS WHO HAD PASSPORTS AND ORDERED TO GIVE UP THEIR PASSPORTS. NOT EVERYONE COMPLIED WITH THE REQUEST. THE HIJACKERS THEN ASKED FOR THOSE WITH AMERICAN PASSPORTS. THE HIJACKERS POINTED TO ONE AMERICAN AND A GERMAN AND SAID THEY WERE "AMERICANO" AND THEY WERE TOLD TO STAND UP. THE GERMAN TRIED TO EXPLAIN THAT HE WAS NOT AMERICAN BUT THE HIJACKER TOLD HIM TO BE QUIET, PUT THE GUN TO HIS BACK AND TOLD HIM

TO MOVE TO FIRST CLASS. AT ABOUT THIS TIME THE PILOT ANNOUNCED OVER THE LOUD SPEAKER THAT THE PLANE WAS NOT GOING TO KARACHI BUT WAS BEING TAKEN TO TEHRAN. THIS WAS APPROXIMATELY 3: ØØ AM. THE HIJACKERS RELAXED MORE AFTER ARRIVAL AND TOLD THE AIR HOSTESS TO PASSOUT WATER. THEY ASKED AGAIN ABOUT PASSPORTS. LATER AFTER THE SUN CAME UP THE SOURCE HEARD TWO SHOTS AND THEY WERE THEN ORDERED TO CLOSE THE WINDOW SHADES. (AT THE HOTEL THE SOURCE WAS TOLD THAT AN AMERICAN HAD BEEN SHOT AND HAD BEEN THROWN FROM THE AIRCRAFT WHILE STILL ALIVE BUT DIED ON THE WAY TO THE HOSPITAL. SOURCE HAD NO PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE OF THESE EVENTS.)

HIJACKERS ASKED FOR ALL THOSE PASSENGERS WHO WERE DIPLOMATS OR WHO WERE IN THE PAKISTAN MILITARY. THIS LATTER GROUP OF MILITARY WAS COMPOSED OF ABOUT TWENTY SIX (26) PEOPLE WHO SAT TOGETHER ON THE PLANE BUT WERE NOT ACCORDED ANY SPECIAL ABUSE OR TREATMENT. AFTERWARDS ALL THE LADIES WERE ORDERED TO GO TO FIRST CLASS. SOURCE SAW NO ONE IN FIRST CLASS AND SAW NO ONE IN THE TWO OR THREE ROWS OF SEATS IMMEDIATELY BEHIND FIRST CLASS (WHERE BUSINESS CLASS IS FOUND ON OTHER AIRCRAFT). THEY WERE GATHERED IN THE FIRST CLASS SECTION THEY WERE TOLD THEY WOULD BE RELEASED IF THE IRANIANS PROVIDED FUEL FOR THE PLANE. IF THE FUEL WAS NOT DELIVERED THE PLANE WOULD BE BLOWN UP. WHILE THEY WERE WAITING TWO OF THE HIJACKERS WHO BEHAVED BETTER THAN THE OTHERS TOLD THE AIR HOSTESS THAT THEY COULDN'T HANDLE SEEING THE WOMEN AND CHILDREN AND THEY HAD NOTHING AGAINST THEM. THE SOURCE ALSO SAID THAT TWO KUWAITI DIPLOMATS HAD BEEN CALLED TO THE COCKPIT AND THEY COULD OVERHEAR THE KUWAITIS TALKING ON THE RADIO AND CRYING A LOT. A
WOMAN LOOKED AROUND THE CURTAIN AND SAW THE TWO DIPLOMATS
WERE BEING PUSHED AROUND IN THE COCKPIT. AFTER THE FUEL
WAS RECEIVED, SEVERAL OF THE LADIES AND CHILDREN WERE
RELEASED WITH THE REST BEING RELEASED ABOUT TWO HOURS LATER.

UP TO THIS POINT, THE SOURCE HAD NOT IDENTIFIED HERSELF AS AMERICAN NOR HAD SHE GIVEN UP HER PASSPORT. AS SHE WAS LEAVING THE AIRCRAFT THE HIJACKERS AGAIN ASKED FOR HER PASSPORT AND SHE HANDED IT TO THEM AND HE JUST STUCK IT IN HIS POCKET WITHOUT LOOKING AT IT.
SOURCE WAS VERY CONCERNED AS THE HIJACKERS ON MANY OCCASIONS HAD ASKED FOR THE AMERICANS TO IDENTIFY THEM-SELVES. AFTER ANOTHER PERIOD OF TIME, APPROXIMATELY TWENTY (20) MEN WERE RELEASED. ONE OF THE MEN TOLD THE SOURCE THAT THERE HAD BEEN NO FOOD OR WATER LEFT ON THE PLANE AND THAT THE DOORS OF THE PLANE HAD BEEN OPENED TO LET IN AIR. THE MAN ALSO TOLD THE SOURCE THAT ONE OF THE HIJACKERS HAD FALLEN ASLEEF AMONGST THE PASSENGERS WHILE THREE OF THE HIJACKERS

THAT SHE SAW ONLY THE FIVE PEOPLE INVOLVED IN THE HIJACKING BUT COULD NOT TELL IF SOMEONE ELSE WAS INVOLVED BUT NOT VISIBLE. SHE ALSO INDICATED THAT THERE WAS NOT APPARENT OUTSIDE HELP FOR THE HIJACKERS AND THAT SHE HAD ONLY HAD CONTACT WITH PAKISTANI EMBASSY AND SWISS EMBASSY PERSONNEL IN TEHRAN.





- 2. MFA UNDERSECRETARY RASHID CALLED ME AT 2000 HOURS LOCAL TIME TO REPORT ON THE CURRENT SITUATION IN TEHRAN. HE TOLD ME THAT NO ADDITIONAL HOSTAGES HAD BEEN RELEASED, NOTWITHSTANDING THE ASSURANCES OF THE HIJACKERS THAT THERE WOULD BE A MAJOR RELEASE ONCE THE TERRORIST DECLARATION WAS BROADCAST. THE STATEMENT HAS BEEN BROADCAST BUT NO HOSTAGES RELEASED. ACCORDING TO RASHID THE HIJACKERS ARE DEMANDING THAT KUWAIT RADIO ITSELF BROADCAST THE DECLARATION. KUWAIT HAS REFUSED TO DO SO AND HAS TOLD THE IRANIANS THAT SUCH A BROADCAST WOULD ONLY COMPLICATE THE SITUATION. (BY COMPLICATION HE MEANS A SITUATION IN WHICH ONLY THE U.S. AND KUWAITI HOSTAGES REMAINED ON BOARD.)
- 3. THE UNDERSECRETARY SAID THEY HAD BEEN FOLLOWING THE USG'S POSITION VERY CAREFULLY AND WERE VERY PLEASED BY WHAT THE PRESIDENT HAD SAID IN HIS NEWS CONFERENCE. IT FULLY REFLECTED THE GOK'S OWN POSITION.
