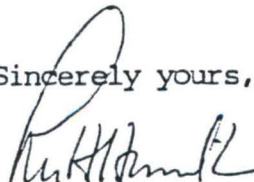

On May 13, 1985, H.Res. 168, a resolution of inquiry, was referred to the Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence. H.Res. 168 would direct the Director of Central Intelligence to provide to the House:

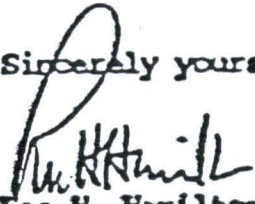

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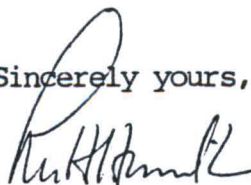
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
