



2. Primary Policy Focus: Management of the Economic Recovery Program

a. Presidential Tasks

- Explain the final content of the budget reductions and tax bill (Address to the nation on the Economic Recovery Program, early September).
- 2. Explain to the public that the budget reduction process is <u>not</u> finished; the budget reconciliation phase was but the first step toward balancing the budget by FY1984 (early September address).
- 3. Issue management directives on cost containment, implementation of the Economic Recovery Program, and identification of additional budget reductions to the departments and agencies (Meeting with cabinet secretaries, senior policy appointees, and career civil servants on September 29-30, 1981 prior to the start of the first fiscal year of the Reagan Administration).




