The American Political Foundation was created by leaders of the Democratic and Republican parties as a structure for communication and understanding between the American parties and democratic parties elsewhere in the world. Until recently, the absence of such a structure kept the American parties effectively isolated from the growing volume of fruitful transnational contacts in which political parties of other countries increasingly are participating. With this structure, the American parties have an observer presence at international gatherings such as those of the Christian Democratic World Union, the Liberal International and the Socialist International. They also may be present routinely at the national conventions of most of the major political parties in the democratic world.

The Foundation is a doubly unprecedented institutional innovation since it represents not only the first mechanism by which officials of both parties have sought a structured basis for communication and understanding with their opposite numbers elsewhere but also the first joint venture of their own creation.

The idea of the Foundation was broached initially by its President, George E. Agree, late in 1977. There followed a series of exploratory discussions among leaders of the two parties and a careful weighing of the implications within party ranks, joint visits to some of the major parties and Internationals in Europe, and discussions with international affairs specialists. The decision to go ahead with the incorporation of the Foundation was made in 1979. Tax-exemption under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code was obtained early in 1980.

Two Republicans and three Democratic directors remain to be chosen.

The Foundation's first activity was the hosting of 31 observers for foreign political parties at the Republican and Democratic National Conventions during the summer, 1980. This project was funded with a partial grant from the U.S. International Communication Agency and with contributions from major corporations.

The Foundation has established an office in Washington, D.C., from which it is providing briefings, appointments and other assistance to foreign parliamentary, political and academic visitors to the United States. It has begun inviting groups of foreign party representatives to a series of Washington seminars and interviews with party and governmental representatives at appropriate stages of the American political cycle. Several times a year it responds to invitations to send Republican and Democratic observers to annual or other congresses of foreign political parties. In addition, it sponsors and conducts missions by American party representatives to meetings of international party organizations and groups of specialists to study aspects of foreign political systems (such as campaign finance regulation) which may stimulate fresh approaches to the solutions of problems within our own system.

The Foundation receives contributions from corporations, labor unions, foundations and individuals with particular interest in world affairs and in enhancing the international relations capacities of the American political community. Some specific projects are funded by the U.S. International Communication Agency.

REVIEW & OUTLOOK

Democracy International

It is not exactly a secret any more that the democracies of the world have become fewer and more isolated over the past 25 years, while the regimes hostile to democracy have proliferated, grown more vocal, and strengthened one another with all kinds of international aid and sustenance. The U.S. response to this so far has been to withdraw from the scene and cut down even further on our contacts with the politics of other nations. But the other day we heard about a new organization, the American Political Foundation, whose birth gives us hope that at least someone out there knows what's wrong and is trying to help us recover our bearings.

We all know, the APF people point out, that the Communist movement around the world has gained tremendous force from its formidable networks of international parties, funds and connections. But few Americans know that most of the important democratic political parties of the industrialized nations have also established international networks for themselves and have used these connections to give significant aid to democratic forces in various parts of the world.

The European democratic parties sent money and volunteers to help avert a Communist takeover in Portugal. They have sent public opinion and organizational experts to advise Turkish political parties during recent economic crises. They're supporting schools in Latin America to train democratic leaders. They're aiding the

moderate Democratic Turnhalle Alliance in Namibia. Unlike American democrats, the European parties supporting these activities still seem to know that helping your democratic friends like this is not necessarily illegitimate interference in another nation's internal affairs.

The American government, needless to say, does not much participate in this kind of activity nowadays. More to the point, our Republican and Democratic parties, the counterparts of the European democratic party organizations, haven't been in close enough contact even just to keep abreast of what their European colleagues are doing. But now the American Political Foundation has gotten Republican National Committee Chairman Bill Brock and DNC Finance Chairman Charles Manatt to take its top offices and will begin a program of meetings, visits, services and research to get the American parties in touch.

It's not likely that American Republicans and Democrats are ever going to be cohesive enough to mount the kind of international operations that the Europeans routinely carry out. But there's not much doubt that it would improve the quality of our public decision making if our politicians could bear in mind some of the activities and experiences of their colleagues in other countries. It's nice to see that the U.S. national committees are taking a step to make this a little more likely.
