I. PURPOSE

To thank the Congressmen for their work on behalf of the bipartisan Gramm-Latta substitute budget resolution and to encourage more bipartisan Congressional efforts to curb Federal spending.

II. BACKGROUND

As the ranking Republican on the Budget Committee, Latta was a forceful advocate for the Administration's economic package. Gramm was the only Budget Committee Democrat who defended the Administration's positions. They joined forces to offer the bipartisan substitute and will be the Floor leaders during the debate.

Following Committee action, Gramm and Latta have publicly encouraged a bipartisan vote-getting effort and have worked closely with House Republican leadership, members of the Conservative Democratic Forum, and the Administration.
