ARMED FORCES DAY RADIO MESSAGE

Today is Armed Forces Day and on behalf of millions of Americans I want to extend to our men and women in uniform a personal message of thanks and gratitude.

I don't think I have to tell you how vitally important your job is today -- your sacrifice and patriotism makes it possible for those of us civilians who are to go about our everyday lives. Your commitment keeps our Nation strong and our future free.

You know, James Michener writes in one of his novels about a commanding officer who thinks about the self-sacrifice of those who serve under him and wonders "Where do we get such men?"

I want you to know ~~that~~ today millions of Americans are asking themselves that same question about those of you -- both men and women -- who serve in our Armed Forces. Like me, they're asking that question with gratitude, with respect and affection in their hearts. I want you to know America is grateful to you -- and proud of you, too.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT ON ARMED FORCES DAY

Armed Forces Day gives all of us an opportunity to salute the men and women who are putting themselves on the line to protect our freedom and national independence. We should never forget that the defense of this country depends on the less than one percent of our population who wear military uniforms.

In these troubled times it becomes even more important that we all express our thanks to the brave men and women in military service. They have voluntarily given up their freedom, leaving home and family in order to protect this Nation.

Whether as a pilot who flies jet fighters, a crewman that keeps military equipment operating or a rifleman on lonely guard duty -- our military ~~men~~ and women deserve a friendly pat on the back and a word of encouragement from those they protect.

I ask that all Americans join me in paying special tribute to those who defend our way of life. We should be proud to have such a fine group of men and women in the military uniform of the United States. When the national anthem is played, each of them should know that we honor them, as well as the country, because without them the Nation would not survive.

So three cheers for the men and women in the Armed Forces. And God bless each and every one of them.

BACKGROUND: Alden Winship Clausen, known as Tom  
Clausen, will become President of  
the International Bank for  
Reconstruction and Development (The  
World Bank) on July 1, 1981,  
succeeding Robert S. McNamara.  
Clausen was previously Chairman of  
the Board of Bank of America. He was  
appointed to the World Bank by  
President Carter, and was commended  
to you personally by George Shultz.  
Clausen has been visiting with world  
leaders, and has seen all the Heads  
of State of major industrial  
countries except yourself.

On May 12, the Senate Appropriations  
Subcommittee reduced the President's  
proposed appropriation for the  
International Development  
Administration (IDA-VI) for FY 1981  
from \$540 million to \$408 million.  
The Administration's proposal of  
\$540 million was, in turn, exactly  
half of amount proposed by Carter.

TALKING POINTS: Attached.

TALKING POINTS:

1. Congratulations and best wishes on becoming President of the World Bank on July 1.
2. I and the members of my Administration look forward to working with you in the future.
3. Mention the importance of encouraging private development.
4. If Clausen should raise it, avoid a commitment to restoring the \$132 million the Senate Appropriations subcommittee took out of the budget of the International Development Administration for FY '81.
