

7:15 p.m. Official Party departs Blair House.

Official Party arrives White House at the North Portico and proceeds to the Red Room to wait for Mrs. Annenberg to escort them to the Yellow Oval Room.

Those who proceed to Yellow Oval Room:

Secretary of State and Mrs. Haig Ambassador Annenberg Foreign Ambassador and Mrs. Peter Hermes

The remainder of the Official Party waits in the Red Room where a Social Aide, with the help of a Protocol Officer, will give out seating cards. Three additional Social Aides will then escort the Party, one by one, into the East Room.

7:28 p.m. The Chancellor departs Blair House (Military Cordon will line the driveway).

7:29 p.m. THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN depart the living quarters by elevator and proceed to the North Portico.

(U.S.M.C. Orchestra in Main Foyer)

The Chief of Protocol will serve as hostess pro-tem for THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN as they greet the Chancellor at the North Portico.

7:31 p.m.

The Chancellor and his wife are greeted by THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN; pause for press photo session (outside - open press); proceed to Yellow Oval Room via the elevator.

7:35 p.m.

The remainder of the Official Party in the Red Room is escorted to the East Room and announced.

Color Team proceeds up Grand Staircase to Hallway outside Yellow Oval Room.

7:40 p.m.

Guests (save PRINCIPALS) depart Yellow Oval Room via elevator for East Room and are announced.

OIC requests permission to secure the Colors. THE PRESIDENT responds, "Permission granted." Color Team proceeds to secure the Colors and proceeds out of Yellow Oval Room down the Grand Staircase, led by OIC.

At foot of staircase, Color Team divides.

(Ten pool photographers in black tie in Grand Foyer for 15 seconds for photograph of PRINCIPALS at the foot of the Staircase.)

7:45 p.m.

THE PRINCIPALS arrive on the State Floor via the Grand Staircase, pause at the foot of the Stairs for press photo session, and proceed directly to the East Room, led by the Color Team for Full Honors and the Receiving Line.

As the Color Team halts outside the East Room, announcement of the PRINCIPALS is made.

The PRINCIPALS then proceed into the East Room during "Hail to the Chief." The receiving line is formed: THE PRESIDENT, THE CHANCELLOR, MRS. REAGAN, AND MRS. SCHMIDT.

The Chief of Protocol stands to the PRESIDENT'S left with a Social Aide on her left to make introductions to THE PRESIDENT.

The Official Party will be taken to the Red Room to wait for four minutes while other guests have a chance to enter the State Dining Room. They will then be escorted by the Social Aides to the State Dining Room.

7:45 p.m. (cont'd.)

At the end of the Receiving Line, PRINCIPALS should hold in the East Room until all guests are in the State Dining Room, then proceed down the Cross Hall to the State Dining Room.

(Appropriate music should be played.)

8:15 p.m. Dinner is served.

(The Staff Mess will be used for dinner for attending Aides who will not be seated in the State Dining Room.)

9:00 p.m. Dessert is served accompanied by the Strolling Strings.

9:15 p.m. Toasts:

THE PRESIDENT

THE CHANCELLOR

(The press pool will cover the toasts from the doorway of the State Dining Room and then depart immediately.)

9:30 p.m.

The after-dinner guests arrive in the Diplomatic Reception Room and are escorted immediately by Social Aides to the Color Rooms for coffee and liqueurs with other guests.

THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN will receive guests in the Blue Room and the Chancellor and Mrs. Schmidt will receive guests with Mr. Deaver and Secretary Haig in the Green Room.

10:05 p.m.

The Chancellor and Mrs. Schmidt shall be escorted into the Blue Room and join with THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN. All other guests will proceed to the East Room for seating.

10:10 p.m.

THE PRINCIPALS enter the East Room and are seated for entertainment on specially allocated chairs.

10:15 p.m. The entertainment begins.

10:45 p.m. Conclusion of the entertainment.

10:45 p.m. THE PRESIDENT makes brief remarks to the guests and mounts the stage to be photographed with the entertainers.

10:50 p.m. The Chancellor and his wife are escorted to the North Portico by the PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN for departure.

11:00 p.m. THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN return to the Main Foyer to begin the dancing.

Guests are served champagne and petit-fours and join in dancing.

11:30 p.m. All guests depart Residence.
