V. SEQUENCE

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BRIEF REMARKS TO PRESS

- Prime Minister Martens and I discussed the full range of political, economic and military issues facing our countries. Belgium has played a key role in the trans-atlantic dialogue, and this meeting was valuable.
- We agreed on the continued validity of NATO's twin-track decision of 1979 on INF, and the U.S. determination to pursue both the modernization and arms control tracks.
- We agreed that the Polish government and its Soviet backers should stop repressing their people. We agreed that there cannot be business as usual with countries disregarding the Helsinki Accords.
- (If Discussed). We discussed El Salvador, and the importance of the democratic political process -- including elections -- free of externally supported subversion.
- (If Discussed). We discussed Afghanistan Day, designated by the European Parliament, and soon by the U.S. Congress, to honor Afghanistan's freedom fighters against Soviet aggression;
- (If Discussed). We affirmed the importance of maintaining a free trade system and the commitment of the United States and the European Community to international economic growth.
