PRESIDENT REAGAN and Prime Minister Haughey then arrive the State Floor, MRS. REAGAN and Mrs. Haughey join them in the Cross Hall, and the four PRINCIPALS walk over to be photographed with the Tom Dooley Choraliers in the Grand Foyer.

Following the photograph, the four PRINCIPALS are then announced into the East Room and they take their seats. Luncheon is served.

LUNCHEON FOR PRIME MINISTER OF IRELAND, MARCH 17, 1982

Mr. Prime Minister, Mrs. Haughey (Haw-hee), honored guests, sons and daughters of Ireland and all of those who wish you were.

Last year I celebrated this important day lunching at the home of the Irish Ambassador. I'd only been at my current job for a short while and your Ambassador presented me a scroll detailing my family tree. I imagine he thought if I was assured of my Irish heritage I would be more certain that I could handle my new job.

Well, it's been a good year. However, I've had my problems. Mr. Prime Minister, I want you to know that you are not the only Irish head of government who has to deal with a legislature headed by an Irish speaker.

Seriously, so many of our citizens have family trees with roots in the Emerald Isle. This point was never more apparent than during an unfortunate incident which took place shortly after Saint Patrick's Day last year. I'd just left a speech at the Washington Hilton Hotel. Shots rang out. I was hit along with three others: Mr. Thomas Delahanty, a fine police officer; Mr. Timothy McCarthy, a member of the Secret Service detail who threw himself in the path of a bullet meant for me; and Jim Brady, a friend and trusted advisor.

It doesn't take a genealogist to figure out where the names of these men originated.

Of course, Irishmen and their descendants have always played a significant role in America's history. Some of our most fiery

patriots -- the ones who inspired the colonies onto independence -- were of Irish blood. Later Jefferson's election was supported by these same men and women. Some historians might suggest that these folks were trying to settle a score with England -- now why would anyone think an Irishman would do that? -- but I honestly don't think so.

I believe that there are few people on this planet whose hearts burn with the flame of liberty as do the Irish. That is why it was so natural over the years for so many of your people to come here to be part of this noble experiment in America.

All of us can be proud that, in a world awash with dictatorship and despotism, Ireland and the United States remain dedicated to the principles of liberty. It is our shared values as well as the Irish heritage of many of our citizens which insures that our two peoples will remain dear to one another.

I want to take this occasion to congratulate you Mr. Prime Minister on your recent election and to pledge to you an amicable and trusting relationship between us.

About 2 weeks ago I was in Los Angeles where the Board of Supervisors gave me an unique present: a shillelagh. One of the supervisors suggested that I might use it to get legislation through the Congress. Not knowing how to do this, Mr. Prime Minister, I thought with your long political experience, you might give me some pointers on the best political use of shillelaghs.

When I was a boy, Saint Patrick's Day was very special to the Reagan family. Today I'm pleased to have you join us for

lunch. In a true sense, all of us are of the same family. So it's grand to have you here in this house -- which I might add was designed by another of our clan. Now I ask all of you to join me in a toast to our honored guests, Prime Minister and Mrs. Haughey.
