I. PURPOSE

To deliver on your November 19, 1981, commitment to Jewish leadership groups that you would provide access on major issues of concern. In this instance, the community seeks reassurances of strong U.S. support for Israel and Camp David in light of the upcoming Sinai withdrawal.

II. BACKGROUND

Al Speigel, who served as your campaign leader in the Jewish community and continues in the leadership role, has brought together a group of supporters to discuss the heightened tensions that are associated with the approach of the Sinai withdrawal (April 25). This meeting honors an earlier commitment of yours to meet with key individuals on issues of significance to the American Jewish community.

The group hopes to be able to convey the message that the U.S. support for Israel remains unshakeable and that we continue to feel Camp David is the route to lasting peace in the Middle East.

Prior to the visit with you, the group will have received an in-depth briefing on the Middle East by Bill Clark and NSC staff member Geoffrey Kemp.

Your support in the Jewish community is at a low, as a result of the continuing after effects of AWACS, the general economic problems and the Mondale and Kennedy campaign efforts in the community to paint you as becoming soft on Israel. Your National Conference of Christians and Jews speech on dual-loyalty and anti-Semitism was well received and very helpful in halting any erosion.

TALKING POINTS FOR PRESIDENT'S MEETING WITH JEWISH LEADERS

Monday, April 12, 1982; 11:00 a.m.

- I am well aware of the ups and downs in our relations with Israel this past year. But, the United States is committed to Israel's security. This commitment is grounded in shared interest as well as moral obligation. Israel is our friend and ally, but we are also pursuing strategic cooperation with Egypt, Saudi Arabia and other friends in the region. We are convinced that these efforts contribute to the peace process.

- We will adhere to the Camp David process because the U.S. made a commitment and because it offers the only viable roadmap for dealing with the Palestinian issue in addition to the framework for the Egyptian-Israeli Peace Treaty. Perhaps the most poignant illustration of the U.S. commitment to Camp David is the involvement of 1000 U.S. troops in the MFO in Sinai. Camp David provides for the "full autonomy" of the Palestinians and recognizes the "legitimate rights of the Palestinian people" and the need for achieving "the resolution of the Palestinian problem in all its aspects."

- During Secretary Haig's recent visits to Egypt and Israel, the U.S. urged both Egypt and Israel to intensify their efforts to reach an agreement on a declaration of principles. The purpose of such a declaration is to establish the framework for inviting the Palestinian Arabs to join the negotiations for the detailed agreement on a self-governing authority -- as specified in the Camp David Accords.
- Secretary Haig has proposed some ideas on how to bridge the existing gap between Egypt and Israel. To conduct the follow-up on these negotiations, Richard Fairbanks has been appointed Ambassador. Israel has been reassured that the U.S. and Egypt are firmly committed to the Camp David process after the April withdrawal. Egypt has been reassured that Israel will withdraw on schedule and that the U.S. will be a full partner in the autonomy negotiations.
- I am in constant communication with Prime Minister Begin. I understand the traumas Israel is facing now. I've said so in a recent letter to him. I will give you copies.
