10:20 a.m.

Following the Arrival Ceremony, PRESIDENT REAGAN, MRS. REAGAN, Queen Beatrix and Prince Claus proceed through the Diplomatic Reception Room and up the elevator to the State Floor. They then take their places for the receiving line in front of the Blue Room in the Cross Hall.

The order from west to east is PRESIDENT REAGAN, Queen Beatrix, Prince Claus, MRS. REAGAN. Ambassador Roosevelt will introduce guests to the PRESIDENT from his left.

The remaining invited guests will wait until the PRINCIPALS have had time to take their places, then they will proceed up the west staircase outside of the White House leading into the Red Room, going in front of the Blue Room, past the PRINCIPALS, proceeding into the Green Room, then into the Blue Room for refreshments. (Juice, coffee, and pastries.)

10:30 a.m.

At the termination of the receiving line, PRESIDENT REAGAN AND MRS. REAGAN and Her Majesty Queen Beatrix and His Royal Highness Prince Claus of the Netherlands proceed via the elevator to the Yellow Oval Room where they will have coffee privately.

10:45 a.m.

All guests depart except Mrs. Nahuys-Wijnen, Captain de Nooijer, Mr. Philip Osieck, Her Excellency Mrs. Bischoff van Heemskerck-Telders, and Mr. de Heer, who will remain in the Blue Room with Gahl Bothe.

All remaining guests in the Blue Room depart either the North Portico or the Diplomatic Reception Room.



MEETING WITH MAJOR SUPPORTERS OF SENATOR BILL

ROTH'S RE-ELECTION CAMPAIGN

I. PURPOSE

The meeting is being held to demonstrate the Administration's full support for Senator Bill Roth's re-election campaign, and to brief his major supporters from Delaware on Administration policies.

II. BACKGROUND

Senator Bill Roth (R-Delaware) is running for a third term this year. Roth has invited approximately 65 of his most ardent supporters to spend a day in Washington to be briefed by the President, White House staff members, and other Government officials. Senator Roth's group will meet in the White House Family Theatre on Monday, April 19, 1982 from 3:30 p.m. to 4:45 p.m. Prior to the President's remarks the group will hear from Paul Russo, Bob Carleson, Elizabeth Dole, and Ed Rollins. The President will conclude the program with brief remarks, lasting from 4:30 p.m. until 4:45 p.m.

V. SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

- 4:30p.m. The President enters the White House Family Theater and makes brief remarks.
- 4:40p.m. The President concludes remarks and departs.

TALKING POINTS

- -- Express appreciation for all that this group is doing to help
 Bill Roth, and the importance which this role will play towards
 maintaining Republican control of the United States Senate.
- -- Let them know how proud they can be of the vital role which
 Bill Roth played in the Senate's passage of the largest tax
 cut in American history.
- -- Stress the fact that major portions of our Economic Program have not even taken effect yet, and that the Administration is not about to abandon the program, and retreat back to failed policies of the past.

- -- Point out that Bill Roth has proven himself to be a highly respected leader in Congress, and that the White House door is always open for Bill to express his point of view.
- -- Praise them for the work they did in 1980 to re-elect

 Governor Pete DuPont, and for what they are doing this year
 to re-elect Congressman Tom Evans and Senator Bill Roth.
- -- Express how important it is to the Republican majority in the U.S. Senate, and to the nation, that Delaware re-elect Bill Roth to the United States Senate.



SEQUENCE OF EVENTS FOR OFFICIAL DINNER IN HONOR OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN BEATRIX AND HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS PRINCE CLAUS OF THE NETHERLANDS April 19, 1982

- 7:00 p.m. Dinner guests arrive at the Diplomatic Reception Room. Alternate dinner guests, with special cards, are led to the left into the Map Room for cocktails.
- 7:10 p.m. The regular dinner guests are escorted by Social Aides to the East Room where they are announced. (A Social Aide will also announce each guest to the Press Pool in the Lower Cross Hall.)

The Vice President and Mrs. Bush and Secretary and Mrs. Haig will arrive the North Portico. They should be escorted into the Red Room to await the arrival of Ambassador Roosevelt and the Official Party.

(Harpist is in the Diplomatic Reception Room.)

7:15 p.m. First motorcade of the Official Party departs Blair House escorted by the Chief of Protocol, Ambassador Roosevelt, and arrives White House at the North Portico. The party enters the Main Foyer.

At the arrival of the first motorcade, a Social Aide will escort the Vice President and Mrs. Bush and Secretary of State and Mrs. Haig from the Red Room to join the arriving party at the foot of the Grand Staircase.

The Chief of Protocol escorts the following to the Yellow Oval Room via the Grand Staircase:

Vice President and Mrs. Bush Secretary of State and Mrs. Haig Minister of Foreign Affairs Vanderstoel Dutch Ambassador and Mrs. Lubbers Ambassador and Mrs. Dyess

Second motorcade of the Official Party then departs Blair House.

Page Two

7:19 p.m. Second motorcade of the Official Party arrives White House at North Portico.

A Social Aide will escort them to the Red Room.

A senior Government official will serve as host in the Red Room to the remainder of the Official Party. A Social Aide, with the help of a Protocol Officer, will give out seating cards to the guests.

Four additional Social Aides will then escort the Party, one by one, into the East Room at 7:35.

- 7:28 p.m. Her Majesty Queen Beatrix and His Royal Highness Prince Claus of the Netherlands depart Blair House accompanied by Mr. Roosevelt, Mrs. Nahuys-Wijnen, (Lady-in-Waiting), and Captain de Nooijer (Aide de Camp). (Military Cordon will line the driveway.)
- 7:29 p.m. THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN depart the living quarters by elevator and proceed to the North Portico.

(U.S.M.C. Orchestra in Main Foyer)

The Chief of Protocol will serve as hostess protem for THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN as they greet Her Majesty Queen Beatrix, His Royal Highness Prince Claus of the Netherlands, Mrs. Nahuys-Wijnen, and Captain de Nooijer.

- 7:31 p.m. The Queen, her husband, Mrs. Nahuys-Wijnen and Captain de Nooijer are greeted by the PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN; pause for press photo. Proceed to Yellow Oval Room through the Grand Foyer via the elevator.
- 7:35 p.m. The remainder of the Official Party in the Red Room is escorted to the East Room and announced.

Color Guard proceeds up Grand Staircase to hallway outside Yellow Oval Room.

7:40 p.m. Guests (save PRINCIPALS) depart Yellow Oval Room via elevator for East Room and are announced. The Secretary of State and Mrs. Haig are announced first followed by The Vice President and Mrs. Bush.

OIC requests permission to secure the Colors. THE PRESIDENT responds, "Permission granted." Color Guard proceeds to secure the Colors and proceeds out of Yellow Oval Room down the Grand Staircase, led by OIC.

7:45 p.m. The PRINCIPALS arrive on the State Floor via the Grand Staircase; preceded by the Color Team, they continue to the Cross Hall, turn left and walk as far as the Johnson portrait. The Color Team divides at the Johnson portrait and the four PRINCIPALS remain lined up with the last column; they are photographed from the entrance into the East Room by a NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC photographer who will be standing in the entrance to the East Room.

Following the photograph, there will be Ruffles and Flourishes, then the announcement of the PRINCIPALS; at the very end of the announcement, the PRINCIPALS begin to walk into the East Room (the Color Team will remain in the Cross Hall). The announcement will be followed by "Hail to the Chief."

As the PRINCIPALS enter the East Room, they form a receiving line which faces south and will be between two trees. The order of the line is as follows: THE PRESIDENT, HER MAJESTY QUEEN BEATRIX, HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS PRINCE CLAUS OF THE NETHERLANDS, MRS. REAGAN.

The Chief of Protocol stands to THE PRESIDENT'S left with a Social Aide on her left to make introductions to THE PRESIDENT.

Having come through the receiving line, the Official Party will be led directly into the State Dining Room by Social Aides.

After all the guests have gone through the receiving line, the PRINCIPALS should hold in the East Room until all guests are in the State Dining Room, then proceed down the Cross Hall to the State Dining Room.

(Appropriate music should be played.)

- 8:10 p.m. Guests in the Lower Cross Hall should be led into the West Garden Room to be seated for dinner.
- 8:15 p.m. Dinner is served in the State Dining Room and the West Garden Room.

(The Staff Mess will be used for dinner for attending Aides.)

9:00 p.m. Dessert is served accompanied by the Strolling Strings.

9:15 p.m. Toasts:

PRESIDENT REAGAN

HER ROYAL HIGHNESS QUEEN BEATRIX OF THE NETHERLANDS

9:30 p.m. Following the toasts, THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN will be escorted into the Blue Room with Her Majesty Queen Beatrix and His Royal Highness Prince Claus.

The after-dinner guests arrive in the Diplomatic Reception Room and are escorted with the guests from the West Garden Room immediately by Social Aides to the Color Rooms for coffee and liqueurs.

All guests will be encouraged by Social Aides to mix and mingle in all Color Rooms.

(Harpist will play in the Diplomatic Reception Room.)

- 9:40 p.m. The Cross Hall doors to the East Room will be opened to allow those who wish to stroll in and be seated.
- 10:00 p.m. All guests but PRINCIPALS will proceed to the East Room for seating. The two side sections should be seated first, then the middle section. The south doors from the Green Room to the East Room may be used, as well as the Cross Hall Doors.
- 10:10 p.m. PRINCIPALS enter the East Room via the Cross Hall doors and are seated for entertainment on specially allocated chairs in first row.
- 10:15 p.m. The entertainment begins, Mr. George Shearing, pianist.
- 10:45 p.m. Conclusion of the entertainment.

PRESIDENT REAGAN makes brief remarks to the guests and mounts the stage to be photographed with entertainers.

10:50 p.m. Her Majesty Queen Beatrix, His Royal Highness Prince Claus, Mrs. Nahuys-Wijen and Captain de Nooijer are escorted to the North Portico by THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN for departure.

11:00 p.m. THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN return to the Main Foyer to begin the dancing.

Guests are served champagne and join in dancing.

11:30 p.m. All guests depart the Residence.
