

SEQUENCE OF EVENTS FOR OFFICIAL DINNER IN HONOR OF
HIS EXCELLENCY THE PRESIDENT OF THE
REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES

AND MRS. MARCOS September 16, 1982

7:00 p.m.

Dinner guests arrive at the Diplomatic Reception Room. Alternate dinner guests, with special cards, are led to the right down the Cross Hall and into the First Ladies Garden for cocktails. (Rain plan: Map Room for Alternate Dinner guests.)

7:00 p.m.

First motorcade of the Official Party departs the hotel escorted by the Chief of Protocol, Ambassador Roosevelt.

7:10 p.m.

The regular dinner guests are escorted by Social Aides to the East Room where they are announced. (A Social Aide will also announce each guest to the Press Pool in the Lower Cross Hall.)

The Vice President and Mrs. Bush and Secretary of State and Mrs. Shultz will arrive the North Portico. They should be escorted into the Red Room to await the arrival of Ambassador Roosevelt and the Official Party.

The second motorcade of the Official Party then departs the Sheraton Washington Hotel.

7:15 p.m.

The first motorcade arrives at the North Portico escorted by Ambassador Roosevelt. The party enters the Main Foyer and is greeted by Mr. Rosebush, who will eventually escort them upstairs.

At the arrival of the first motorcade, a Social Aide will escort the Vice President and Mrs. Bush and Secretary of State and Mrs. Shultz from the Red Room to join the arriving party at the foot of the Grand Staircase.

The Chief of Protocol escorts the following to the Yellow Oval Room via the Grand Staircase:

7:20 p.m. Second motorcade of the Official Party arrives the North Portico.

A Social Aide will escort them to the Red Room. A senior government official will serve as host in the Red Room to the remainder of the Official Party. A Social Aide, with the help of a Protocol officer, will give out seating cards to the guests.

Four additional Social Aides will then escort the Party, one by one, into the East Room at 7:35 p.m.

- 7:25 p.m. His Excellency the President of the Republic of the Philippines and Mrs. Marcos depart the hotel accompanied by Mr. Roosevelt.

 (Military cordon will line the driveway.)
- 7:29 p.m. THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN depart the living quarters by elevator and proceed to the North Portico.

(U.S.M.C. Orchestra in Main Foyer)

The Chief of Protocol will serve as hostess protem for THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN as they greet His Excellency the President of the Republic of the Philippines and Mrs. Marcos at the North Portico.

- 7:30 p.m. The President of the Philippines and Mrs. Marcos are greeted by THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN; pause for press photo. They then proceed to the Yellow Oval Room through the Grand Foyer and via the elevator.
- 7:35 p.m. The remainder of the Official Party in the Red Room is escorted to the East Room and announced.

The Color Guard proceeds up the Grand Staircase to the hallway outside the Yellow Oval Room.

7:40 p.m. Guests (save PRINCIPALS) depart Yellow Oval Room via the elevator for the East Room and are announced. The Secretary of State and Mrs. Shultz are announced first followed by the Vice President and Mrs. Bush.

7:40 p.m. cont'd.

OIC requests permission to secure the Colors. THE PRESIDENT responds, "Permission granted." Color Guard proceeds to secure the Colors and proceeds out of the Yellow Oval Room down the Grand Staircase, led by OIC.

At the foot of the Staircase, the Color Team divides.

7:45 p.m.

The PRINCIPALS arrive on the State Floor via the Grand Staircase, pause at the foot of the Stairs for press photo session, and proceed directly to the East Room to full Honors. The Color Guard will precede them.

After the announcement of the PRINCIPALS, the PRINCIPALS, led by THE PRESIDENT, enter the East Room and form a receiving line which will be in the center of the Cross Hall doors, just inside the East Room. The order of the line from north to south is as follows: THE PRESIDENT, PRESIDENT MARCOS, MRS. REAGAN, MRS. MARCOS.

Ambassador Roosevelt stands to the PRESIDENT'S left with a Social Aide on her left to make introductions to THE PRESIDENT.

Having come through the receiving line, the Official Party will be escorted through the Green Room, into the Blue Room, and into the Red Room where they will descend the outside staircase and proceed down the lighted driveway to the Rose Garden and into dinner. All other guests may be led either down the staircase from the Green Room or from the Red Room. (Rain plan: All guests proceed from the Green Room, into the Cross Hall, into the State Dining Room for dinner.)

After all the guests have gone through the receiving line, the PRINCIPALS should hold in the East Room until all guests are in the Rose Garden, then proceed down the Cross Hall to the Blue Room, then into the Red Room and down the outside stairs to the driveway and into the Rose Garden to be seated for dinner. (Rain Plan: PRINCIPALS will proceed down the Cross Hall and into the State Dining Room.)

8:15 p.m. Dinner is served in the Rose Garden.

As soon as the PRINCIPALS have been seated for dinner, the Alternate Dinner guests should be led up the Grand Staircase and into the State Dining room for dinner. As soon as they are seated, dinner should be served there. (Rain plan: Alternate Dinner guests proceed at 8:10 into the West Garden Room for for dinner) (The Staff Mess will be used for dinner by attending aides.)

9:30 p.m. Following the toasts, THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN will escort the President of the Philippines and Mrs. Marcos out of the Rose Garden, across the drive, and to an area specially allocated on the South Lawn for coffee and liqueurs.

All guests will be encouraged by Social Aides to mix and mingle with the PRINCIPALS on the South Lawn during the serving of coffee and liqueurs.

The after-dinner guests who have arrived shortly before will be led by Social Aides to join the PRINCIPALS and guests on the South Lawn.

The Alternate Dinner guests should then be led by Social Aides out of the State Dining Room, down the Grand Staircase and out the Diplomatic Reception Room to join the guests on the South Lawn.

(Rain plan: Coffee and liqueurs will be served in the Color Rooms)

- 9:40 p.m. Those who wish to begin to find seats for the entertainment may do so.
- 10:00 p.m. All guests but PRINCIPALS will proceed to the seats on the South Lawn. (Rain plan: East Room for entertainment)
- 10:10 p.m. THE PRINCIPALS proceed to their specially allocated seats on the first row for the entertainment.
- 10:15 p.m. The entertainment begins.
- 10:45 p.m. Conclusion of the entertainment.

PRESIDENT REAGAN mounts the stage to make brief remarks to the guests, and he is joined by MRS. REAGAN to be photographed with the entertainers.

10:50 p.m.

The President of the Philippines and Mrs. Marcos are escorted by THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN down the center aisle, across the drive and up the staircase leading into the Red Room. They proceed to the Cross Hall and the Grand Foyer and the President of the Philippines and Mrs. Marcos are escorted directly to their car. (Rain plan: PRINCIPALS proceed from the East Room and the President of the Philippines and Mrs. Marcos are escorted directly to their car.)

THE PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN will then return to the Grand Foyer to begin the dancing.

The remainder of the guests will proceed up the outside stairs into the Color Rooms and into the Cross Hall and Foyer for champagne and dancing. (Rain plan: Guests proceed from the East Room to the Grand Foyer for champagne and dancing.)

11:30 p.m. All guests depart.
