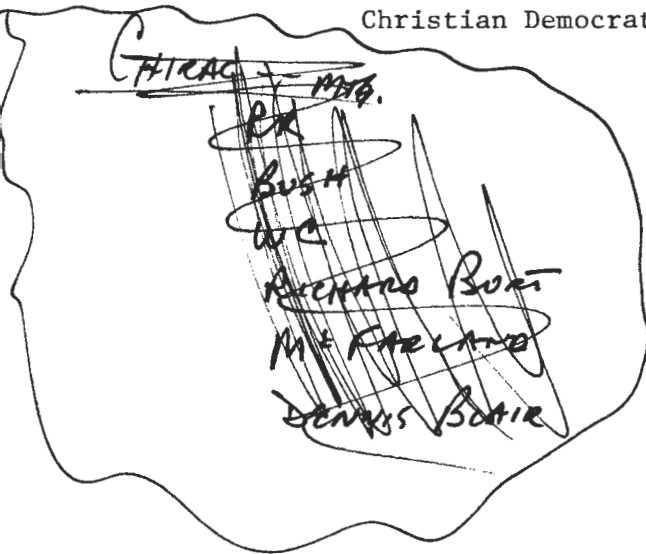

- o Although it has been almost two months since the President's Citizen's Medal was awarded to your late husband, Samuel Jackson, I wanted the opportunity to present it to you personally as an expression of my own appreciation for Sam's dedicated service to the nation.
- o In a wide variety of significant roles* Sam Jackson has made important contributions to the achievement of a better life for his fellow Americans.
- o I am proud to count myself among the three presidents who have had the benefit of his experience, his judgment and his strength of character.

Dear Mrs. Jackson:

Nancy and I want to extend our heartfelt condolences to you and your family on the death of your husband.

Throughout his entire life, Sam Jackson dedicated himself to the service of the nation and to the achievement of a better life for his fellow Americans. His participation as a young attorney in the case which ultimately became the landmark civil rights decision of the century, Brown v. Board of Education, symbolized the values he held and the changed America he would help create.

To all of his endeavors, as lawyer, member of the Armed Forces, churchman, adviser and administrator, Sam Jackson brought a strength of character and conviction that left deep impressions on all who knew him. His unique qualities were recognized by three Presidents, and I am particularly proud to have had the benefit of his experience and judgment on my Commission on Housing. His work will leave a lasting mark on our society and, for his contributions, all Americans can be grateful.

Most importantly, Sam Jackson will be missed as a husband, father, and friend. Nancy and I join you in mourning his loss. May you find comfort in the care and concern of all who share your grief and in the surety of his reward. Our prayers are with you, and may God bless you.
