I. **PURPOSE**

At the beginning of each Congress the House of Representatives elects certain officers to perform the administrative tasks necessary to assure the efficient operation of the House. Donnald K. Anderson is manager of the Democratic Cloakroom. He is not an elected officer but performs the important task of regulating the flow of information to and from Members while they are on the House floor.
