I. PURPOSE

Courtesy visit with Australian publisher and Mrs. Rupert Murdoch, who will be in Washington today as guests of honor at a dinner hosted by Charles and Mary Jane Wick.

Our relationship with Mr. Murdoch goes back to the Reagan Announcement Dinner in New York in November 1979 when the New York Post endorsed Ronald Reagan to be the Republican nominee for President eight months before the Republican National Convention.

II. BACKGROUND

The 52 year old Murdoch has the largest publishing empire in the world. His U.S. interests include the New York Post, an afternoon newspaper whose circulation he has taken from 450,000 to over a million and a group of newspapers in the San Antonio and Houston area. His weekly American magazines include The Star, New York Magazine and Village Voice; he also owns the three largest newspapers in Great Britain - The London Times, The Sunday Times and The Sun.

Mr. Murdoch is a staunch supporter of yours and the free world. He is a key supporter of Australian Prime Minister Malcolm Fraser and British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher.
