SUBJECT:

Ambassador to Hungary

For the position of Ambassador to Hungary, I recommend that you nominate Nicolas M. Salgo.

The primary U.S. interest in Hungary is to encourage further steps toward normalization of relations with the U.S. and closer links with Western institutions, which can in the long run enhance Hungary's freedom of action and decrease its dependence on other nations. There are also a number of continuing bilateral problems in commercial, consular, and cultural relations which are, however, of a far less critical nature than problems in other Warsaw Pact countries.

Nicolas M. Salgo of New York is currently co-owner and Chairman of the Watergate complex. In addition, Mr. Salgo is founder and owner of the investment and merchant banking firm, Nicolas Salgo & Company. Mr. Salgo was born and educated in Budapest, Hungary, where he earned LL.D. and Pol.Sc.D. degrees. He has been a U.S. citizen since 1953. From 1936 to 1948 he lived and worked in Geneva, Switzerland. Since his arrival in the U.S. in 1948, Mr. Salgo has held very senior positions with firms engaged in real estate development, pharmaceutical and chemical manufacturing, mining, worldwide shipping, investment management, and sugar cane growing and refining. For the past forty years he has been an owner, Chief Executive Officer, Chairman or Director of several corporations. In addition, he is a Founding Member and Trustee of the Salgo-Noren Foundation and has been a member of Lloyds of London since 1958. Mr. Salgo is also a past Chairman of Young Presidents Organization of New York City and past President of the United Fund of Port Washington, New York.
