PURPOSE I.

To utilize the opportunity to address four active, supportive Hispanic business and professional organizations who are an outstanding example of minority enterprise development and to give the President an opportunity to reaffirm his commitment to accomplish the objectives set forth in his Executive Order on Minority Enterprise.

II. BACKGROUND

Associations forming this audience of 600-800 Hispanic business men and women are voluntary, privately funded, and dedicated to hard work and free enterprise. They represent the Los Angeles, Orange, San Bernardino/Riverside, and San Diego, California counties and will be an excellent, receptive audience for the President. They are interested in hearing about the business climate for minorities in the next twenty years.

III. PARTICIPANTS

Hispanic Business and Professional Association of Orange County, Latin Businessmen's Association (Los Angeles), Hispanic Business and Professional Association of the Inland Empire, and the Mexican and American Foundation.

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR THE PRESIDENT FOR HISPANIC SMALL BUSINESS OUTLOOK LUNCHEON

- -- Emphasize increased business opportunities thanks to

 Administration policy and the Economic Recovery Program.
- -- Point out that international trade policy and the Caribbean Basin Initiative with regard to Mexico, Central and South America have also helped to provide a better outlook for business.
- -- Emphasize the President's initiatives to assist minority business, including the Executive Order on Minority Enterprise which established the implementation mechanism for carrying out the President's December 17, 1982 commitment to ensure \$15 billion in federal procurement for minority business (direct and indirect contracting); \$1.5 billion in credit assistance; and \$3 million in management and technical assistance over the next three years.
- -- The Hispanic community should set a goal to double the number of Hispanic businesses in the United States in the next four years.
- -- Stress that there have been over 125 Hispanics appointed to key positions in the Administration.
