I. PURPOSE

To salute the U.S. Olympic Hockey Team as they prepare for the 1984 Winter Olympics and the Washington Capitals.

II. BACKGROUND

The 1984 U.S. Olympic Hockey Team is seeking to repeat the miracle of 1980 when the U.S. Olympic Hockey Team upset the Soviets to win the Gold Medal at Lake Placid, New York. The Olympic Team is in Washington to play an exhibition game against the National Hockey League's (NHL) Washington Capitals (Caps) on Friday evening.

The Washington Capitals for the first time in their nine-year existence made the NHL playoffs last year. It is predicted that they will do even better this year in their quest for the Stanley Cup which has been won for four years in a row by the New York Islanders.

The Caps are led by their American-born captain, Rod Langway, who was voted best defenseman in the NHL last year.

The Olympic Team is in the midst of a nation-wide tour in preparation for the Olympic Games in February, 1984. Included in the team are two players who helped win the Gold Medal in 1980, Phil Verchota and John Harrington.

PRESIDENTIAL REMARKS: GREET MEMBERS OF U.S. OLYMPIC HOCKEY TEAM  
AND WASHINGTON CAPITALS  
THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 1983

Welcome to all the players, coaches and managers and thank you all for coming. We were going to have a little exhibition game right here in the Rose Garden. This ice you see actually started as a rink but it melted. And from the rivalry that I hear you have going, you may melt the ice at the Capital Centre Friday evening.

Athletic rivalry is in the best spirit of competition. You've put me in a predicament for Friday's game, though, because both teams here today are in a sense hometown teams. The U.S. Olympic Team is America's hometown team and the Capitals are Washington's hometown team. So I don't think I'll pick a favorite. In politics, they call this fence-sitting. But we do wish both teams the best of luck for a good game.

Now a couple of members of the '84 Olympic Team also played in the 1980 Lake Placid Games. I'm told that before the big game with the Soviet team the coach told the players, "You were born for this moment. This is your moment." And I think we'll never forget the picture of those young Americans when they certainly were not favored to win by a long shot -- but they did. And now the team is to be inducted into the new Olympic Hall of Fame.

Abe Pollin, the owner of the Capital Centre is here today, too. I should tell the teams to check the rink pretty carefully before you skate out on it. I was out last Saturday and there was a rodeo there. But the Capitals give Washington a very much

needed team to cheer for, and I want you all to know I follow your progress. Last year you were great. This year we hope you'll be even better.

Again, thank you all for coming, and the best of luck to you tomorrow night.

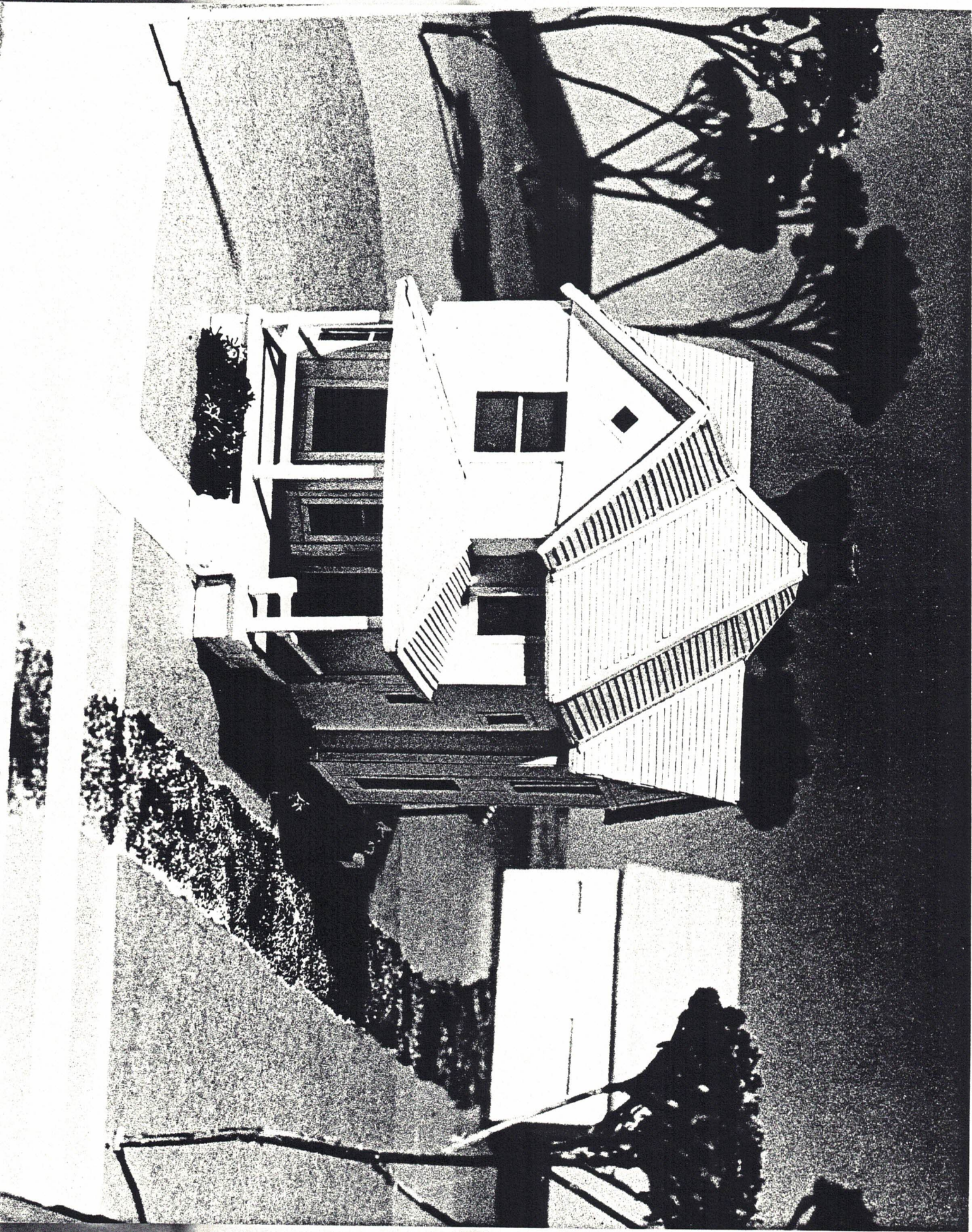

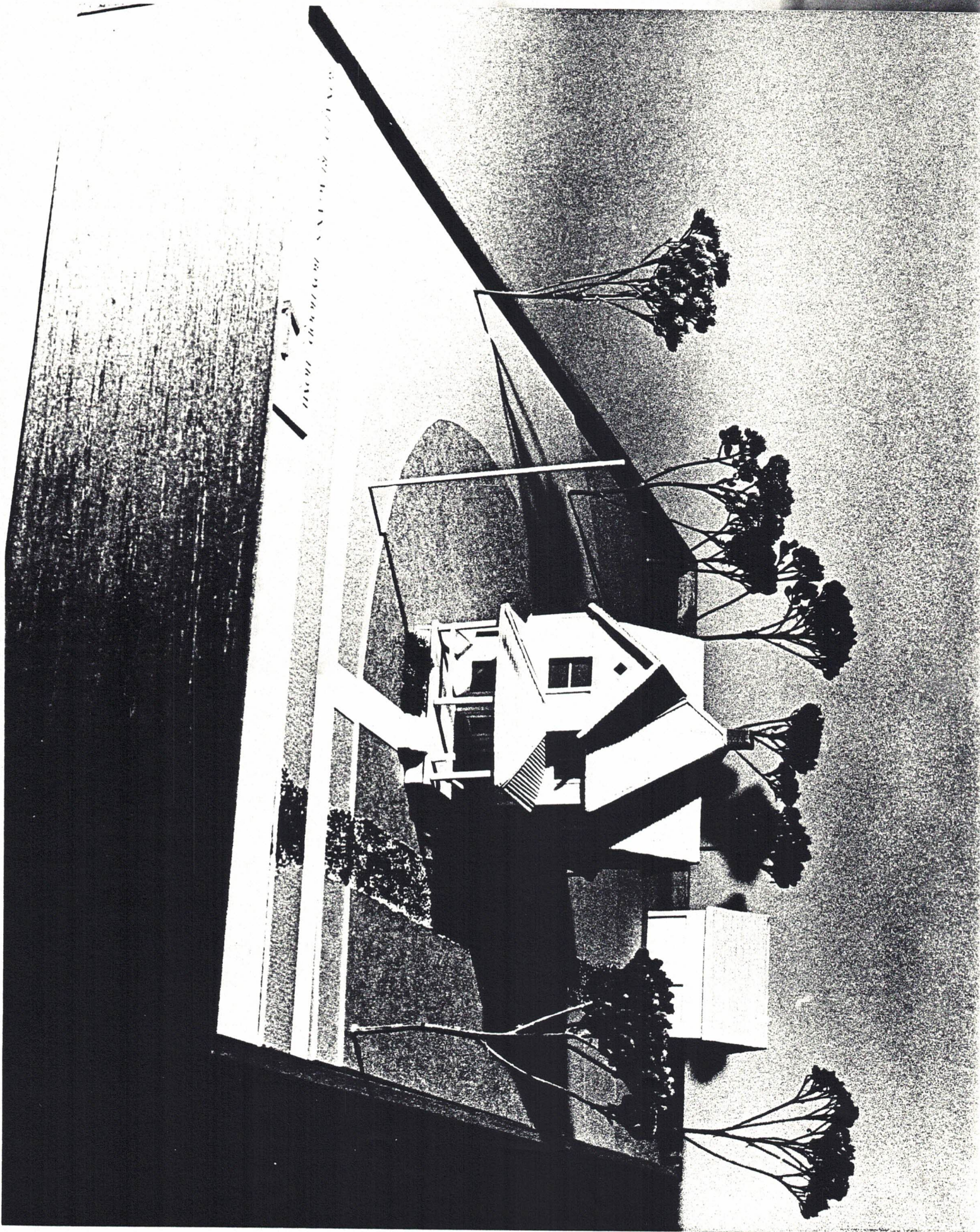
