I. PURPOSE

For the President to attend a memorial service to honor the 229 Marines killed in the Beirut terrorist bombing of October 23, 1983.

II. BACKGROUND

On October 23 a bomb demolished the 24th Marine Amphibious Unit (MAU) Headquarters at the Beirut Airport. 229 officers and men were killed in the blast. A memorial service is being held by the 2nd Marine Division at Camp LeJeune to honor those killed in that action. The President has been invited to attend the service.

The President will make remarks to the assembled group of NOK and then depart via Marine One to MCAS Cherry Point. Before boarding AF-1 he will make remarks to assembled Marines and their families.

Attached is biographical information on the Members of Congress who will be joining the President and Mrs. Reagan for their trip to Camp Lejeune, North Carolina.

Accompanying the President on Air Force I will be Senator John East, Senator Jesse Helms, Congressman Jim Martin and Congressman Charles Whitley. Both Senators will be traveling round trip on Air Force I, while both Congressmen will depart from the Presidential party at Camp Lejeune.

CONGRESSMAN JIM MARTIN R-(NORTH CAROLINA)

Congressman Martin was first elected to Congress in 1972. He has a Ph.D. in chemistry and prior to coming to Congress was a professor at Davidson College. He serves on the House Ways and Means Committee. Congressman Martin is currently a candidate for Governor of North Carolina.

This week, during consideration of the Defense Appropriations bill, Jim Martin was called off a departing airplane at Dulles Airport and asked to return to the Capitol to vote on the MX. The Congressman willingly returned, missing his plane, a speaking engagement and an honorarium. His vote made a difference in the narrow 208 to 217 victory. This vote was just another example of Jim Martin's solid support for the President during the past two and a half years.

SENATOR JOHN EAST (R-NORTH CAROLINA)

Senator John East was born in Springfield, Illinois on May 5, 1931. He is a Phi Beta Kappa graduate of Earlham College in Richmond, Indiana, where he met his wife, Sis. He received his law degree at the University of Illinois, a Masters and a Doctorate at the University of Florida. East taught political science at E. Carolina University in Greenville, North Carolina. He ran unsuccessfully against Walter Jones (D-North Carolina) and was also defeated in a bid for North Carolina Secretary of State.

Senator East was elected to the U.S. Senate in 1980 and is the junior Senator from North Carolina. He is a close ally of the senior Senator, Jesse Helms. His election was helped substantially by Helms' political organization, the National Congressional Club.

The Senator serves on the Committees on Armed Services, Labor and Human Resources, and Judiciary. As Chairman of the Judiciary Subcommittee on Separation of Powers, Senator East has led the fight for anti-abortion legislation.

Senator East is married to the former Priscilla "Sis" Sherk and has two children.

The trip to Camp Lejeune will be especially poignant. The Senator mustered out at Camp Lejeune at the age of 24 having attained the rank of Lieutenant in the Marine Corps. Twenty-two days later he contracted polio which has left him confined to a wheel chair.

CONGRESSMAN CHARLES WHITLEY (D-NORTH CAROLINA)

Congressman Whitley was first elected in 1976 to the 95th Congress. He serves on the House Agriculture Committee. Charlie Whitley serves on the Tobacco Subcommittee and is a strong defender of tobacco interests. In his first term he held a seat on Armed Services, useful in a district with so many military bases, but gave it up to spend more time on agricultural matters.

The Congressman is a conservative and has supported many of the President's legislative initiatives. Most recently, he supported full funding for the MX Peacekeeper missile in the Defense Appropriations bill.

SENATOR JESSE HELMS (R-NORTH CAROLINA)

Senator Jesse Helms was born in Monroe, North Carolina on October 18, 1921. He attended Wingate College and Wake Forest College. Helms served in the U.S Navy from 1942-45. He was administrative assistant to U.S. Senator Willis Smith (1951-53), and in 1953 to U.S. Senator Alton Lennon. From 1960-72, Helms was executive Vice President, WRAL-TV Raleigh.

Senator Helms was elected to the U.S. Senate, November 7, 1972, and was reelected November 7, 1978. Senator Helms is Chairman of the Senate Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry Committee, and is a member of the Senate Rules and Administration Committee, the Select Committee on Ethics, and the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, where he serves as Chairman of the Subcommittee on Western Hemisphere Affairs.

Senator Helms is married to the former Dorothy Jane Coble, and they have three children; Jane, Nancy and Charles.

Senator Helms has a strong interest in Central American affairs. He supports your actions in Lebanon and Grenada.

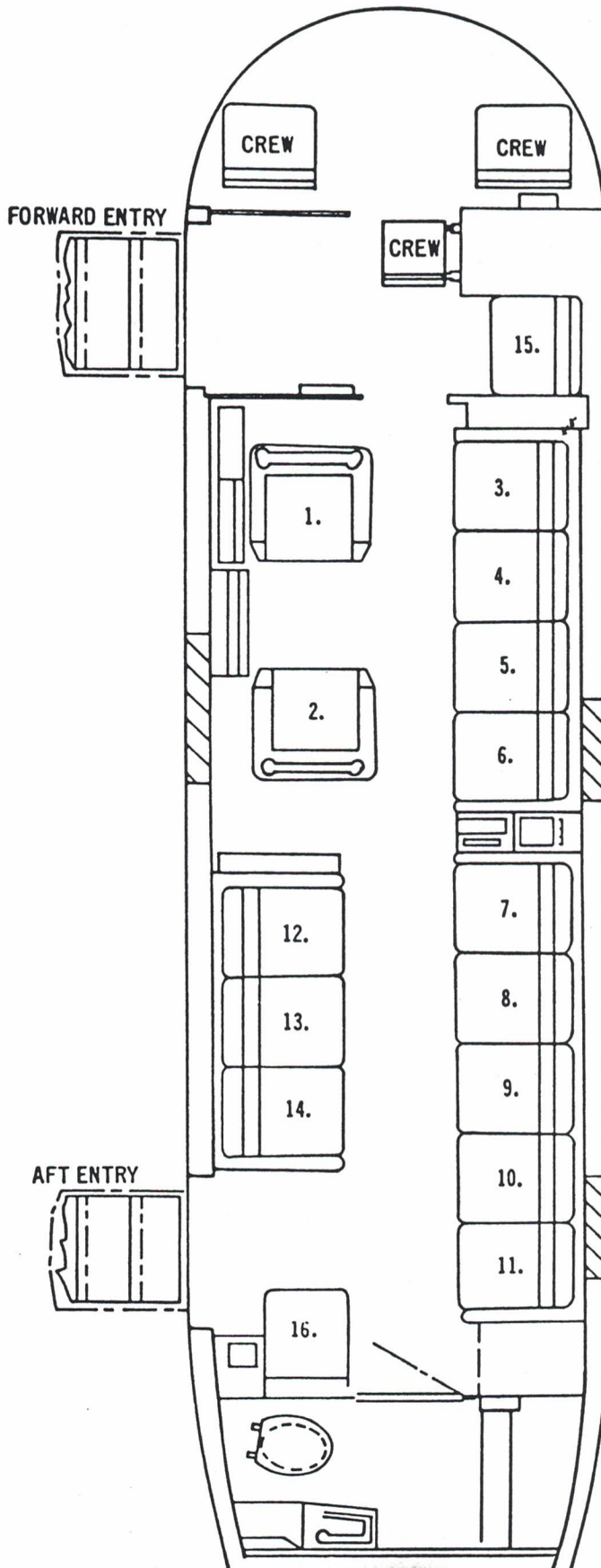

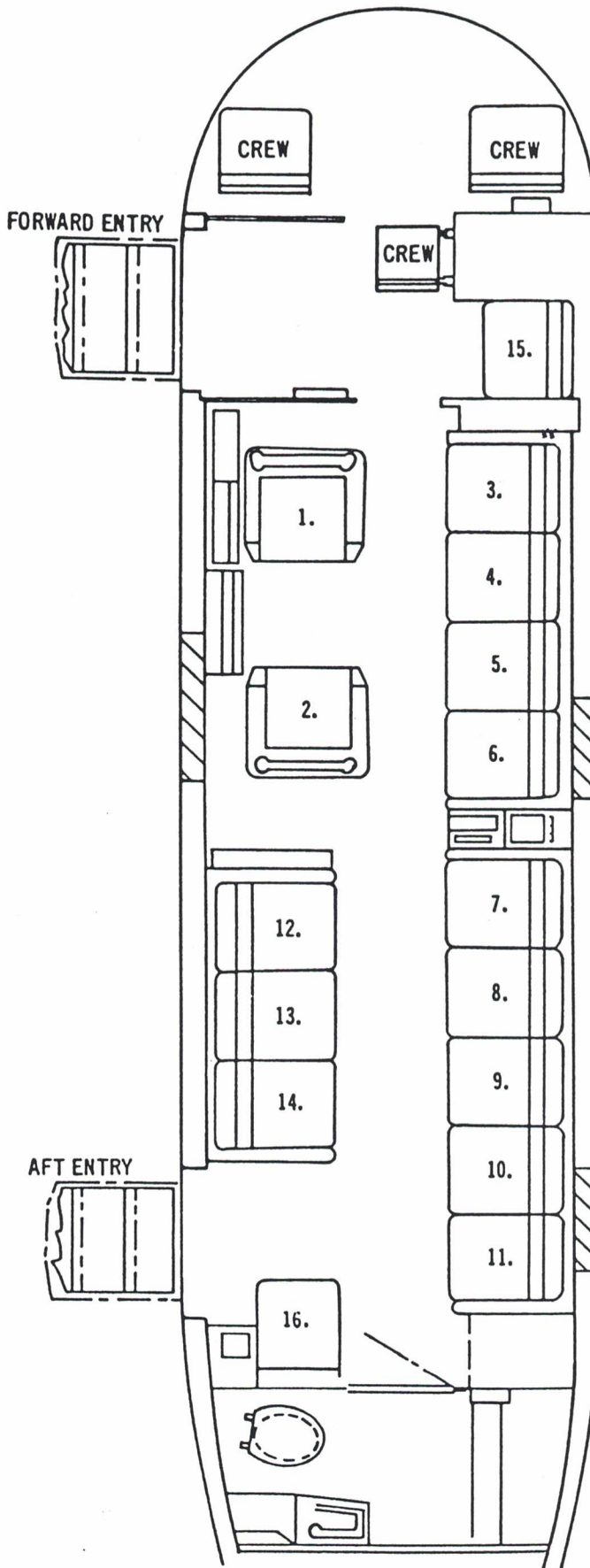

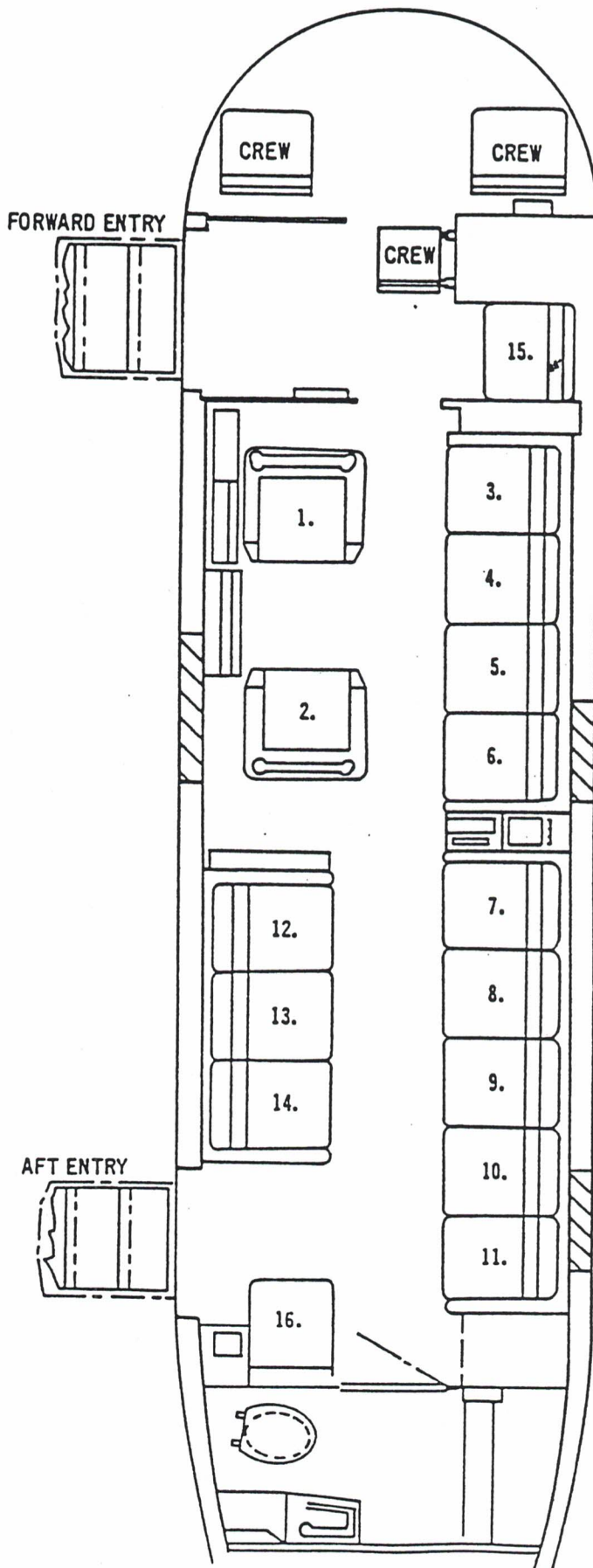

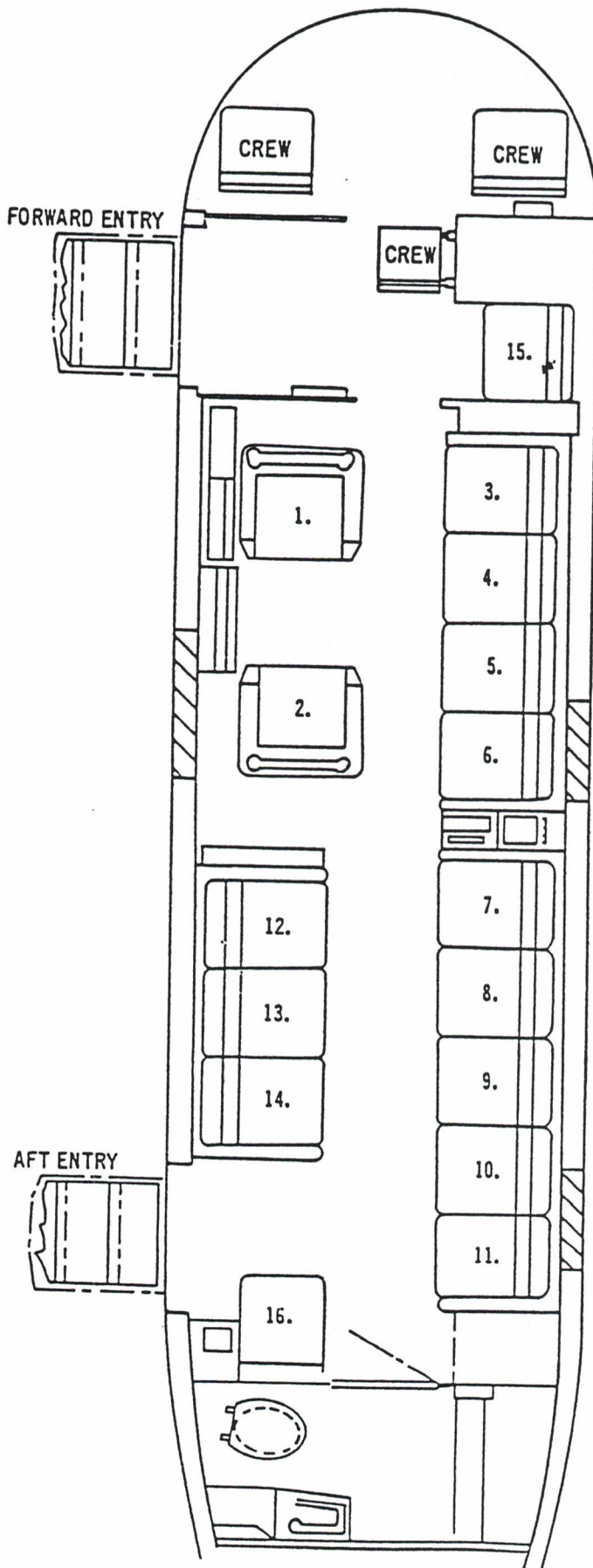

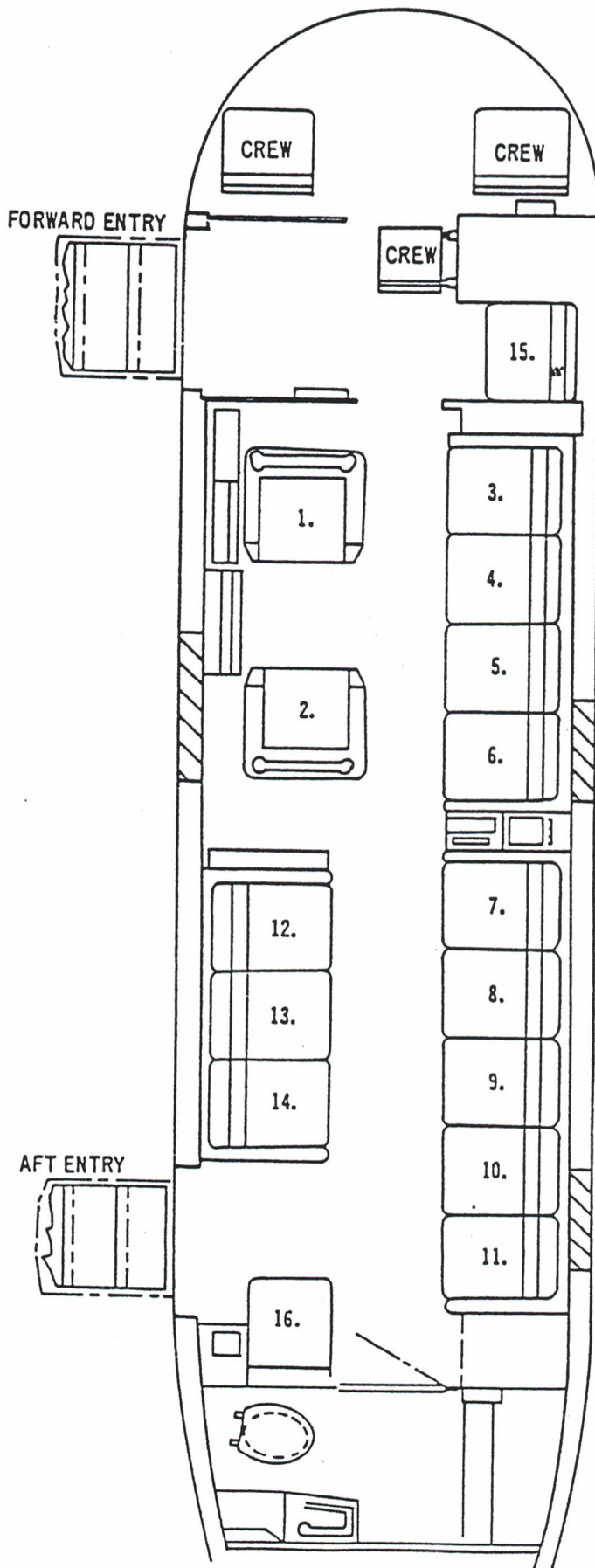

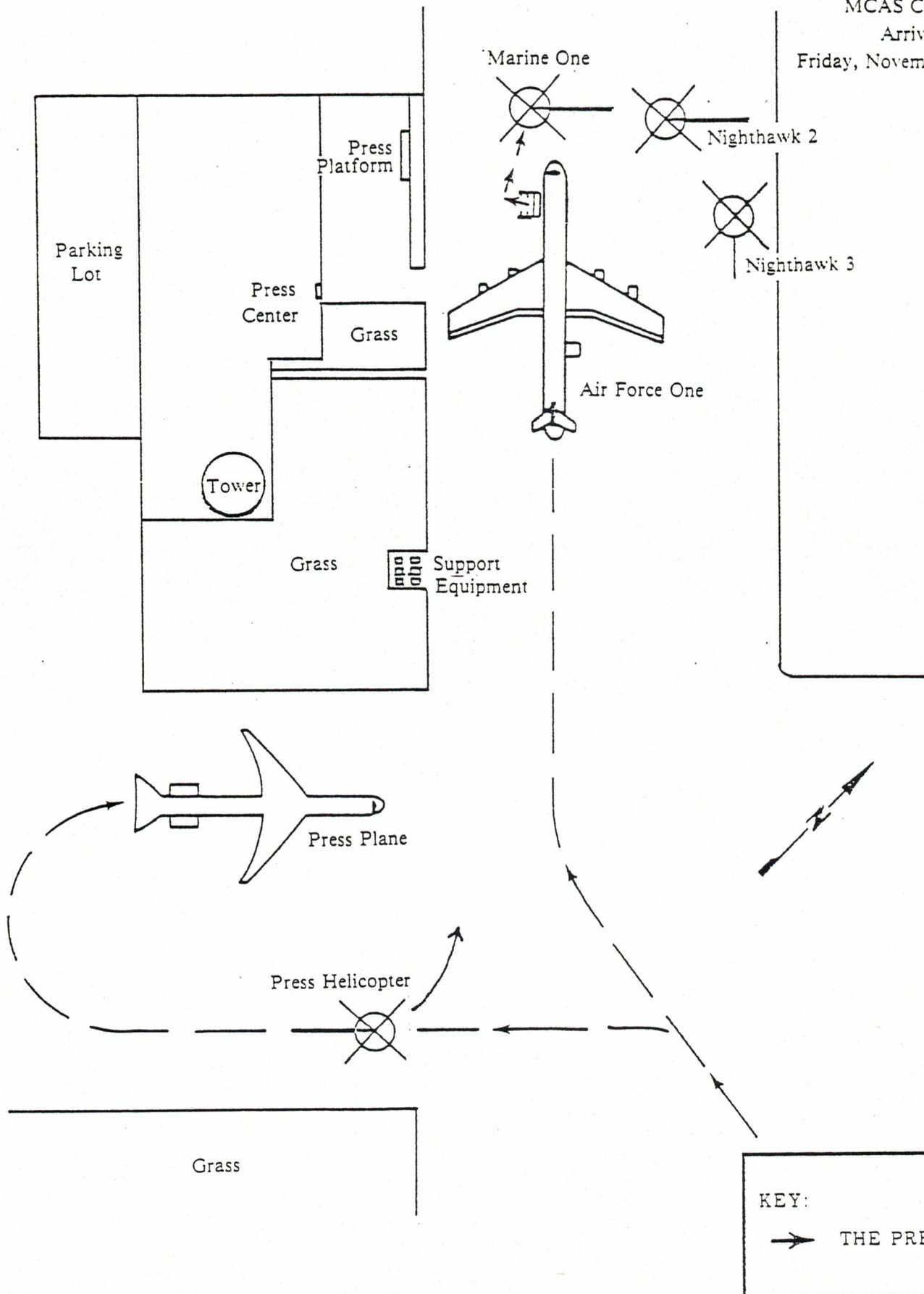

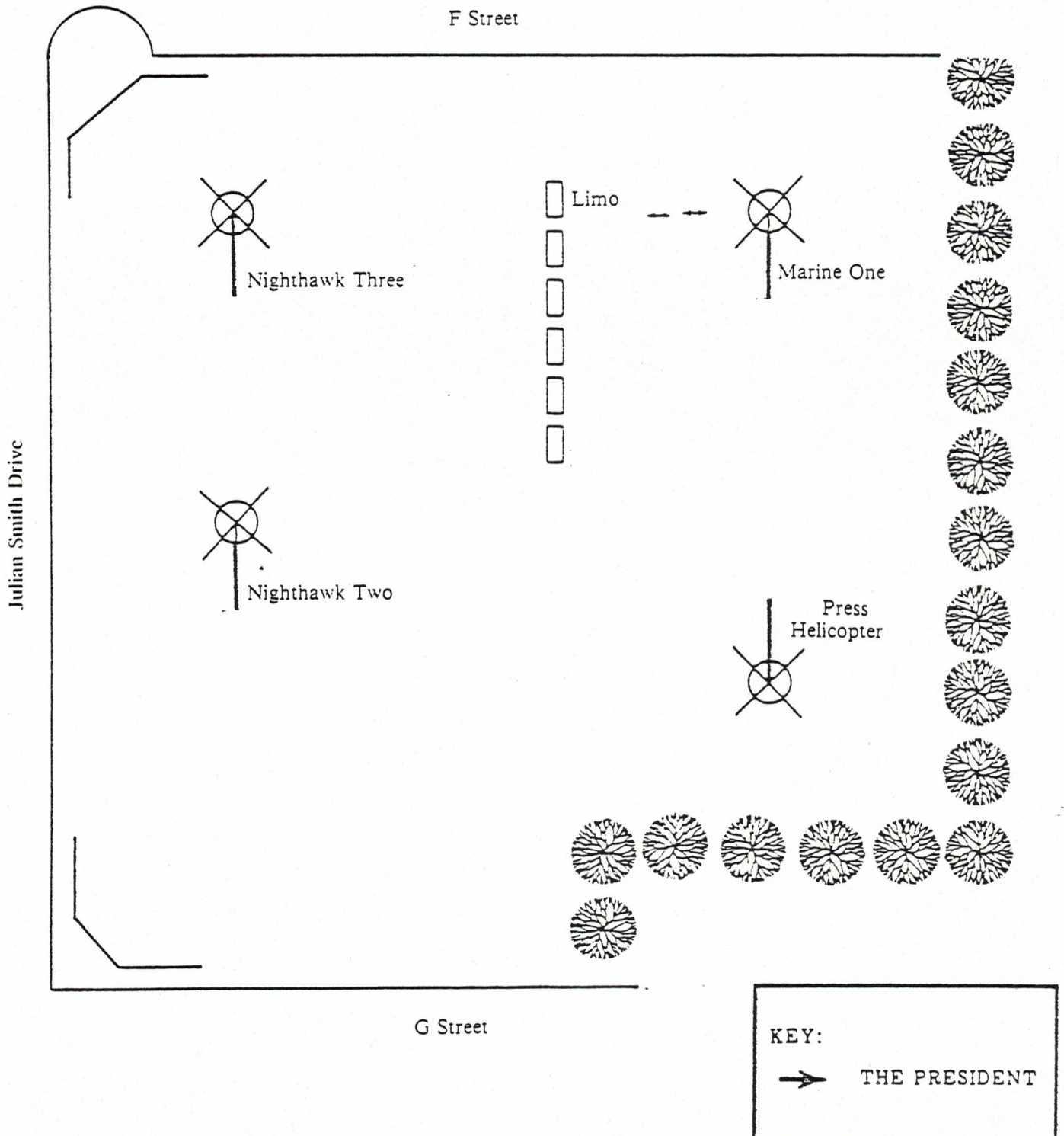
MCAS Cherry Point

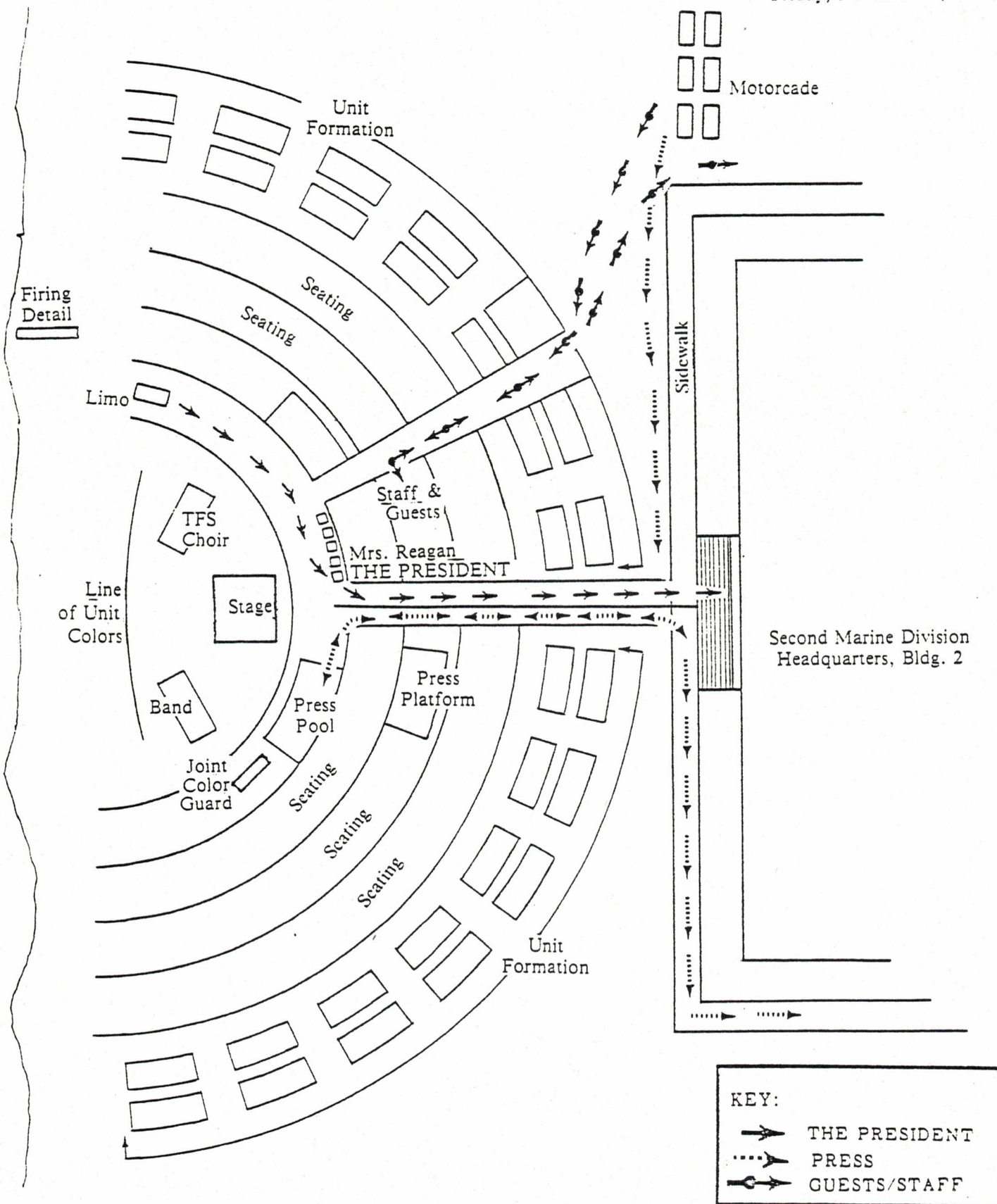

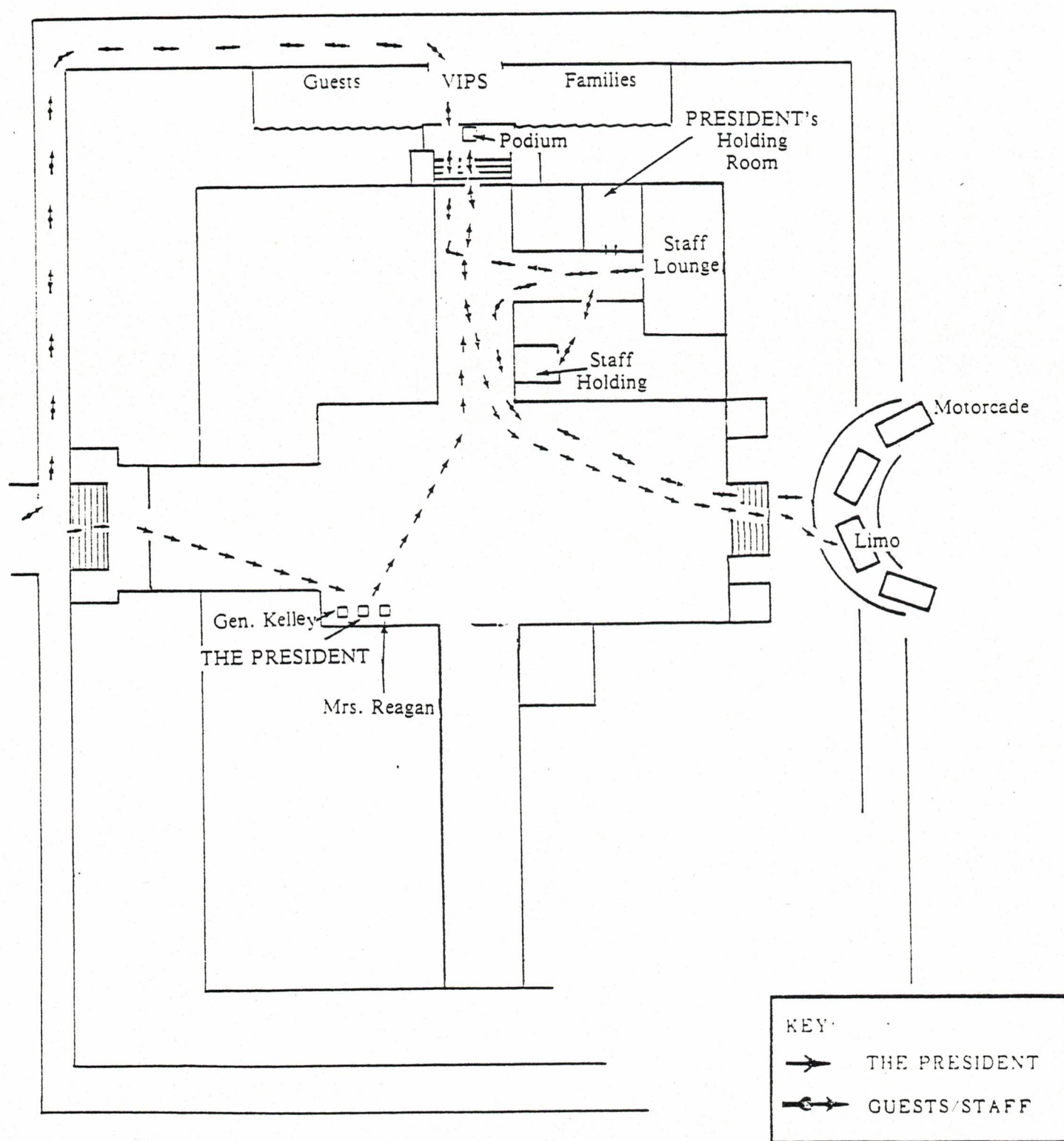
