

#### I. PURPOSE

To receive a briefing from Senator John Tower and Senator John Warner on their recent trip to the Middle East.

#### II. BACKGROUND

Senator John Tower, Chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, and Senator John Warner, also a member of the Senate Armed Services Committee, just returned last night from a week-long trip in the Middle East. Tower and Warner visited Lebanon, Egypt, Israel, Syria, and Jordan. They will be making their observations known to the press, but wanted an opportunity to brief you personally as soon as possible. We anticipate that their comments will be favorable.

To respond to Senator Wilson's request for an opportunity to discuss the F-20 tactical fighter aircraft.

#### BACKGROUND

Senator Pete Wilson is concerned about the fate of the F-20 airplane, a tactical fighter aircraft built by Northrop. Thus far, the Defense Department has not expressed an interest in purchasing the F-20 preferring instead the performance capabilities of the F-15 and the F-16 fighter planes. As a result, Northrop has been promoting the F-20 for foreign military sales, and DoD indicates that they have assisted in this effort.

During his meeting with you today, Wilson will propose that the Air Force include in its budget submission an aggressor squadron of F-20 aircraft. - -- Hello Pete, and Happy New Year. I hope you and Gayle enjoyed the holidays, and that you have had time to get a little breather before the Senate reconvenes later this month.
- -- Now I understand you have some concerns about the F-20 tactical fighter aircraft, and I look forward to hearing what you have to say.

(Wilson to make his case for the F-20. Open discussion to include Secretary Weinberger, Bud McFarlane, and others.)

-- Pete, I appreciate your thoughtful and concise analysis of this subject, and it is helpful to me to have this background on the F-20. I assure you that I will look into this matter personally, and I appreciate your taking the time to come down here today.
