MEETING WITH SENATE REPUBLICAN POLICY COMMITTEE

#### I. PURPOSE

To meet with all Republican members of the Senate for a general discussion of the upcoming session of Congress. Prior to the luncheon, a brief photo opportunity with Senator Thad Cochran in the office of Senate Majority Leader Howard Baker has also been scheduled.

#### II. BACKGROUND

The Second Session of the 98th Congress began yesterday, January 23. Because this is a Presidential election year involving two conventions and several primaries, the number of legislative days in this session is expected to number less than one hundred. As a result, the Majority Leader has suggested that the Senate will act on the budget, the major appropriations bills, and a "handful" of other legislative items. The deficit and foreign policy will continue to be major items of debate.

In addition to the Presidential race, 19 of the 55
Republican Senate seats are up for reelection this year.
It is imperative that we maintain our majority in the
Senate, and Republican unity will be a crucial factor in
achieving that goal. Tomorrow, you will present your State
of the Union Address to the Congress, followed by your FY
85 budget next week. Today's luncheon provides a good
opportunity for you to personally encourage cooperation
among Republican Senators in the months ahead and to hear
first-hand their concerns and recommendations.

#### Brief Meeting in Majority Leader Baker's Office

Upon arrival at the Capitol, you will proceed to the Office of Senate Majority Leader Howard Baker for a brief holding period prior to attending the Policy Luncheon. During this holding period, you will do a 30-second videotape with Senator Thad Cochran (R-Mississippi). Cochran is seeking his second term in the Senate this year. He is not expected to have Republican opposition, and it is unclear, at this point, whether his Democratic opponent will be

Governor William Winter, former Congressman David Bowen, or Congressman Wayne Dowdy. A more detailed biography on Cochran is attached for your information. At the conclusion of this holding period, Senator Baker and Policy Committee Chairman John Tower will accompany you to the Luncheon in Room S-207.

#### Republican Policy Committee Luncheon

Each Tuesday, all Republican Senators meet for lunch under the auspices of the Senate Republican Policy Committee which is chaired by Senator John Tower. These luncheons provide an opportunity for discussion of upcoming legislation, political items, and other housekeeping matters. You attended two previous policy luncheons on July 14, 1981 and March 8, 1982.

At the beginning of the luncheon, Majority Leader Baker and Policy Committee Chairman Tower will make brief introductory remarks. At that point, you will present your own prepared remarks which will be covered by the press. At the conclusion of your remarks, the press will leave, lunch will be served, and that will be followed by the routine business meeting. During this portion of the lunch, it is anticipated that there will be a good opportunity for you to hear the concern of individual Senators.

There will be press coverage of the President's prepared remarks at the Policy Committee Luncheon. Press will be pre-positioned in S-207, and will leave at the conclusion of the President's remarks. There will also be a press "stake-out" outside the luncheon room, and although the President will not have any further direct press contact, it is expected that various Senators will brief the press following the Policy Committee Luncheon.

#### SENATOR THAD COCHRAN (R-MISSISSIPPI)

Born and raised in Mississippi, Thad Cochran served in the U.S. Navy, earned a law degree and practiced law in Jackson, Mississippi for seven years before beginning his Congressional career.

In 1972, Cochran was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives. He served three terms in the House and received over 70 percent of the vote in both of his races for re-election. In 1978, he was elected to the U.S. Senate to replace James Eastland. Cochran is the first Republican in over 100 years to be elected to statewide office in Mississippi.

As a junior member of the Senate, Cochran benefitted greatly when the Republicans took control of the Senate after the 1980 election. In addition to serving as a member of the Agriculture Committee, Cochran was also able to move up to Chairman of the Agriculture Subcommittee of the Senate Appropriations Committee. In a state where agriculture is a major industry, these Committee positions are extremely helpful to Cochran back home. A thoughtful and soft-spoken man, Cochran is well liked by his colleagues, and has close ties across the political spectrum. Cochran is a strong supporter of Administration policy, and has been particularly helpful on some close votes in the defense and foreign policy areas.

Cochran is married to the former Rose Clayton of New Albany, Mississippi, and they have two children, Clayton and Kate.

Cochran is seeking re-election in 1984. He is not expected to have Republican opposition. Among the Democrats, there is strong speculation that the current Governor, William Winter, may decide to challenge Cochran. Winter is expected to make a decision in this regard by early February. Other possible Democratic opponents are former Congressman David Bowen and Congressman Wayne Dowdy. Of the three, the most difficult Democratic opponent would be Winter. At this point, Cochran appears to be in a comfortable position in relation to Bowen and Dowdy. The Senate primary in Mississippi is June 5.
