Dear Mr. Baker:

I incorporated this Committee a year ago, acting purely out of belief that the time had come to bring attention to the role of an escalating public debt in inhibiting economic growth.

Recent events propel me now to seek real support for this group, which is in no way related to any other organization. Just before Christmas, the IRS granted tax-exempt status, as an advance determination. On December 31, 1982, the President announced he would donate his Social Security pension to help reduce the public debt. Furthermore, the face cover of IRS Form 1040 contains a paragraph describing how to make contributions to the Bureau of the Public Debt.

Now that this Committee has gained credibility, I believe all the more that the credibility of the idea must be promoted.

History of The American Way

Columbus discovered America in 1492, due to his absolute determination to act on his beliefs. Scorned by the knowledgeable people of the day, who predicted with confidence that he would fall off the edge of the world, Columbus succeeded nonetheless. The pioneers who settled America came by exercise of free will, seeking to build a better life and to fully enjoy the fruits of their labors—be they great or small. The growth of America was never subsidized, but sustained by ambition and will-power.

The American way of life came into existence by the end of the 1700's. The principles of the American way of life were best articulated by Thomas Jefferson, author of the Bill of Rights and our third President. He addressed the nation about several cardinal principles in his first inaugural address in 1801. First he spoke about the need for tolerance, even for those who would destroy liberty: "let them stand undisturbed as monuments of the safety with which error of opinion may be tolerated where reason is left to combat it."

Second, he defined equality and proposed a valid measure of the worth of one's life: "entertaining a due sense of our equal right to the use of our own faculties, to the acquisition of our own industry, to honor and confidence from our fellow citizens, resulting not from birth, but from our actions and their sense of them."

Finally, he offered a definition of a good, wise, and frugal Government, when he said, "Government, which shall restrain men from injuring one another, shall leave them free to regulate their own pursuits of industry and improvement, and shall not take from the mouth of labor the bread it has earned."


The American Way was founded in 1976 by Lloyd V. Temme, Ph.D. as a private undertaking to revive the principles of the American Way which are the source of our greatness. At that time, Dr. Temme made a life-long commitment to develop an organization whose sole purpose is to help Government be more effective. Politically, The American Way shows full respect to the will of the American People, as evidenced in their Presidential elections.

Prior to 1981, the year of the New Beginning and the Reformation of American politics, The American Way's efforts were spurned by many Government officials.

Confident that no obstacle is in fact insurmountable to the American Spirit, The American Way is now dedicated full-time to insuring the success of its Committee to Retire the National Debt and to the public recognition of America's public enemy number one—the strangling debt itself.
