President Ronald Reagan The White House Washington, D.C.

Dear Mr. President;

I was informed that my last letter reached you. I was very happy to hear this. Although I do not want to deluge you with mail, I would like occasionally to inform you of our Collegiate Association for the Research of Principles (CARP) activities.

I was greatly heartened by your Far East trip. Just before you left, CARP took major roles in several rallies in support of the Grenada rescue, the major ones in Los Angeles and Houston. At the Los Angeles rally, General Gordon Sumner, security advisor to the Kissinger Commission on Central America, spoke, and we were grateful for his participation. A few days later, CARP staged a counter rally against the "November 12 Coalition" march in Washington, D.C. We made a strong statement by our action, halting the march for 45 minutes. We felt so indignant, seeing many well-meaning Americans blindly marching with representatives of terrorist groups--some with masks on their faces-just a few days after the bombing of the Capitol building. And then to have Jesse Jackson address the crowd--Mr. President, you truly represent the hope of the Free World. We also had successful counter rallies in Los Angeles and Houston (where we outnumbered the leftists). In all cases, local television coverage was good, although national coverage was less than we had hoped for.

The weekend following that event, CARP sponsored a national level conference, "The End of Communism--A Vision for the Future," in four locations. Through this conference was established a strong basis for a national coalition for victory over Communism.

The coalition is named, tentatively, "International Coalition for World Peace." We seek to unite many anti-Communist groups of more narrow vision (viz., national or ethnic emphasis). Complete information on the conference is presented in the enclosed World Student Times, if you have time to peruse it.

We emphasize that the end of Communism will not come until the West adopts a superior world view, to solve the spiritual and social problems which Communists exploit. This world view must enable the West to <a href="mailto:serve">serve</a>, to invest our wealth and skills wisely for the sake of developing nations. Through this ideal of service for the sake of the world, the Unification Movement has come from being an impoverished, "third world" religious group to having now a position of world wide eminence. I feel confident that this movement, of which CARP is the collegiate branch, will play a large part in bringing world peace.

Our Victory Over Communism conferences will continue, with conferences now planned for January and February, 1984.

Thankyou, Mr. President, for your strong and inspiring leadership. May God's grace and guidance be with you, your family, cabinet members and staff in this joyous season.

Current events around the world are stripping away the communist facade of "worker's paradise" and "peaceful partner." It is apparent that only by brute power do communist regimes maintain control within their borders, and only by violence and military aggression do they expand their influence beyond their borders. Yet acquiescence to this behavior is common in the noncommunist world. This is because of the ignorance of most people concerning the nature and tactics of communism, as well as the fondness of many Western intellectuals for basic tenets of Marxist

Many citizens of the free world see communism only in terms of a military threat. This is a mistake. Others do not see communism as a threat at all, but rather as a viable alternative form of government. This is even more of a mistake. Few citizens of the free world can conceive communism gaining world dominance. This is blindness. Even fewer citizens of the free world can conceive of a world without communism, of "the end of communism."

This is a tragedy.

CARP believes that the fundamental power of communism lies in the persuasiveness of its Marxist-Leninist ideological base. We further feel that Unificationism is the creative counterproposal to this destructive ideology. We offer this conference in order to present an introductory analysis and critique of communism, and to present a positive solution to the problem of communism.




