Dear Pro-Life Friend:

"Ten years is too long! Twelve million are too many!"

Those words ran through my mind, and tore at my heart, as I began to write you this letter.

There are certain facts that I desperately need to tell you. These facts bear directly on whether our struggle to save millions of lives will be successful or can even continue.

But first, I must share with you part of my feelings on the tenth anniversary of that Court decision which plunged our nation into the nightmare of abortion on demand and caused the deaths of twelve million innocent unborn children.

It was exactly 10 years ago on January 22, 1973 that the United States Supreme Court handed down the Roe v. Wade decision which struck down all state and federal laws dealing with abortion and, in effect, legalized abortion on demand for all nine months of pregnancy.

Twelve million is a number the human mind can't really comprehend. Twelve million -- an American holocaust.

All of us are justly concerned about other issues such as war, but...

*Twelve million -- that's twice as many as the number of innocent Jews slaughtered in the Nazi Holocaust...

*Twelve million -- that's ten times as many as the number of Americans killed in all of our wars combined since 1775.

~~For ten years we have worked to stop it. That seems like a long time for those who have toiled and sacrificed for this cause. But it is only a part of our lives, and the children are losing a lifetime!~~

We have made a difference. I know because of all the women who have told us how our efforts made them face the issue and saved their children's lives. Other lives were saved when we passed the Hyde Amendment cutting off the federal funding of Medicaid abortions.

Without the pro-life movement, we wouldn't mourn twelve million. It would be fifteen million, or perhaps twenty million. And without the pro-life movement, the hope we have for the future just wouldn't exist.

No, we haven't won yet. But we haven't lost either.

(over, please)

Last year Senator Orrin Hatch was able to push his Human Life Amendment proposal through the full Senate Judiciary Committee. It was the first time any Human Life Amendment had gotten that far since 1973.

But Planned Parenthood easily bankrolled a \$592,000 "public impact program" to distort the effect of pro-life legislation. The National Organization of Women (NOW) allocated \$300,000 just to lobby against pro-life measures in the Senate, and the National Abortion Rights Action League (NARAL) spent a record amount.

For the first time the pro-life movement felt the full force of the pro-abortion money. We simply didn't have the resources to fully counter with the truth, and our limited funds were stretched even thinner.

Suddenly, "marginally" pro-abortion politicians who had been worried after the 1980 elections felt reassured that pro-abortion money would talk the loudest and that the economy would be the issue in 1982. Senator Hatch wisely assessed the situation and decided to hold off consideration of his Constitutional Amendment by the full Senate until 1983.

On January 26, 1983, Senator Hatch introduced his Amendment in the new Congress. This time it was given the designation S.J. Res. 3.

Subcommittee hearings were held on S.J. Res. 3 in March. In a dramatic move to increase Senate support for the Amendment, the Subcommittee adopted a recommendation made by Senator Thomas Eagleton (Democrat of Missouri) to streamline the original Hatch wording. The revised Amendment, now known as the Hatch/Eagleton Amendment, was passed by the Subcommittee on March 24th and by the full Senate Judiciary Committee on April 29th.

Within the next few weeks the Hatch/Eagleton Amendment will be debated and voted on by the full Senate for the first time since the Supreme Court's 1973 abortion decisions.

THE PRO-ABORTION COMMUNITY IS ALREADY GEARING-UP TO OPPOSE THE NEW AMENDMENT.

The Religious Coalition For Abortion Rights (RCAR) quickly mailed an urgent DISPATCH on March 22 headlined:

NEW AMENDMENT THREAT:
EAGLETON ENTERS FRAY

RCAR urged its members to: "Contact both your Senators" and "Indicate your strong support for the Roe v. Wade decision...and urge their active opposition to any constitutional amendment to overturn Roe including the Eagleton Amendment..."

The pro-abortionists are expected to spend even more money than last year to persuade Senators to oppose a constitutional amendment. We must be ready to meet this challenge!

In 1982, NCHLA's main account was forced to operate at a loss of \$39,000. That wouldn't be much for a major pro-abortion group or clinic. But NCHLA doesn't receive government funds or abortion profits. NCHLA needs gifts from people like you.

We had foreseen extra expense and budgeted ahead from 1981. But our necessary expenses far exceeded early estimates. Now our reserves are gone, bills must be paid and vital projects will be without funding.

I only write to ask your help when there is truly a need. The need has never been more real or urgent.

If we do not receive immediate help we will be forced to cut back our programs across the board. Then we will have no chance to end this holocaust and may lose the gains we have made.

Instead, I am asking you to vote now with your donation to continue the kind of pro-life effort that has made NCHLA one of the most successful right to life groups in the country.

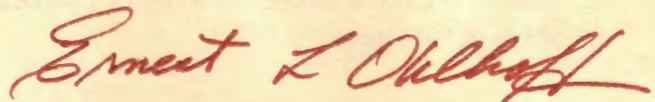
There is much to do. New pro-life legislation must be tried to save additional lives now. The very best effort must be made when Senator Hatch and Senator Eagleton finally force Congress to vote on a Constitutional Amendment. Above all, our educational programs must be expanded now so that the kind of pro-abortion propaganda that stalled the Amendment in 1982 doesn't go unanswered again.

National Committee for a Human Life Amendment, Inc.

On January 22nd, 1973 the United States Supreme Court overturned every state law restricting abortion and effectively legalized abortion-on-demand for all nine months of pregnancy in all fifty states.

The National Committee for a Human Life Amendment (NCHLA), Inc. was formed early in 1974 as a direct response to the Supreme Court's unilateral legalization of unrestricted abortion-on-demand.

Our committee's only goal is to help create a legislative climate conducive to the passage of a Constitutional Amendment which would help restore legal protection to the unborn child.

In support of this goal, our committee realized from the beginning that any effective legislative campaign dealing with a highly controversial issue like abortion would require the direct involvement and support of millions of concerned citizens.

Over the past 8 years, NCHLA has organized and developed grass roots pro-life groups in almost 1/2 of the 435 U.S Congressional Districts. These groups are known as Congressional District Action Committees or CDACs.

The CDAC program represents an intense local effort to identify and involve pro-life citizens in the legislative process. To date we have identified more than 4 million concerned pro-life people through the CDAC Life Roll Card Project.

Specific projects include: letterwriting, meetings with elected officials, candidate and voter education and developing efficient telephone networks.

In addition NCHLA maintains a highly talented lobbying staff to provide ongoing liaison with members of Congress.

NCHLA files quarterly lobbying reports (16-64650-3) with the Secretary of the U.S. Senate and the Clerk of the U.S. House of Representatives. NCHLA is a tax-exempt non-profit corporation under Section 501(c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code. Contributions to such organizations are not tax deductible. NCHLA's corporate finances are continuously reviewed by an independent Certified Public Accountant firm and an annual financial report is reviewed by the Board of Directors.

Title X, Public Health Service Act

Authorization for this program will be before the Congress this year. HSA, HMO and other avenues of funding to Planned Parenthood receive money for use in sex education, promotion of abortion and contraception among minors.

Present funding level: \$164 Million

Title V, Social Security Act

The authorization calls for a minimum of six percent of the funding for this program going directly to family planning services (i.e. contraceptive, abortion, sterilization counselling by PP.) \$357.4 Million presently

We would like to see oversight hearings held on this so as to determine exactly how much money is funneled to Planned Parenthood and other abortion promoters

Title XIX, Social Security Act

Permanent Provision of family planning services is presently required. The implementation of same, however, varies from state to state.

A review of this funding should be requested so that the term "family planning" can be studied as it presently relates to abortion, abortion referral, contraceptives to minors, sex education, etc.

Title XX, Social Security Act

Provision of family planning services is again mandated by law. The present funding ceiling is \$2.9 Billion(FY 81)

A review of this funding would be in order again to determine how much money is actually going to abortion, abortion referral, contraceptives to minors without parental consent, etc.

Title VI of the "Health Services and Centers Act of 1978"

Service groups that enroll in this program must provide contraceptive services as well as at least a referral for abortion according to Dr. Lula Mae Nix, director of Office of Adolescent Pregnancy. This, of course, excludes many fine agencies who do provide care for pregnant teens but DO NOT refer for abortions.

Title VI (continued)	Funding level is presently \$10 Million and this program definitely requires a complete review and assesment.
Title X; Public Health Service Act (Research, population control, etc.)	The program for research under Title X is presently funded at the level of \$79.4 Million. The Center for Population Research is "key" in this funding and is a collaborator with the Planned Parenthood philosophy. A complete review of this program and related programs through NICHD is in order.
Foreign Assistance Act (Section 104)	This Act provides the family planning services and related population programs in the underdeveloped nations. It has been a wholesale promotion of PLANNED PARENTHOOD ideology in the past. Present funding level: \$190 Million A hearing should be held in conjunction with reauthorization this year (1981)
Criminal Code revisions	In 1980, Senator Kennedy was supporting a version of the C.C. revisions which would have allowed contraceptive and abortion materials to be freely mailed via U. S. Post Office, a practice which is presently against the guide of the Criminal Code. This revised version must be stopped if Kennedy tries to promote it again this year.
All Appropriations for: a)Health and Human Services b)Treasury c)Defense Dept, d)District of Columbia e)Foreign Assistance	In the past, the pro-life movement has attached versions of an anti-abortion rider to each of these bills in order to remove tax payer funding from the business of abortion. Again, in 1981, we must be allowed to do this once again or a one-time only version of such an effort (i.e. paramount statute) must be passed that would effectively prohibit the government for all time from paying for abortions and abortion-related services.
Legal Services Corporation (LSC)	The three year authorization for this program ended in Sept. 1980 and a continuing resolution was passed. LSC has always been involved in court cases regarding abortion and always has taken the pro-abortion position. Funding should be restricted so that no LSC attorney can involve himself in ANY abortion or abortion-related case.

DANGER ZONES: Places where Planned Parenthood's philosophy has taken over at tax payer expense:

- (A) International Year of the Child (State Health Plans are coming out with mandated sex ed, contraception for teens w/out parental consent, etc.)
- (B) White House Conference on Families - the follow-up office of families has already taken a pro-abortion posture and anti-parent philosophy
- (C) International Women's Year (Decade conference held in 1980 overseas) -again, and most interesting, women from third world nations complained bitterly about the West's (USA) promotion of abortion in their nations; but the US delegation did not bring this message back to the President.

FINALLY, all Federal Guidelines, Federal Drug Administration reviews of contraceptive drugs (injectible, etc.) must be watched extremely carefully because the tendency of the Government for many years has been to use tax-payer funding to promote a philosophy which is contrary to the Chirstian, Jewish and wholesome American view of the family and the members of that family.

The government should never promote a dangerous drug, chemical or device which is harmful in any way.

The government should not promote areas of health through vehicles like the Health Systems Agency, Health Maintenance Organization, State Health Departments, Regional Offices of HHS, or anywhere which are contradictory to the preservation of the family as we know it today (two or more people related by blood, marriage or adoption.)

Child Health
Assurance Program
(CHAP)

This program was introduced last year and failed simply because there was no desire to bring it to the floor of the Senate. In the House an attempt was made to add a "parental consent" provision so that teenagers could not receive contraceptives without parental approval. This effort failed.

This bill is totally anti-family, and if it comes up again in the 97th Congress, every effort must be made to kill the bill.

Federal Privacy of
Medical Information
Act

This legislation would effectively protect the minor who seeks an abortion or contraceptives without parental knowledge or approval.

If this legislation comes up for a vote, an amendment must be added that would mandate parental involvement in all cases where a minor child (unmarried) would be involved.

Charitable Contributions

If the IRS (C-3) regulations are brought up for complete review, you will find that many abortion clinics and abortion related centers are totally TAX DEDUCTIBLE!

What this means is that the IRS considers abortion a charity.

This matter must be brought up for scrutiny and the regulations must be changed so that abortion clinics, at least, are not viewed by IRS as a "charity".

POPULATION POLICY

Legislation was introduced on January 19, 1981 by Congressman Oettinger of New York that would, if not scrutinized very carefully, place this nation in the position of enforcing a population control policy on its own people as well as those of other nations as the USA seems to set the trend for many nations.

Before GLOBAL2000 IS TAKEN SERIOUSLY, please be certain that a group of pro-population scholars is brought in to testify to the positive side of the issue of whether or not the world is REALLY overpopulated. Such scholars are available upon request.

Forced population control did not work in India and it will not work in any other nation.

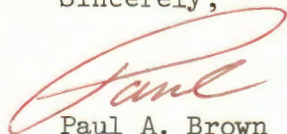
As you are probably aware, I have become embroiled in a controversy.

This nonsense has nothing to do with Mr. Reagan, I did not mention the meeting or the President to the reporter or on WRC, and I sincerely hope that this 'tempest in a teapot' will fade quickly.

I just wanted to drop you a note and let you know that I regret that the meeting at the White House ever came up, and hope that no ill will is reflected on the President as a result of this incident.

file A Woman Is Raped... And the Hurt Goes On

KAREN MULHAUSER is the executive director of the National Abortion Rights Action League. In August of 1978, she was raped at gunpoint in her Capitol Hill home by two men. Her husband was away. Her son was asleep upstairs. Two men later confessed as part of a plea-bargaining deal to raping Mulhauser and two other women. Mulhauser subsequently revealed what had happened to her to members of Congress in testimony designed to dramatize the need for abortion funding for women who become pregnant as a result of rape. "I was determined to make something positive out of this," she told The Los Angeles Times in an article which appeared in February 1980.

A year later, Mulhauser has written a letter to New York magazine saying she feels as if she has been raped again. In this week's issue, she is the victim of a vicious personal attack on her looks, her credibility and therefore her work by Paul Brown, political director of the Life Amendment Political Action Committee. Brown, a member of the conservative coalition that met with President Reagan yesterday, takes the art of discrediting one's opponent to a level that has not been accepted outside of locker rooms in years, in an interview with Michael Kramer, the magazine's national political editor. "You know," Brown said, "I hear that Karen claims she was once raped. Well, let me tell you, Karen is not the most beautiful creature in the world, so when I hear her say she was raped, my response is 'you wish.'"

It is hard to believe that Paul Brown does not know that Karen Mulhauser was raped. Shortly after the Los Angeles Times article appeared, a man named Christian S. White of the American Life Lobby showed up at the sex squad of the D.C. police department. He wanted to talk to Detective Tom Kelly who had investigated the Mulhauser case. White, says Kelly, "was asking a lot of questions and had some knowledge of the case." Kelly, because of the confidential nature of rape cases, said he wasn't answering questions and pointed White to the public record. He also called Mulhauser to let her know what was going on and made her a copy of a memo White showed him.

Judie Brown, president of the American Life Lobby and the wife of Paul Brown, acknowledged writing the memo in a phone interview yesterday. The memo instructs White to find out four things: were two men convicted of the Mulhauser rape, did she have to testify against them, would they have been convicted without her testimony, and "was she even raped." (Italics mine.) The memo contains a reference to another antiabortion worker, with phone number, and concludes: "Please report back to me . . . Please keep this quiet; I want our con-

tact in Los Angeles to have first crack at this because of the LA Times story."

Now you might draw the conclusion from the tone of this memo, that the American Life Lobby was up to something sinister with this kind of behavior. You might even think from its tone that the American Life Lobby was suspicious of Mulhauser's story and might even be out to destroy her credibility. But just as Paul Brown was claiming he was misquoted in New York magazine yesterday, so was his wife coming up with an explanation for her interest in Karen Mulhauser.

According to Judie Brown, the American Life Lobby — which opposes abortion under all circumstances, even when the life of the mother is endangered by the pregnancy — is also concerned these days about treatment of rape victims. According to Judie Brown, White's visit to Kelly "was part of a research project on the whole subject of rape. She just happened to be a case that we knew of in the area and we have a great concern over adequate reporting of rape and adequate protection for rape victims."

"Our position with regard to rape victims is to encourage our supporters to give assistance at the community level so that the victims of rape are made to feel they are loved and can be cared for rather than being made to feel that they themselves have caused the crime to be committed."

"People in the prolife movement are a very caring group of people. . . . If you're going to be prolife you have to be prolife for those people who are already here on earth. That has to include concern for the victims of rape."

Paul Brown is now saying that in the New York interview he was telling a story about a comment another antiabortionist had made about Mulhauser. He won't name that other person. As for Kramer, who stands by the accuracy of his quote, Paul Brown says he is "lying through his teeth."

"Quite frankly," says Paul Brown, "I do not hold Karen Mulhauser in great respect, but I do show compassion and pity for anyone in those circumstances. I do not respect Karen Mulhauser as a human being for her stand on abortion. The fact is she advocates killing."

Judie Brown finds that statement of her husband's "terribly unfortunate. I don't happen to agree with him at all. I think in my Christian opinion she is equal to any other human being who walks the face of the earth. Even though I don't agree with her advocacy of abortion on demand, she is still a human being."

But Paul Brown need not worry about his wife's reaction to his latest appraisal of Karen Mulhauser. He can always say he was misquoted, and besides, that's between them. But Paul Brown and LAPAC have some measure of political importance right now. He was, let us remember, a member of the conservative coalition that met with President Reagan yesterday.

If the president has any concern about maintaining a level of civil decency in the coming abortion battle, he ought to watch the company he keeps.

Anti-abortion group raps CSU law professor as judge

WASHINGTON — An anti-abortion group has sent a telegram to President Reagan opposing Cleveland State University law professor Elizabeth Moody, who is being considered for a federal judgeship in northern Ohio.

The Life Amendment Political Action Committee (LAPAC) said Moody, 47, does not have a prolife philosophy because she is a trustee of a feminist legal group with ties to the proabortion National Organization for Women.

Moody, a Republican under consideration for the U.S. District Court, said she never has taken a position on abortion and denied the

Women's Law Fund of Cleveland has any connection to NOW.

She is a trustee and past president of the Women's Law Fund. She said she has no position on abortion because it is such a complex issue.

Moody, a tenured professor on leave from Cleveland State, was a visiting member of the faculty of George Washington University here until today, when she was to return to Cleveland.

She said she has not been contacted by LAPAC and did not know of its opposition.

Congressman's Son Loses In West Virginia Primary

CHARLESTON, W. Va., June 4 (AP) — State senator Pat Hamilton held an unofficial victory margin of 50 votes over Harry Stagers Jr. when all of the returns from West Virginia's Democratic primary contest in the Second Congressional District were tabulated today.

Mr. Stagers, a 26-year-old lawyer, is the son of Representative Harley O. Stagers, who is retiring after 16 terms.

Results from the district's 710 precincts showed Mr. Hamilton with 35,525 votes and the younger Mr. Stagers with 25,475. Both men had 40 percent of the total vote.

Other Democrats in the race were Joe Cougle of Martinsburg, who finished with an unofficial total of 11,283 votes; Patricia Radloff-Peck of St. George, with 3,130 votes, and St. Allen of Martinsburg, who finished with 1,412 votes.

Women's Groups Warn Democrats They Will Seek Open Convention

WASHINGTON, June 4 — A coalition of women's groups issued a warning to President Carter and the Democratic Party today that it does not consider the party's Presidential nomination settled despite the results of yesterday's primaries. The group said that it would promote an open convention in August and that its support of the party's nominee would depend on a serious commitment to women's rights in the next two months.

Iris Mitgang, chairman of the National Women's Political Caucus, noted that a continuing battle for the nomination would give leverage to women's rights activists seeking concessions from the candidates. "We are elated that the situation turned out as it did last night," she said, referring to Senator Edward M. Kennedy's strong showing in the final round of primaries and his refusal to concede the nomination to President Carter.

In a joint news conference with representatives of the National Abortion Rights Action League, Women U.S.A., the National Council for the Elderly, the National Council for the Handicapped, the Gray Panthers and other organizations, Mrs. Mitgang cited several issues as "bottom line" demands.

List of Demands

These include a commitment to ratify the proposed Federal equal rights amendment, abortion rights, "issues relating to women in the economy and the job force," and appointments of women to policy-making positions in government. She suggested that the Democratic Party should make this year's provision for equal division of delegates between men and women a permanent rule and that the party should henceforth refuse to support any candidate at any level who does not support the equal rights amendment.

"Women are coming into this conven-

tion with a great deal of anger and a lot of demands," said Bella S. Abzug, president of Women U.S.A. "We intend to conduct the fight throughout the convention in committee, and if necessary take our fight to the floor." Mrs. Abzug predicted that women would write around issues this year, rather than automatically endorsing the Democratic nominee, as many feminists have done in the past.

She also called for an open convention, in which delegates would be released to vote for the candidate of their choice on the first ballot. Mrs. Mitgang suggested that women were likely to mount an independent challenge to the proposed rule to bind delegates on the first ballot whether the Kennedy forces did so or not.

Asked whether that meant she considered President Carter an unacceptable choice for the Democratic nomination, she replied: "We have had some problems with his commitments. He has two months until we arrive in New York."

Frequent Criticism of Carter

Feminists have frequently criticized Mr. Carter for allegedly insufficient efforts to win ratification of the equal rights amendment, for refusal to support Federal payments for abortions for poor women and for alleged failure to keep many 1976 campaign promises to women.

Mrs. Mitgang also warned that unless Mr. Carter and the Democratic Party were responsive to women's concerns, "women might choose to sit out this election," with many concentrating instead on electing state legislators who favor the equal rights amendment.

Support for the independent candidacy of Representative John B. Anderson would be another alternative, Mrs. Mitgang said. "Speaking for myself, I am pretty impatient with the Democratic Party," she said. "This year, for the first time, we have another alternative."

Pro-lifers fight prof for judge

WASHINGTON — A national anti-abortion organization is again urging President Reagan to drop consideration of a Cleveland State University law professor for the U.S. District Court in Cleveland.

The Life Amendment Political Action Committee, in a letter to the president, links Lizabeth A. Moody with pro-abortion groups, such as the Women's Equity Action League. The committee sent a telegram to Reagan May 14 saying the GOP platform pledged appointment of federal judges who respect the dignity of human life.

Moody, a Republican and past president of the Women's Law Fund in Cleveland, said that she had not been associated with the league for 10 years, and that the league broke with the National Organization for Women then because it did not want to take a pro-abortion stand.

Moody called the anti-abortion

group's attack irresponsible and said she had strong, personal religious views about abortion. She said she had never given it any real thought from a legal standpoint. Moody said abortion was a complex legal issue, raising questions ranging from whether life begins at conception to whether the federal government should pay for abortions.

The White House will not comment on nominations for federal judges.

THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

SUBJECT: Enforcement of Federal Laws Prohibiting
Discrimination Against the Handicapped

Following the recent death of a handicapped newborn child in Indiana, many have raised the question whether Federal laws protecting the rights of handicapped citizens are being adequately enforced.

Therefore, I am instructing Secretary Schweiker to notify health care providers of the applicability of section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 to the treatment of handicapped patients. That law forbids recipients of Federal funds from withholding from handicapped citizens, simply because they are handicapped, any benefit or service that would ordinarily be provided to persons without handicaps. Regulations under this law specifically prohibit hospitals and other providers of health services receiving Federal assistance from discriminating against the handicapped.

I am also instructing the Attorney General to report to me on the possible application of Federal constitutional and statutory remedies in appropriate circumstances to prevent the withholding from the handicapped of potentially life-saving treatment that would be given as a matter of course to those who are not handicapped.

Our Nation's commitment to equal protection of the law will have little meaning if we deny such protection to those who have not been blessed with the same physical or mental gifts we too often take for granted. I support Federal laws prohibiting discrimination against the handicapped, and remain determined that such laws will be vigorously enforced.

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New Right Comic Book Slings Mud at Kennedy

A New Right group, struggling to find a "new weapon" against liberals, has printed a comic book that pictures Sen. Edward M. Kennedy (D-Mass.) as the overweight black sheep of his family.

The comic, titled "Every Family Has One," is the product of the Life Amendment Political Action Committee (LAPAC), which says it plans to spend \$400,000 in the next few months distributing it to 2 million Massachusetts homes.

Paul Brown, director of LAPAC, a group opposing legalized abortion, is enthusiastic about the project. "There's going to be excitement in Massachusetts like Teddy has never seen before," he said.

Brown said the comic is "a new and different way" to "make people truly look at Kennedy's record." He said he published it after deciding that voters don't read most political brochures and "television ads don't help anybody except the TV stations."

The comic book is sure to outrage Kennedy supporters.

"It's really trash," Kennedy press secretary Bob Shrum said yesterday. "It's the lowest level of propaganda. I find it appalling and hateful."

"They're clearly trying to throw

every hate issue under the sun at us. My own sense is it is so distasteful, so nasty and so distorted that people won't pay any attention to it."

After heaping praise on John F. Kennedy and Robert F. Kennedy, the comic book takes a look at the darker side of their younger brother's past. One page tells how he was suspended from Harvard for cheating on an exam. Another page recounts that he was arrested for speeding violations while a law student at the University of Virginia.

Four pages are devoted to the 1969 Chappaquidick incident, when Mary Jo Kopechne, a campaign worker, drowned in Kennedy's car after it plunged off a bridge after a picnic. "Teddy '82," says one cartoon mimicking a campaign poster. "Put Him Behind the Wheel Again."

Another cartoon figure states: "Teddy isn't like his brothers at all when it comes to character. He seems to feel that he's better than others and should be allowed to get away with things you and I can't do."

It accuses Kennedy of deserting the Roman Catholic Church on the abortion issue, pandering to Communist revolutionaries by voting for foreign aid, being silent about the Irish independence movement (a charge Shrum says is completely false), op-

posing tax cuts and promoting busing as a means of integrating schools.

It also says he voted against cuts in the Comprehensive Education and Training Act (CETA) job program, "billions of which go to left-wing activist groups and convicted felons, welfare protesters, homosexuals, etc."

Near the end of the 38-page comic book, it declares:

"So far, we've determined that . . . Teddy's not like his brothers; he's been involved in some irresponsible and illegal acts; he's for busing our kids all over the lot to satisfy his social ideas; he's driving up our taxes to pay for a bunch of government programs; he's hurt our ability to defend our country . . ."
