

Request for a White House ceremony regarding the National Day of Prayer

Plans are well underway for nationwide activities in connection with the National Day of Prayer -- May 5, 1983. Congress by joint resolution in 1952 requested the President to set aside one day each year for such a national observance. This will be the 31st consecutive year for such an event, although there have been many such national days of prayer in the history of America.

Specific activities have been arranged by private groups, churches, denominations and others independent of the President or Congress. In Washington, D.C. there will be a breakfast at the Mayflower for denominational and other leaders. That evening at Constitution Hall. there will be a major event for the public. (A sample invitation is attached.)

Every governor and the mayor of each city of over 50,000 population has been invited to be a part of this important day.

We would encourage the President and Mrs. Reagan to attend the evening ceremony at Constitution Hall. The Navy Band and other musical groups will perform. Reverend Lloyd Olgivie, Senior Pastor of Hollywood Presbyterian Church, will be the main speaker. It will be an ecumenical service of Catholics, Protestants, Jewish and Greek Orthodox participation.

Equally important would be a midday event in the Rose Garden or the Oval Office. A group of private citizens have joined together, raised the money and have had printed 2000 copies of "the New King James Bible" with the preface written by Ronald Reagan. Attached is the wording. There is no presidential seal nor identification of him as President 500 of these are for his personal use as gifts, which we can make on his behalf if he so desires. The other 1500 are for other governmental leaders. The publisher has promised not to exploit this for commercial purposes.

We would like to present the President with his copy on May 5. It would be the first event of the Year of the Bible, of which the President is the Honorary Chairman, as well as the media event of the National Day of Prayer. If the event were in the Rose Garden, the 200 denominational and other religious leaders who will be here anyway could be invited. If it were to be in the Oval Office, then Bill Bright — the National Chairman of the Year of the Bible, Vonette Bright and Herb Ellingwood — the Co-chairmen of the National Day of Prayer, and the small committee that raised the funds for the printing of the Bible could be the invitees.

Enclosed for your information is a copy of the preface done in 1941 by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in New Testaments distributed to members of the armed forces that was printed and distributed at government expense.

For planning purposes, we need to know as soon as possible what the President's schedule will be. We will be happy to assist in preparing a total proposed program for the White House ceremony and to cooperate with security for the event at Constitution Hall.

BACKGROUND:

Thursday, May 5 will be the country's 31st consecutive National Day of Prayer. Observances of this day date back to 1775 and have been declared from time to time since. In 1952, Congress established a National Day of Prayer to be held on an annual basis. It has been requested that the President be Honorary Chairman.

The gathering on the evening of May 5 will be the culmination of events being held across the country in honor of the day. American churches, synagogues, and public buildings are being asked to ring their bells at noon on May 5 in recognition of the day and all citizens are being encouraged to "Take 5 at 12" (five minutes of prayer at noon.)

The gathering will be a combination of scripture readings, prayer, and music led by religious leaders of the Catholic, Protestant, Greek Orthodox, and Jewish faiths, as well as such notables as Pat Boone and Efrem Zimbalist, Jr.

During this event, a new King James Bible will be presented to the President in honor of the Year of the Bible, which the President is Honorary Chairman. 2,000 copies have been printed of this limited edition. The President has written the preface. A group of private citizens raised the money for this Bible and the publisher has promised not to use it for commercial purposes. 500 copies will be made available to the President for his own personal use and the remainder will be given to other governmental leaders.



Dear President and Mrs. Reagan:

The purpose of our letter is respectfully to request that you serve as honorary chairmen of what we believe will be the most significant single event scheduled in connection with the upcoming National Day of Prayer. The event to which we refer is the "celebration of prayer" on the evening of Thursday, May 5, at Constitution Hall in Washington.

We are among millions of Americans across the nation who very deeply appreciate not only the recent proclamations of the Day of Prayer and Year of the Bible but also the example of spiritual and moral leadership that you both live out so beautifully and consistently before the country. We were particularly grateful for the fact that the proclamation designating the date for the thirty-first consecutive National Day of Prayer was issued early in the year, providing time both to make this important observance widely known and to plan appropriate events implementing the proclamation's call to united prayer.

The evening at Constitution Hall on May 5 is such an event. It is being planned by a volunteer committee, chaired by us and consisting of persons from various parts of the nation whose ministries lie especially in the area of prayer and who have seen, as you have, the difference that prayer can make in lives and circumstances.

Naturally, many other ways of observing the National Day of Prayer are also being planned. For instance, an especially strong effort will be made to urge all Americans to join in prayer for the nation from 12 noon to 12:05 p.m. on May 5, after being alerted by the widespread ringing of church bells at noon. addition, we expect many state-level and local-level proclamations, prayer breakfasts, and other activities.

In a symbolic sense, however, we plan for the many other National Day of Prayer observances to culminate in the evening's "celebration of prayer" at Constitution Hall. An excellent program is being developed which will be both spiritual and patriotic in tone. Prayer itself will, of course, be a major emphasis. A principal address will be delivered by Dr. Lloyd Ogilvie, the distinguished senior pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Hollywood, and there will be complementary music of appropriate character and high quality. The compittee is keeping in close touch with Morton Blackwell as the plans take shape.

A number of well-known and highly-respected government, business, and church eaders will be asked to host the Constitution Hall event, and we should be most leeply honored if you, as the nation's First Family, would be willing to serve as the evening's honorary chairmen. Should it not be possible for both of you to serve, is it possible that at least Mrs. Reagan would consent to be our honorary chairman?

Constitution Hall will, we believe, be filled to capacity that evening. We are hopeful that the celebration of prayer will prove to be a dramatic occation which will reach much of the nation. In impact, we pray that it will help bring healing, and renewed inspiration and vision for what God would have America become. Your participation as chairmen--or, in the case of Mrs. Reagan alone, as chairman--would clearly bring a unique dimension to all that could otherwise be done.

Naturally, we would also be deeply pleased and honored if you could actually attend the event and take part in it. Even if other commitments made it impossible for you to attend, however, we would be most appreciative if you could serve as the evening's chairmen, or chairman.

You are much prayed for, and greatly loved and appreciated. Thank you for our consideration of this request.

I just had a call from Ed Meese asking me about the National Day of Prayer.

Attached is a letter to the President from Mrs. Bill Bright and Herb Ellingwood. Bill Bright is head of Campus Crusade for Christ, and Herb Ellingwood is a senior Reaganite from California, who is Chairman of the U. S. Merit Systems Protection Board.

Mr. Meese said he would like to expedite a favorable decision on the request that the President serve as Honorary Chairman for the Celebration of Prayer on the evening of Thursday, May 5, at Constitution Hall.

Mr. Meese requested that you take this up with him, Mr. Deaver, and Mr. Baker immediately after Senior Staff meeting. He said he would vigorously support the President's serving as Honorary Chairman.

He was undecided as to whether or not we should strongly recommend that the President attend the event but emphatic that he thought the President should accept the invitation to be Honorary Chairman.

As you may know, the President is already Honorary Chairman of the Committee for observing 1983 as Year of the Bible. This committee was organized by Dr. Bill Bright.



NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER

National days of prayer have been part of our country's heritage since the first one was declared by the Continental Congress in 1775. Through the years other national days of prayer have been declared. Then in 1952, by joint approval, the two houses of Congress called upon the President to set aside a suitable day each year as a National Day of Prayer. This year will be the 31st consecutive observance.

In spite of its decades of history, until very recent years the National Day of Prayer has often seemed to occur with little or no advance notice to the public: The media largely ignore it, the government takes brief note of it, few churches observe it, and the day and its meaning are mostly forgotten until the next year.



This year the observance of the National Day of Prayer will be different. On January 27, President Reagan proclaimed Thursday, May 5, as the 1983 National Day of Prayer, giving us enough advance notice to alert the public to this national call to prayer.

A National Prayer Committee already has plans underway to coordinate nationwide participation in the Day of Prayer in line with the theme, "Five at Twelve." The committee is urging that at 12 noon on May 5, bells be rung in churches and public buildings in every community, calling Americans to five minutes of unified prayer for our nation.

Plans also call for federal, state and local endorsement of the National Day of Prayer, with appropriate observances of many kinds.

The plans will include a national celebration at Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C., to acknowledge our dependence upon God, give thanks to Him for His blessings to the United States and its people through the years, and intercede with Him for the nation and its leaders. It is also anticipated that prayer services and other events at both the state and the city levels will be scheduled.

Please do all that you can to help draw America together on May 5 in a spirit of united prayer!



Dear Rev. Pike:

I have your letter of January 25 requesting that we invite six people to a proclamation signing for the National Day of Prayer. As we notified you last week by phone, there will be no signing ceremony for the proclamation this year. The President is signing the proclamation declaring 1983 as Year of the Bible at the conclusion of his remarks to the National Prayer Breakfast on February 3.

As I mentioned to you in our recent telephone conversation, we have had a number of telephone calls and some correspondence from people who had the mistaken impression that you have been designated by the President to coordinate activities regarding the National Day of Prayer. This is, of course, not so.

The President is pleased to know that a number of different organizations at the national level and thousands of religious leaders at the local level undertake appropriate activities relating to the annual National Day of Prayer.

Because of the unfortunate confusion regarding the relationship between your scheduled activities and the White House, I must reiterate the importance of your making it very clear in all future communications relating to the National Day of Prayer that you are acting in your capacity as a religious leader and not as an agent of the White House.

The National Day of Prayer Committee will also be holding its 1983 planning sessions at the Sheraton Washington Hotel during the week of Feb. 1. We invite your organization to share with us, at modest cost, in a National Day of Prayer exhibit booth and discussion with national leaders of ideas and plans for the observance of National Day of Prayer this year.

While we cannot guarantee that the President will be able to invite every individual or organization whose name we might recommend for an invitation to White House ceremonies concerning the National Day of Prayer, you may be sure that your communication will be called to his attention and that you will help to guarantee wide publicity for the impressive ceremonies he will undoubtedly hold.

We certainly hope you will contact us immediately by mail or phone so that we can work together effectively to promote nation-wide observance of the National Day of Prayer on May 5.
