SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES

Three radio interviews with Kansas and Missouri stations commenting on the issues the President touched on his remarks there Thursday.

RED FLAGS:

- . The Conservative and Pro-Family groups are concerned at reports that Senator Baker will switch his position and attempt to strip the Debt Limitation Bill of pro-life and pro-school prayer amendments. Special concern that White House won't fight against Baker's retreat.
- . Conservative organizations, encouraged by Senator Gordon Humphrey and Congressman Vin Weber, have decided to oppose Clinch River Breeder Reactor, now convinced it is a mammoth boondoggle supported by the Administration only because it is in the Senate Majority Leader's home state.

3. Tuition Tax Credit coalition showing strains because of the failure of the US Catholic Conference to deliver any Senators' votes in the President's proposed Tuition Tax Credit Bill.
4. Tax limitation coalition worried that the administration is doing nothing to get additional signatures needed on the House of Representatives discharge petition on the Balanced Budget constitutional amendment.
