Dear Mrs. Dole,

Mr. Williams is presently making every effort to schedule a meeting with President Ronald Reagan in June 1981. He is very anxious to renew his ties with the President and foremost is his desire to bring together two great men, President Ronald Reagan and the President of the Soka Gakkai Internation Daisaku Ikeda.

Mr. Ikeda is a world religious leader whose life is dedicated to the cause of world peace. In his travels throughout the world he has developed close and friendly ties with the heads of state of many countries, especially with Red China and the Soviet Union. Mr. Ikeda would be more than happy to share his knowledge of these countries with the President and would not hesitate to assist the United States of America in its desire for world peace.

Dear Kathy:

It was a most pleasant surprise to hear you over the phone. Both Mrs Leidecker and myself are happy to know that you are holding high the torch for the Republicans.

I am enclosing some preliminary information on the Vishwa Hindu Parishad. Some more inside information will reach you shortly, for I presume that is what you would like to have.

My files on Hindu organizations are not too well kept because I have been devoting more time to Buddhism. In fact, I am engaged in writing or, rather, expanding the History of the Friends of Buddhism as first published by the U.S. Information Agency as a USIS Feature in 1960, with less narrative and more fact. I just today finished xeroxing the parts "Officers" and "Thirty Years of Wesak (Vaisakha) Celebrations of the Friends of Buddhism." I am sending copies for your files if they are of any use to you.

What I have been interested recently is the development of Buddhism in the Russian-Mongolian and generally Asian perimeter with regard to policies in the countries concerned. I gave a little talk on "The Peace Offensive of Buddhism" on February 7 last year, barely hinting the seriousness and insidiousness of the Soviet-inspired propaganda and activity. Thinking that you might possibly be interested in this also I have been searching high and low for a copy without success thus far -- a sad admission from one who loves system and order! I know I sent a copy to my friends, Congressman J. Kenneth Robinson about that time intending to expand on the theme with my experience in back when I was in SE Asia.

My Thomas Jefferson Institute for the Study of Religious Freedom takes up much of my time. I was surprised at the number of new members we acquired this year.

Notes on the Vishwa Hindu Parishad

The national conference in July in Los Angeles is the 9th they have held in the United States. The previous one was held in Baton Rouge.

It is an international cultural organization with tax exempt status, being primarily religious. Lay people belong to it and run it. Only occasionally members of the clergy, Swamis, address it. There is virtually no ritual and the devotions are mainly private. They claim to be in line with the traditions of the Vedas and have an ecumenical outlook so far as other religions are concerned.

They put the emphasis on children under 16 years of age and organize two week Summer camps for them.

There are many chapters, more than 12 in New York City alone.
