

U.S. has strayed from God, President tells leaders

WASHINGTON (BP)— Saying the United States is a nation "set aside" by God, President Reagan told some 3,000 governmental and religious leaders at the National Prayer Breakfast in Washington that the nation has nevertheless "strayed from God, as evidenced by Supreme Court rulings on school prayer and abortion."

Following a brief reference to the unsuccessful attempt on his life last March 31 and his conviction that "whatever days are left to me belong" to God, Reagan declared: "I also believe this blessed land was set apart in a very special way, a country created by men and women who came here not in search of gold, but in search of God. They would be free people, living under the law with faith in their Maker and their futures.

"Sometimes, it seems we've strayed from that noble beginning, from our conviction that standards of right and wrong do exist and must be lived up to. God, the Source of our knowledge, has been expelled from the classroom. He gives us His great blessing, life, and yet many would condone the taking of innocent life. We expect Him to protect us in a crisis but turn away from Him too often in our day-today living. I wonder if He isn't waiting for us to wake up."

Reagan recalled his first appearance a year ago at the prayer breakfast, held annually at the Washington Hilton Hotel.

Dr. James E. Johnson presently resides in the Washington Metropolitan area. He was born in Madison, Illinois, and as a youth in a Chicago ghetto led a Boy Scout "war", peacefully deterring his peers from submitting to the pressures of street gangs. During twenty-one years in the Marines and subsequent years in Pentagon administration, he helped break the bonds of racial segregation in the United States Military.

Dr. Johnson is a patriot who is fiercely loyal to his country and his ideals and a remarkably gifted public servant. He entered the Marine Corps in 1944 and rose to the rank of Commissioned Warrant Officer, retiring in 1965. He entered the insurance business joining the Prudential Life Insurance Company. During the first two and one half months with the firm he sold 1.5 million dollars in insurance.

Dr. Johnson has earned degrees from Union University of Los Angeles, California; San Diego University, San Diego, California; Frostburg College, Frostburg, Maryland; George Washington University, Washington, D.C.; Santa Ana College, Santa Ana, California. Dr. Johnson also attended Chapman College, Calif.; Maryland University, and U.S.I.U., San Diego, California. He has been granted a Doctor of Divinity degree (honorarius causus) from Melodyland School of Divinity, Anaheim, California; and has a Military Law degree from the Naval Justice School in DelMar, California.

In 1967 the then-Governor of the State of California, Ronald Reagan, appointed Dr. Johnson as Director of the California State Department of Veterans' Affairs.

In. 1969 the then-President of the United States, Richard M. Nixon, appointed Dr. Johnson as Vice Chairman of the U. S. Civil Service Commission.

In 1971 the then-President of the United States, Richard M. Nixon, appointed Dr. Johnson as the Asst. Secretary of the Navy. Following that he served as an Assistant to President Ford on special assignments, and as an adviser to the Government Affairs Committee on the Hill. As the Asst. Secretary of the Navy he served under then-Secretary of the Navy, John Warner. Dr. Johnson has received over 1,000 awards and citations during the last 28 years, and upon leaving the Department of the Navy, he received the highest Medal of Commendation that has ever been given to an executive level person.

Dr. Johnson is presently author, world traveler and lecturer. He is the Dean of Golden State University of Los Angeles, Graduate School, External Program of the East Coast area. He is a Financial Management Consultant with offices at 499 So. Capitol Street Southwest, in Washington, D. C. His book BEYOND DEFEAT is a moving autobiography.

Johnson, Ph.D., has recently served as a Vice President of the Full Gospel Business Men's Fellowship International--he is presently serving as an International Director and the Chairman of the Washington area Regional Convention; serves on the Board of Trustees, Frontiers International, Washington, D. C.; Board of Trustees of Tom Skinner Associates, NYC; Board of Leadership Ministries International; Maranatha Ministries International, Christian Voice Magazine, and serves on the Executive Board of the Boy Scouts of America as a Vice President of the BSA. 

"ARISE, SHINE for your Light is come. . . and nations shall come to your light."

Isaiah 60:1,3.

Sunrise, the symbol of a new day. Yet for many people of this world, there is so little light. Now is the time to share the light you have received through your knowledge of God in Christ with people who hunger for a better way, a life brightened by the radiance of Christ.

We believe Christ to be the light of our lives. We must take a brave step into a whole new world, a world seen through the eyes of Christ. By letting His compassion, love and healing shine as we share the talents God has given us, we can clear away the darkness that afflicts so many and help them come to the Light.

Several hundred CSC Volunteers can testify to the impact on their own lives of sharing the Light. They return with new values and a new appreciation of the work of God's Spirit among all peoples and cultures. It is time to rise and shine and give God the opportunity to teach us, use us and mold us as we let our light shine.





WHY A CHRISTIAN PEACE CORPS?

The Christian Service Corps in 1965 was formed to provide a way for skilled Christians from the United States and Canada to serve and strengthen the work of the church in less developed parts of the nation and the world. The original idea of the "Corps" came from the Peace Corps. The Corps connects skilled Christian Volunteers with organizations which have expressed needs for personnel assistance to further their outreach. The assignment is for thirty months: a six-week training program prior to assignment (plus twelve weeks of language training if needed), two years on the field, and a three-month readjustment period upon return. The volunteers are skilled Christian men and women from 18 to 70 years of age, who share their faith as they use their skills to help others help themselves in the spiritual and physical dimensions of life.



During the past 150 years, the Christian community has felt a deep responsibility to send representatives to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ worldwide. In the closing years of the 20th century, a casual glance at a daily newspaper will tell you how urgently the Gospel needs to be heard and followed. As the world has drastically changed, so has missions. The old cherished ideas and commonly held steorotypes have given way as contemporary missionaries are committed to use every available tool to communicate the undeniable love of Jesus. Today's missionaries are as likely to be television engineers, printers, medical technicians, or hospital administrators, construction workers, radio broadcasters, teachers, or dieticians as they are to be pastors or evangelists.

As a CSC Volunteer you have the privilege to be a part of this Christian community going out as a concerned, dedicated and involved layperson. The battle for souls and the religious, cultural, political and material difficulties that bind them can best be fought in the field and not in the comfortable church pews of America. You will be using the abilities that God has given you as you work to alleviate the disease, poverty and ignorance that affect billions. It may be difficult for you to measure the impact of your efforts but the Lord will indeed work within you as you work to minister in His name.



The Corps — A Brief History

In 1963, Robert N. Meyers, then a Presbyterian pastor in Philadelphia questioned why the church was not utilizing short-term skilled personnel in a way similar to the Peace Corps. He felt that many more people could be recruited and placed than were then being utilized by the mission agencies and presented this idea in an article entitled, "Why Not a Christian Peace Corps?" which was published in the July 17, 1964 issue of "Christianity Today." The response to this article led him to establish an office in Washington, D.C. in November 1964. The first CSC Volunteer, a teacher from Buffalo, New York, was placed in Colombia in September, 1966. The first married couple went to Mexico in December, 1966 and served as houseparents with the Wycliffe Bible Translators.

A steady stream of volunteers followed with training classes being held several times a year. The Corps began in rented facilities in the inner city of Washington. 1974 saw the purchase of a hotel on 16th Street, nine blocks north of the White House for training and office headquarters. Adjacent buildings were acquired for housing of staff and trainees and the upper floors of the Christian Inn were operated for the public. By the late 1970's over five hundred volunteers had served with over one hundred mission agencies in fifty nations of the world. Many lives have been changed and many lives will continue to be enriched by this experience of putting ones faith into *action* at home and abroad.

The Christian Service Corps wants every Christian to consider God's call "to the uttermost parts of the earth." Serving and witnessing for a two and a half year period can make a significant impact for Christ in combatting physical distress and spiritual emptiness. Not to be overlooked is the exciting difference the experience makes in the life of the volunteer.

The Corps is an associate member of the Evangelical Foreign Missions Association (E.F.M.A.) of the National Association of Evangelicals.

What Are The Requirements For Your Acceptance as a CSC Volunteer?

a. It is necessary that you be a committed Christian between the ages of 18 and 70 who desires to share your faith and skills with others. You must subscribe to the following statement of faith:

"The Christian Service Corps believes in one God, who reveals Himself as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Jesus Christ is God in the flesh and both Lord and Saviour, as taught in the Holy Scriptures, which are the only inspired and authoritative Word of God. Man is a sinner, lost and in need of a Saviour who is Jesus Christ. It is necessary for salvation that Jesus Christ, who made complete atonement for man's sin, be received by faith."

b. You must have an occupation or skill. Some assignments require people with highly developed skills and higher education, but many assignments go unfilled that can be met by people who are willing to serve and use their hands to help others. We do not set specific academic requirements although the receiving agencies often do have their own standards for certain tasks. Please refer to the skills list for a more detailed list of the many skills that are needed. c. You need a personality that enables you to work well with others. Adaptability, flexibility and the willingness to put others' needs before your own are also important.

d. You should be in good health. A physical examination is required. Candidates who are handicapped are given every consideration.

e. You must be willing to live in a way that identifies with the people you serve. You may find yourself in a rural community, a capital city, a coastal village or a mountain retreat. But no matter where you will be living and working, your housing will be unpretentious but adequate.

How Do You Apply to the CSC?


Carefully fill out the application form which we provide. Husbands and wives each complete an application and serve together. There is an application fee of \$15 for a single person and \$25 for a couple. As part of the selection process, we will arrange for a personal interview either at our headquarters or with a returned CSC Volunteer in your area. The purpose of the interview is to provide you full information on the procedures and workings of the Corps and to evaluate your qualifications and motivation for service.

What About Families and Children?

Many CSC volunteers have been husband and wife teams, some with children. Both volunteers should have a skill and will be expected to serve with appropriate adjustments made in the wife's schedule if there are young children. Children accompany their parents and arrangements for schooling are agreed upon prior to training. Our recommendation is that CSC volunteers not plan to start a family or have additional children in order to be able to concentrate more fully on their assignment.

How Are CSC Assignments Made?

Following your acceptance as a candidate and your affirmation that you wish to proceed, your resume will be sent to a number of mission boards, Christian institutions, or indigenous church organizations. The Corps has developed contacts with over 1000 mission agencies and diligently seeks an assignment that is suited to your preferences and skills. Indications of interest from missions will be forwarded to you for your prayerful consideration. The placement staff is available to answer your questions and guide you as you consider the various choices. Once you decide where you want to go, we contact the receiving agency and ask for confirmation of your assignment.



Does CSC Accept Divorced People?

Yes. Divorced persons will be asked to explain the circumstances of their divorce and their understanding of Biblical teachings on the subject. Each case is considered on an individual basis.

PLACEMENT PROCESS

How Is Your CSC Assignment Financed?

The Christian Service Corps is an interdenominational faith mission agency, dependent upon the provision of God's people for the furtherance of its ministry.

Before you come for training, we assist you in the process of raising pledges and gifts to cover the projected costs of your assignment. We ask the receiving agency to make whatever provision it can, such as room and board or a stipend, and take this into account in arriving at your monthly budget figure. You will live in a modest manner on the field seeking to fit in with the lifestyle of the local people as far as possible. We will send out letters with a description of your assignment to your friends, relatives and church inviting them to participate with you through monthly pledges and gifts. We will provide orientation, audio-visual materials and other helps to facilitate the task of raising finances for your assignment.

What Is The Role of a Volunteer's Home Church In the Assignment?

We trust that your home church will play a major role in encouraging and assisting you. As Paul and Barnabas were set apart and commissioned by the elders in Antioch, so the local church should provide the impetus, counsel and guidance for people to step out and become involved directly in mission work. We require that each applicant consult with his or her pastor and involve the church as much as possible in the whole process of becoming a CSC volunteer. Your service may be the first opportunity a church has had to share personally in the ministry of a missionary. Thus, you should explain the work you will be doing and the financial needs. A CSC staff person will also contact your pastor and discuss how the church can help. We do not seek to be in competition with the local church, and wish to work within its structure. Some churches have totally underwritten a volunteer's support, others have made appropriations from their missions budget on a monthly basis, others encourage their members to give individually.



What Items Are Covered In A Volunteer's Budget?

Your round-trip transportation from your home to CSC and your field assignment; your living allowance for room and board, personal needs, local transportation, clothing and other necessary expenses; medical, life and liability insurance; readjustment allowance; contingency fund, reserve for lapsed funds. In addition, training costs, recruitment, and administrative costs are included since the CSC is not endowed or underwritten by any one source of funding. At the time your assignment is confirmed, your monthly budget will be set up and explained to you.

How Are The Volunteer's Finances Administered?

The support designated for the volunteer's budget is received, receipted and disbursed by the Christian Service Corps. A separate record is maintained on the financial status of each volunteer, both income and outgo. Final accounting is made at the conclusion of the assignment. If there is any surplus, it is used to help other volunteers and in the general program of the Corps. If due to increased costs or dropoffs in pledges, receipts do not cover the costs, we will work with the volunteer to raise additional funds in the last months of the assignment.

What Are The Goals of the Training Program?

The training program is designed to prepare you for service spiritually, emotionally and intellectually. The philosophy of the training department is to strengthen your relationship with Christ by preparing you to meet the pressures of working under difficult conditions and teaching you how to minister to those who may be struggling in their Christian walk. Three basic disciplines of the Christian life are emphasized: prayer, Bible study and sharing the faith. We prepare you to work cooperatively with co-workers in the spread of the Gospel by emphasizing scriptural principles of interpersonal relationships. You will study the geographical, political, cultural and religious settings of your assignment and prepare a research paper which will also set forth your personal objectives on your assignment. You will receive intensive language study for 12 weeks if your assignment will be in a country where a foreign language is spoken.

What Do Mission Leaders Say About The CSC Training Program?

Elwin Palmer, U.S. Director of the Worldwide Evangelization Crusade says:

"Our experience with CSC workers suggests that they are well trained for the specific ministry they will be fulfilling and highly motivated for such a task. Our appreciation for the training and preparation goes beyond the specific ministry orientation; we have found that the general outlook of CSC workers has been highly commendable in that they are prepared to give themselves to the task without getting sidetracked on issues that could well render them ineffective and even result in their causing heartache and disappointment to the mission with whom they are serving."

Norman Dietsch, Overseas Director of the Liebenzell Mission, USA, Inc., with whom a number of volunteers have served in Micronesia:


"We have found each volunteer prepared to deal with the rigors of service overseas. Each was well adjusted personally, had a sense of God's presence in his or her life, and related well to nationals and the national church, and to missionaries and the mission society. As one national teacher expressed it about a CSC couple some years ago: 'For us they are Mr. and Mrs. Right!' Outstanding I think, has been their attitude of cooperation and service without murmering, while having initiative and good self-motivation. I don't want to sound as if they are perfect, but for us each measured up to our expectations. We are thankful."

To Whom Is The Volunteer Responsible On The Field?

As a CSC Volunteer, you are loaned or "seconded" to the receiving mission by the Christian Service Corps, and are directly responsible to the receiving agency in relation to your work responsibilities.

What Are Some of the Services The CSC Performs For You While You Are On The Field?

The Field Division assumes responsibility for you at the conclusion of training. We will assist you with visa and travel arrangements, and correspond with you on the field regularly. Your living allowance will be enclosed with a monthly newsletter unless other banking arrangements are recommended. We will prepare, print and mail your prayer letters to the people back home. If you have any questions or problems, you will find the Field Division ready to assist you with counsel and encouragement. We will process any medical bills and insurance claims and forward designated personal gifts to you.



What Type of Insurance Does CSC Carry On Volunteers?

We carry two plans, one for U.S. based personnel and one for overseas people. Both plans have \$5,000 life insurance, plus medical and hospital coverage. Costs not covered by the plans for allowable expenses are met out of the volunteer's contingency fund.

What Do Some Volunteers Say About Their Experiences In The Christian Service Corps?

Gordon and Roxanne Engebretsen served in Zambia with the Africa Evangelical Fellowship. Gordon says:

"My time spent in the Corps was the most rewarding and fulfilling time in my life. I enjoyed meeting people's needs in the context of spreading the gospel of Christ. It was a time when I grew much closer in my relationship with my Lord. Missionary and national friends were a great help in pointing out areas that needed improvement in my life or demonstrating what a committed Christian is."

Wilhelmina Van Krieken taught at Drewstown House, County Meath, Ireland under World Missions to Children and said:

"For me the Corps was an excellent means to be God's vessel for two years in Ireland. I felt financially secure, genuinely supported as a member of the Body of Christ, and in regular contact with sponsors and friends through sending out my prayer letters. There's a great God working in and through the Corps."

For 44 years, Dr. Irvin Wills was on the faculty of John Brown University, Siloam Springs, Arkansas and head of the Natural Science Division for many years. His wife, Ruth, taught music and English there. He writes:

"The Christian Service Corps was willing to take a chance on us, a couple whose combined ages totaled nearly 140 years. We spent our three years in a teaching assignment at the Iona Schools of Jamaica, a work founded and carried on by Dr. and Mrs. Herbert Swaby. We don't say that these years were a bed of roses, for that would be rather uninteresting and untruthful. But we left with a host of dear friends, many of whom we still correspond with, and all of whom we still pray for. We thank God for giving us this experience."

What Is The Purpose of the Readjustment Period At the Conclusion of Your Term?

This three-month period is designed to provide you time to adjust to reentry into the U.S. and deal with culture shock if you have served overseas or in a deprived area of the U.S. It is a time to assess your experience by reflection and reporting to the staff who have helped sustain you on the field. This period also permits some flexibility if the receiving agency requests you to stay for an extra month or two. Following a time of rest and recuperation, during which you will receive medical checkups and time to prepare your slide presentation, you will help in the work of the Corps where most needed. We try to utilize your skills in the best way. The Public Relations Department will also work with you on plans for sharing your experience with your sponsors and setting up some speaking engagements in the Washington area. Part of your readjustment period may be spent recruiting for CSC on college campuses, in churches or in your home area. You will also have time to look for a job and make preparations for the next venture in your life.





What Are Some Options After Your Term Is Completed?

If your mission is willing, you may extend your term for an additional year or so continuing under the Christian Service Corps. Arrangements are made with sponsors to continue financial support. and this may be handled without your returning home. You may sign up for another two-year term with the same or another mission under CSC. (One volunteer served two years in Guatemala and two years in Nepal!) You may wish to affiliate directly with the mission board you have served or obtain further education to meet the requirements of the mission for career status. You may serve on the staff of the Christian Service Corps. Or you may return home to employment and activities you held prior to Corps service enriched and enlightened by your experience as a CSC volunteer, better able to minister to the needs of others and share the needs of the mission field with your friends and home church.

The opportunities for service are endless. The need for workers is great. The challenge was given by our Lord Himself, when He said, "Go . . . and make disciples . . ."


