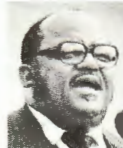

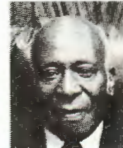

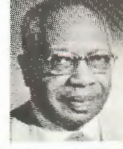

REQUEST: Remarks at Washington for Jesus Planning Conference

PURPOSE: To meet with extremely large, cross-denominational group completely supportive of the President here to plan for 1984 WFJ Rally. Since the tuition tax credit was announced to a large Catholic group to which the President travelled, it seems appropriate that he should announce the proposed Constitutional Amendment on school prayer to this group which is gathered to encourage prayer for our nation and its leaders.

BACKGROUND: In 1980 WFJ brought approximately 500,000 Christians to Washington to fast and pray for our leaders and our country. This group includes every race, denomination, tradition, age, and geographical location. Among its sponsors are the Washington Council of Churches, leaders of several large Hispanic and black groups, with Dr. Bill Bright, Campus Crusade, and Dr. Pat Robertson, CBN, as co-chairmen of the program. Featured speaker at the evening session, Dr. Adrian Rogers, is past president of Southern Baptist Convention. District host is Bishop Smallwood Williams, Moral Majority. Other black leaders include Dr. E. V. Hill and Bishop J. O. Patterson, head of the Church of God in Christ, which has 4 million members. Unique aspect of this group is that all are enthusiastic supporters of the President and are involved on a regular basis in prayer for him and the nation.

PREVIOUS PARTICIPATION: Carter invited a very few leaders into the Rose Garden but did not participate in any other way.

DATE: April 29, 1982

LOCATION: D. C. Armory Hall

PARTICIPANTS: At least 6,000 Christian leaders and intercessors (they expect 10,000).

OUTLINE OF EVENT: Morning session on Christian heritage of America with history of founding documents and examples of erosion of these religious freedoms, concluding with court cases and talks by lawyers on how each freedom has been weakened or eliminated. Evening is worship.

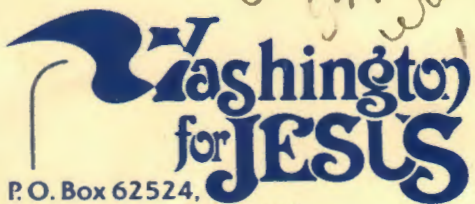

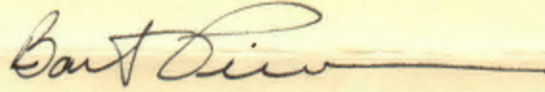
The National Christian Youth Leader's Conference will be held on April 28 at Bible Way Temple at 1130 New Jersey Avenue, N.W. Could you greet those in

I have looked into the background of this group. They are a legitimate group with a wide following in the fundamentalist community. They are usually characterized as charismatics.

These people are generally a bit more politically active than even the independent-Baptist-oriented clergy who are closer theologically to Dr. Jerry Falwell.

This will be a very large and enthusiastic meeting of people who overwhelmingly are supporters of the President.

I recommend this as a good occasion for the announcement of a major presidential initiative on behalf of a voluntary prayer amendment.

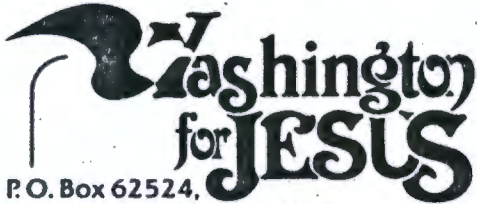
The remarks, whether delivered by the President or a representative, would have to make it clear that this is an effort with broad support across all denominational lines.

It would be an excellent media event and would wind up with all the enthusiasm generally expected at a political rally.

If we can agree on the wording of an amendment to support, I would suggest it appropriate for the President to launch the effort at this meeting.

With respect to your invitation to speak before the women's meeting, I think it would be a good idea as well, whether or not we have a voluntary prayer amendment announcement to make.
