BACKGROUND:

Despite substantial concern among veterans with various aspects of administration policy, the leadership has been, after an initial period of uneasiness, very cooperative in many ways. You have a great deal to be proud of in the accomplishments of your distinguished organization. While it is tragic that Americans have been called to war four times in this century, it is commendable that veterans of those wars have dedicated themselves to a stronger nation and a better society. The American Legion boasts one of the finest and most consistent records in wartime service and peacetime devotion to our national well-being.

With this in mind, I wish you a successful convention and hope you will continue the leader-ship and service you have given so unstintingly for so long.

My warmest greetings to you Legionnaires and Auxiliary members meeting for your 63rd annual convnetion in beautiful Hawaii. I know you will enjoy your visit. Commander Kogutek. Congratulations Adjutant Bob Spanogle whom my staff worked with in Washington and to your former Adjutant, Frank Momsen, who just retired. Also greetings to Auxiliary President Mrs. Dora Seymour and National Secretary Mrs. Miriam Junge (Younge), delegates and friends.

As tourists to the islands, you are aware that tourism is the largest industry in Hawaii, but did you know that the military is the second. Hawaii is important to our defense. You know what happened December 7th, nearly forty years ago. Some of you may have visited the USS Arizona Memorial operated by our National Park Service.

We never intend to let something like Pearl Harbor happen again. That is why at your Boston Convention when I was seeking the office of President that I told you we must provide the defense spending and programs necessary to correct immediate and short-term vulnerabilities and deficiencies.

We are beginning to reverse the deterioration of our naval strength, and provide all of the armed services with the equipment and spare parts they need.

You heard specifics about this when Admiral Robert L. Long, Commander-in-Chief, Pacific, spoke to you. Commander Long has an important mission as head of the largest unified command, an area which encompasses 100 million square miles, over 50 percent of the earth's surface, and about 320,000 personnel. He is responsible for collective defense arrangements in the Pacific.

Equipment is important to our armed services but so are the people who man this equipment. We must continue to provide resources to attract and retain superior people in each of the services. It will not be easy, nor will it be inexpensive. We must proceed from a basis of a strength in which we have confidence, a strength that our enemies will not be tempted to challenge.

I am glad you will have the opportunity to hear Defense Secretary Caspar Weinberger as your next speaker.

Your enthusiastic support of a strong defense program by my administration means a lot to me and to the Congress. Defense is a bipartisan issue, an issue we must constantly address.

You, through your Commander Mike Kogutek, have helped me in so many ways.

One of the White House aides saw your Commander at the White House so many times these past few months that he asked me who is that new employee wearing a red Legion cap.

I was happy to visit your inauguration banquet first for those brave Congressional Medal of Honor winners last January in Washington. Your Commander and I met again February 17th with the Arizona Legion people and the Arizona Congressional delegation for the signing of the proclamation for "Patriotism Week."

On March 16th, after The American Legion had honored Vietnam veterans at Arlington Cemetery, I met with Commander Kogutek and seven Vietnam veterans at the Oval Office to discuss problems facing veterans of that war. That was a fine group. So was the gesture by your organization to show Vietnam veterans your appreciation.

My interest in these veterans prompted me to support and sign a bill into law honoring Vietnam veterans on April 26th. Your ceremony at the site of the future Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington was a fitting tribute. My representative, Morton Blackwell, who appeared on the program, told me about the two Vietnam veterans who walked all the way from my home state of Illinois to Washington to help raise funds for the memorial. I admire their spunk, but I don't think I would try that long a walk.

I want to personally thank you as I did your Commander on July 11th at the White House. The American Legion was the first veterans organization to support my economic package. Thanks to your help and that of the American people, I see prosperous times ahead with the complete bipartisan economic package passed by Congress with the tax cuts we needed to fight inflation.

On July 17th, I received your mandates from Mr. Kogutek at the White House and I understand you are updating, changing and adding new mandates at your sessions this week in Honolulu.

I know how concerned your organization is with the veterans benefits and the VA hospital system. Because of your Legion voices and leadership, we were able to restore VA benefits to the budget. I am sure my friend Congressman G. V. (Sonny) Montgomery, chairman of the House Veterans Affairs Committee and one of your convention speakers, filled you in on the details. My assistant, Mrs. Elizabeth Dole, who has enjoyed working with you, is out there to get better acquainted with your people and bring a message from the White House.

Before I close, let me give you one bit of advice. Please see something of Hawaii before you leave the islands. It's a beautiful place with many attractions and breathtaking scenery. I know the tourist industry there will appreciate this plug.

Let me leave one thought with you today, fellow Legionnaires. I believe

America's greatest moments have come when America dared to be great -- when we
believed in ourselves and in our values and we reached out to do the impossible.

I said that to you in Boston at the end of my speech and it applies today. We are daring to be great as a nation, we are daring to take new approaches to our economics and a stronger defense. I need your help to do this and I appreciate your support. Thank you very much.

  I THANK YOU FOR THEM, AND I PROMISE YOU I WON'T FORGET.

ANDREW WHITE DESCRIBING THE 1793 COLLAPSE OF AN INFLATIONWRACKED FRENCH ECONOMY. "COMMERCE WAS DEAD AND BETTING TOOK
ITS PLACE," WRITES WHITE.

"Signs of disease showed themselves. First, an obliteration of thrift from the minds of the French people. The French," he writes, "were naturally thrifty; but with such uncertainty as to their currency's future value, the ordinary motives for saving and producing diminished; a loose luxury spread throughout the country."

DOES ANY OF THIS SOUND FAMILIAR?

- O A NATIONAL STANDARD OF LIVING ONE-THIRD HIGHER THAN TODAY'S.

- O SOMETHING HAS BEEN DONE, AND JUST ABOUT EVERY AMERICAN STANDS
  TO BENEFIT AS A RESULT. THE BUDGET HAS BEEN CUT--THROUGH
  BIPARTISAN ADOPTION OF \$35 BILLION IN REDUCTIONS. OVER
  THREE YEARS, THIS MEANS SAVINGS TO TAXPAYERS IN EXCESS OF
  \$130 BILLION DOLLARS.
- O AND THE PRESIDENT'S 25 PERCENT ACROSS-THE-BOARD TAX CUT,
  ACCOMPANIED BY SUBSTANTIAL INCENTIVES FOR SAVINGS AND
  INVESTMENT, ACCELERATED DEPRECIATION AND CAPITAL
  FORMATION WILL SOON TAKE EFFECT.

CLEARLY, WE'RE TALKING ABOUT MUCH MORE THAN DOLLARS AND CENTS WHEN WE ADDRESS THE ECONOMIC ISSUE. WE'RE TALKING ABOUT NATIONAL SECURITY. NO OTHER ISSUE IN MY LIFETIME IS SO FRAUGHT WITH SIGNIFICANCE FOR ALL AMERICANS.

AND NO GROUP WAS MORE INSTRUMENTAL IN HELPING TO EXPLAIN THE REALTIONSHIP BETWEEN A HEALTHY ECONOMY AND A SECURE NATION THAN THE AMERICAN LEGION. PERHAPS, SOME OF YOU IN THE AUDIENCE WILL KNOW WHAT I MEAN WHEN I SAY THIS CAMPAIGN WAS AS TOUGH AND RELENTLESS AS WAS BUILDING THE LEDO ROAD IN THE CDI THEATER DURING WW II. Battle of the Bulga

AMERICAN LEGION'S 63RD ANNUAL CONVENTION SEPT. 2, 1981

THE RENAISSANCE OF THE PATRIOT

THANK YOU, COMMANDER KOGUTEK (KOH-GOO-TEK) FOR THAT VERY
KIND INTRODUCTION. AS PRESIDENT REAGAN SAID IN HIS
TELEVISED REMARKS, I BRING HIS WARMEST GREETINGS TO THE
LEGIONARIES AND AUXILARY MEMBERS OF THIS GRAND ORGANIZATION.

It's a pleasure for me to be here to discuss the partnership which the President is working to establish between his White House and the American Legion. But any speaker, no matter how diligently he or she has prepared an address, would get edgy about how her message will come across to an audience like this.

O I KNOW I CAN'T SHAKE A STORY ABOUT MY FELLOW REPUBLICAN BILL SIMON.

BILL HAD JUST FINISHED GIVING ONE OF HIS POWERFUL, NO-NONSENSE SPEECHES AND WAS BEING APPROACHED BY AN ELDERLY LADY WHOSE BREATHLESS COMMENT WAS,

"OH, MR. SIMON, I ENJOYED YOUR SPEECH SO MUCH. I THOUGHT IT WAS ABSOLUTELY SUPERFLUOUS.

SIMON, ALWAYS QUICK ON HIS FEET, REJOINED,

"I'M DELIGHTED THAT YOU LIKED IT. PERHAPS, I SHOULD HAVE IT PUBLISHED POSTHUMOUSLY."

"WONDERFUL!" SAID THE ADMIRER, "THE SOONER THE BETTER."

WHEN PRESIDENT REAGAN OKAYED MY REQUEST TO ATTEND THIS
63RD ANNUAL CONVENTION, HE TOOK A MOMENT FROM THE WHITE
HOUSE STAFF MEETING AND OFFERED ME SOME , ADVICE;

"ELIZABETH," HE SAID IN THAT HUSKY VOICE, "IF YOU GET A CHANCE, LOOK BEYOND THE LEGION'S FORMAL RESOLUTIONS,

- O FIND OUT WHAT NATIONAL CONCERNS ARE EATING AT THE VETS,
- O WHAT TRENDS ARE CHEERING THEM AT THE GUT LEVEL,
- O SOMEHOW, LET THOSE MEN AND WOMEN KNOW WE'RE LISTENING."

More could be said on the Administration's policy toward Col. Qaddafi in Lybia, but there's a saying, "When your work speaks for itself, don't interrupt."

### MEMORIAL DAY

LAST EVENING, ANOTHER ISSUE CAME UP DURING A BRIEF VISIT WITH A LADY--RETIRED AIR FORCE. SHE WONDERED IF I HAD NOTICED THAT AMERICANS OBSERVED THIS YEAR'S MEMORIAL DAY WITH MORE ENTHUSIASM THAN THEY DID DURING THE 1970'S?

As you might expect, we agreed there's been a significant and positive change in favor of honoring our soldiers.

On Memorial Day 1931, the Senator and I participated in a glittering Washington Ceremony. However, that same night, at a dinner in Georgetown, I was sadly reminded that other Americans, Americans more likely drawn from the than from the bleachers, had not observed Memorial Day. They resented the honors accorded to what they call "militarism." And they seemed worried about a change-of-heart they witnessed in so many of their fellow countrymen.

WELL, I SUSPECT THEY'VE BEEN GLOOMY FOR YEARS. ONE COLUMNIST WRITES OF THESE FOLKS, "WITH EVERY SUNUP THEY ARE REMINDED THERE WILL FOLLOW A SUNDOWN...TO THESE PEOPLE," HE CONTINUES, "RONALD REAGAN'S AMIABLE PRESENCE ALSO IS A SOURCE OF PROFOUND CONCERN."

"WHY," THEY LAMENT, "COULD NOT DEFENSE FUNDS BE SPENT TO SAVE OUR CITIES AND TURN OUR POOR INTO MEMBERS OF THE MIDDLE CLASS?"

To those people, I hold forth an Administration budget doggedly determined—in the face of National Economic Crisis—to show compassion for the NEEDY;

O I POINT TO A PRESIDENT DEEPLY COMMITTED TO PROVIDING OUR POOR WITH THE ASSISTANCE THEY NEED TO LIVE IN SAFETY, IN HEALTH AND IN DIGNITY.

FOR SOME, HOWEVER, EVEN THESE GUARANTEES ARE NOT ENOUGH.

I'M REMINDED OF THAT MEDIEVAL LEGEND ABOUT THE WELLINTENTIONED TOWNSPEOPLE WHO TORE STONES FROM THEIR CITY
WALLS TO ENLARGE HOUSES FOR THE NEEDY. LATER, WHEN
ENEMIES BREACHED THOSE WALLS, MOST OF THE KIND TOWNSMEN
WERE SLAUGHTERED AND THEIR WOMEN ENSLAVED.

BUT BEFORE WE CHANGE THE SUBJECT, ONE LAST POINT,

ONE LAST QUESTION TO THAT ELITE SO LOUDLY PROFESSING TO

SPEAK FOR THE NEEDY.

WHERE WAS THEIR CRY, OVER RECENT YEARS, WHEN OUR YOUNG MILITARY FAMILIES WERE SHOVED BELOW A DECENT STANDARD OF LIVING?

DID THEY NOT SHARE OUR HUMILIATION AT SEEING AMERICAN FIGHTING MEN AND THEIR FAMILIES FORCED TO STAND IN WELFARE AND FOOD-STAMP LINES?

Today, NEARLY 55 PERCENT OF THE VOLUNTEER FORCE IS MARRIED. THERE ARE OVER 1.5 MILLION DEPENDENT CHILDREN OF MILITARY MEMBERS.

But, through sheer negligence, their numbers were ignored. They just didn't seem to count.

WOULD I BE MISTAKEN TO SUGGEST OUR MILITARY MEN AND WOMEN HAVE BEEN TAKEN FOR GRANTED? DID NEGLIGENT LEADERS SIMPLY ASSUME THE ARMED SERVICES WOULD BE THERE WHEN NEEDED?

CYNICISM IS ALWAYS CHEAPER THAN FAITH, AND APATHY LESS DEMANDING THAN PATRIOTISM.

THANK GOODNESS, NOW WE'VE GOT A PRESIDENT WHO BELIEVES
A MAN OR WOMAN CAN BE PROUD TO PARTICIPATE IN ONE OF
HISTORY'S MOST HONORED, RESPECTED AND NECESSARY PROFESSIONS.

PRESIDENT REAGAN KNOWS THE HUMAN DIMENSION OF MILITARY SERVICE--THE QUALITY OF LIFE--WILL DETERMINE THE READINESS, THE MORALE, THE DISCIPLINE AND THE RETENTION OF OUR ARMED FORCES.

ALREADY, THE PRESIDENT HAS ASKED FOR A 5.3 PERCENT PAY RAISE FOR THE MILITARY--ON TOP OF AN 11 PERCENT INCREASE VOTED BY THE LAST CONGRESS. THIS TOOK EFFECT IN JULY.

THE PRESIDENT ALSO HAS CALLED FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN LIVING AND WORKING FACILITIES; A COST-OF-LIVING ALLOWANCE FOR SINGLE PERSONNEL STATIONED OVERSEAS, AND; A SERIES OF BONUSES DESIGNED TO ENHANCE OUR CHANCES TO TO ATTRACT AND KEEP TOPNOTCH MEN AND WOMEN IN THE SERVICES.

OF COURSE, WE MUST CONTINUE TO UPGRADE PAY AND OTHER INCENTIVES, BUT--AT LAST--CHANGES HAVE SIGNIFIED THAT AMERICANS HOLD THEIR ARMED FORCES IN HIGH ESTEEM, AND WILL OFFER A LIVING STANDARD WORTHY OF THE SACRIFICE BEING ASKED OF THOSE IN UNIFORM.

#### UNIFORM

ON A LESS SEVERE NOTE, DURING THE TRIP TO THE AIRPORT IN WASHINGTON, OUR YOUNG COAST GUARD DRIVER CONFIDED SOMETHING WHICH I BELIEVE IS WORTHY OF MENTIONING HERE TODAY.

WHEN HE LEARNED I'D BE ADDRESSING VETS, HE GAVE ME PERMISSION TO PASS ALONG TO "YOU GUYS" SOMETHING WHICH WAS ACTUALLY RATHER PERSONAL.

HE SAID THIS YEAR, FOR THE FIRST TIME IN HIS CAREER,
HE THOUGHT HE MIGHT BE SHARING THE FEELING YOU IN THIS
AUDIENCE ONCE ENJOYED WHEN YOU WORE YOUR UNIFORM
IN PUBLIC.

HE SAID HE HOPED YOU HADN'T FORGOTTEN THE PRIDE, THE ADMIRATION WEARING A UNIFORM OFF DUTY ONCE GUARANTEED.

IT WAS ONLY A SMALL INCIDENT; BUT I THOUGHT IT WAS A SYMBOL OF THE SPIRIT MANY OF US IN WASHINGTON ARE TRYING TO REKINDLE. AFTER ALL, SUCH SYMBOLS AND PUBLIC ATTITUDES CREATE SPIRIT.

I DON'T BELIEVE FOR A MINUTE YOU'VE FORGOTTEN THE DIFFERENCE
IT MAKES WHEN PUBLIC REACTION IS FAVORABLE TO THOSE WEARING UNIFORMS.

I TAKE PRIDE IN THE FACT THAT IT'S BECOME ACCEPTABLE TO DO SO AGAIN.

#### PANAMA

YESTERDAY, ONE LEGIONAIRE FROM THE OLD PANAMA CANAL
DEPARTMENT, POINTED OUT SOMETHING TO ME WHICH WAS
QUITE PERCEPTIVE. HE WARNED THAT THE UNITED STATES
IS THE ONLY GREAT POWER WHICH HAS NEVER ENDURED THE PAIN
OF DEFEAT ON ITS OWN SOIL.

IN THIS LAND, ONLY THE AMERICAN SOUTH HAS KNOWN SUCH

#### MENORIAL DAY

LAST EVENING, ANOTHER ISSUE CAME UP DURING A BRIEF VISIT WITH A LADY--RETIRED AIR FORCE. SHE WONDERED IF I HAD NOTICED THAT AMERICANS OBSERVED THIS YEAR'S MEMORIAL DAY WITH MORE ENTHUSIASM THAN THEY DID DURING THE 1970'S?

To those people, I hold forth an Administration budget doggedly determined—in the face of National economic crisis—to show compassion for the needy;

WHERE WAS THEIR CRY, OVER RECENT YEARS, WHEN OUR YOUNG MILITARY FAMILIES WERE SHOVED BELOW A DECENT STANDARD OF LIVING?

DID THEY NOT SHARE OUR HUMILITATION AT SEEING AMERICAN FIGHTING MEN AND THEIR FAMILIES FORCED TO STAND IN WELFARE AND FOOD-STAMP LINES?

I WAS SHOCKED TO LEARN THE COMMISSARIES TOOK IN \$22.7 MILLION WORTH OF FOOD STAMPS IN 1980. . . ALMOST DOUBLE THAT OF THE PREVIOUS YEAR.

Would I be mistaken to suggest our military men and women have been taken for granted? Did negligent leaders simply assume the Armed Services would be there when needed?

CYNICISM IS ALWAYS CHEAPER THAN FAITH, AND APATHY LESS DEMANDING THAN PATRIOTISM.

THANK GOODNESS, NOW WE'VE GOT A PRESIDENT WHO BELIEVES
A MAN OR WOMAN CAN BE PROUD TO PARTICIPATE IN ONE OF
HISTORY'S MOST HONORED, RESPECTED AND NECESSARY PROFESSIONS.

Question 1: Percent of people who enter Service and stay until retirement (officer and enlisted).

Answer: About 12.2% of those who enter military service continue until retirement. Of all the officers entering military service, only 36% ever become eligible for retirement. Likewise, for the enlisted population, only 11% become eligible for retirement.

Question 2: Problems encountered by enlisted personnel (quality of life).

Answer: Quality of Life embraces a number of programs and individual projects designed to create an environment which recognizes that our Armed Forces personnel are our most important asset. These include military construction and operational funding programs for medical, housing, child care, education, religious, postal, recreational and other community facilities; job-related policies regarding tour lengths, officer-enlisted inequities, government housing assignment criteria, employment and deployment of women and single parents, privacy standards, financial counseling, a comprehensive system of compensation, recognition and awards; and an active public affairs program.

Progress has been made in improving military compensation, housing, personnel services and benefits. The Fair Benefits package passed by the Congress in the fall of 1980 is beginning to improve retention. Much remains to be done in areas related to the military family, particularly with regard to child care. The Services have established staff offices to address the needs of a predominantly married force. Nearly 55 percent of today's volunteer force is married. There are over 1.6 million dependent children of military members. Over the next decade we expect that the numbers of working spouses, single parents, and joint-Service parents (both in Service) will continue to increase. Family service centers are being established on larger bases to ease family relocation problems. Round-the-clock child care is being tested, as is satellited family day care. New initiatives in the 80's will be needed to improve the delivery of family and child care services on Department of Defense installations.

The human dimension of military service — the job, living and recreational conditions of service life — is generally regarded as a highly pertinent variable in the recruitment, retention, discipline, morale and readiness of military members. Efforts to improve the quality of service life epitomize the Department of Defense commitment to treat its military personnel equitably, with compassion, concern, and consideration.

\* Redemption of food stamps in commissaries is increasing. Despite pay raises, food stamp redemption has grown from \$12.6M in FY 79 to \$22.7M in FY 80 and is expected to reach \$26.8M in FY 81.
