REQUEST:

The Military Order of the Purple Heart for presentation of the "Peace Officer's" Award to Secret Service Agent Timothy J. McCarthy and Officer Thomas K. Delahanty, and to officially name President Reagan as their "Honorary National Commander-in-Chief."

PURPOSE:

Recognition of McCarthy, Delahanty, and the Military Order of the Purple Heart, the veterans organization exclusively for combat wounded veterans.

BACKGROUND:

The Order of the Purple Heart for Military Merit is the oldest military decoration in the world in present use and the first award made available to the common soldier. The Purple Heart was created by General George Washington. The special designation of "Honorary National Commander-in-Chief" is provided for in the Preamble to the Order's Constitution, but they did not choose to give this honor to President Carter.

Dear Mr. Blackwell,

I want to thank you for attending our CNVA Luncheon and speaking to the group. We welcomed the opportunity to meet you and to get a better understanding of your job. Your attendance was appreciated by all and I am certain that it will prove mutually beneficial.

As per your suggestion, I am requesting that arrangements be made for the Military Order of the Purple Heart (M.O.P.H.), to officially name President Reagan as our "Honorary National Commander-in-Chief" as defined in the Preamble to our Order's Constitution. M.O.P.H. did not choose to take similar action with the last President.

If it is agreeable with the President, our National Commander would present the President with the cap of the National Commander-in-Chief and a Life Member card. At the same time, we would like to present our "Peace Officer's" Award (which we give to peace officers wounded in line of duty) to Agent McCarthy and Officer Delahanty. A different, but appropriate award (plaque) would be presented to the President for his wounds.

I would appreciate very much if you could make the arrangements at any time convenient to the President. I could have our National Officers come into Washington on a three or four day warning from you.

Dear General Bolger,

As you know, 1982 will mark the 250th anniversary of George Washington's birthday. It is also the year during which our organization will celebrate the 200th anniversary of the signing of the Order, by George Washington, creating the Badge of Merit (Purple Heart), on August 7, 1782.

On August 7, 1982, we plan to re-enact the signing of that Order at Newburgh, New York, in conjunction with other events planned by the New Windsor Historic Commission.

In an effort to have a commemorative stamp issued on the date of our celebration (August 7, 1982), we initiated efforts through the Citizen's Stamp Committee in early 1979. We understood that this would give us ample lead time and that our theme had a very good chance for approval, i.e., an occasion to honor the "combat wounded" of our nation on the 200th anniversary of the first Order establishing the Purple Heart. We have tried through several other sources to gain support. An example, is the enclosed Resolution submitted by the New York State Legislature.

Unfortunately, our efforts and those of others in our behalf, have failed so far and time seems to be running out. I understand that the committee, once again, turned down our proposed stamp in July and may be taking another look at our request on September 11, 1981.

I fully realize that the committee's task is most difficult in making selections among the hundreds of requests that are submitted. However, it is difficult to reconcile how stamps depicting birds, flowers, Savings and Loans, and alcoholism, can be considered better themes than the 200th anniversary of the awarding of the Purple Heart and the honoring of "combat wounded veterans" of WWI, WWII, Korea, and Vietnam.

The membership of the Military Order of the Purple Heart, in behalf of all combat wounded veterans, respectfully asks for your help. We ask that you support us in our effort to have an appropriate commemorative stamp issued on August 7, 1982, at Newburgh, New York. Our time is running out--please assist us in honoring this historical event and those who have shed their blood in the defense of our nation.

Whereas, The Purple Heart was created by one of the foremost figures in American history, General George Washington in his General Orders of August seventh, seventeen hundred eighty-two issued at Newburgh, New York; and

Whereas, The first recipients of the Purple Heart were Sergeant Elijah Churchill, Sergeant William Brown and Sergeant Daniel Bissell; and

Whereas, The War Department revived the Purple Heart on February twenty-second, nineteen hundred thirty-two after the records had been lost for almost one hundred fifty years; and Whereas, The Purple Heart is awarded to members of the armed forces who are wounded by an instrument of war in the hands of an enemy and posthumously to the next of kin in the name of those who are killed in action or die of wounds received in action; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That this Legislative Body memorializes the United States Postal Service and the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee to issue a commemorative stamp celebrating the Two Hundredth Anniversary of the first awarding of the Purple Heart, August seventh, nineteen hundred eighty-two; and be it further

Resolved, That copies of this Resolution, suitably engrossed, be transmitted to the postmaster general of the United States and the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee.
