



Dear Mr. Chairman:

I am enclosing a copy of the ROA Resolution which addresses the strategic problems now confronting the United States, and I believe that early production and deployment of the MX Missile as proposed by the Administration should be authorized as soon as possible.

As you know, our present force of land-based missiles is deteriorating, and a Titan Missile is being removed from the system every 45 days. There is some question as to the reliability of the Minute Man II Force, so it is apparent that we need a new strategic weapon such as the MX just as soon as it can be produced.

I urge you to support President Reagan's request for the MX System in the 1983 Budget now before the Appropriations Committee.

Parity with the Soviet Union

WHEREAS, today the U.S.S.R. has a dramatic military advantage over the United States in strategic forces; and

WHEREAS, the Soviets have overwhelming superiority in Civil Defense, and such preparations can make the difference between the survival of tens of millions after a nuclear attack and tremendous loss of lives; and

WHEREAS, the Soviets are still outspending the U.S. by more than three-to-one in strategic weapons and Civil Defense and are committed to retaining superiority; and

WHEREAS, the Soviet Union has a propaganda edge over the United States and actively supports any anti-preparedness, anti-nuclear, pro-disarmament, and anti-American movements in the Free World;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Reserve Officers Association of the United States supports a National policy to close the window of American vulnerability by fully supporting programs to achieve parity with Soviet Strategic Forces and to revitalize U.S. Civil and Air Defense;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the United States government not enter into any treaty which would result in its military inferiority to the U.S.S.R. and its allies.
