Ahuas Tara II is the latest in a long series of military coordination exercises we have held with Latin American countries, including Honduras. One of the primary objectives is to assist Honduras, a democracy actively seeking peaceful solutions to the Central American conflict, to develop procedures for the defense of its territory.

Most countries in the Caribbean Basin have chosen democracy as a preferred form of government and have rejected military confrontation among themselves.
