Dear Sister Gillen:

Thank you for your recent message. We appreciate your concern, and would like to take the opportunity to reiterate this Administration's enduring commitment to the security and well-being of the State of Israel.

President Reagan is working diligently toward peace in the Middle East and he is convinced peace and reconciliation can be achieved in Lebanon.

The United States and Israel have an enduring special relation-ship based on moral as well as strategic interests. As the President said, "Israel has the right to exist in peace behind secure and defensible borders and it has a right to demand of its neighbors that they recognize those facts. Israel has the right to exist free of the threat of terrorism and other forms of aggression." President Reagan has concluded that there now exist new opprtunities for peace in the Middle East. These opportunities must now be seized.

With regard to the PLO, the President has made clear that the United States' position has not changed. The United States will not negotiate with the PLO until the PLO recognizes Israel and accepts UN resolutions 242 and 338.

Thank you for taking the time to share your thoughts and concerns with the Administration.



Mr. Skuodis suffered a mild heart attack on June 15, 1982 while on hunger strike. His wife Irena is very anxious about his ability to survive the prison ordeal. We urge your compassionate, positive response to her request for legal and diplomatic support, possibly asylum in the U.S. for her husband, herself and her family.

Our organization represents a cross-section of U.S. citizens, people of all faiths and ethnic backgrounds, who affirm both Jews and Christians in the USSR and Eastern Europe who are struggling to attain the liberties we enjoy.

Please help the Skuodis family to return home, Mr. President.

This administration has taken a strong stand in favor of the right of free emigration from the Soviet Union and we continue to seek opportunities to pursuade the Soviet government to liberalize its policies on emigration and freedom of movement.

Regrettably, the Soviets consider emigration to be a domestic policy issue. Nevertheless, we will continue to raise this issue in our future conversations with Soviet officials, keeping in mind the great concern of American people for the plight of those unable to emigrate.
