SUMMARY OF MRS. REAGAN'S ACTIVITIES AGAINST
DRUG AND ALCOHOL ABUSE

Since becoming First Lady, Mrs. Reagan has travelled nearly 200,000 miles to 65 cities in 33 states, The Vatican as well as 8 other foreign countries in conjunction with her campaign to fight school-age drug and alcohol abuse.

During her travels, Mrs. Reagan has visited 13 high schools; 13 elementary schools and three universities; received 34 awards for her work involving drug abuse, given 95 speeches, and 135 media interviews. She hosted two international conferences on drug abuse, one at the White House that was attended by 17 First Ladies from around the world, and the other at the United Nations where 30 First Ladies attended. In addition, she has participated in 38 special radio and TV tapings in a continuing effort to create greater awareness of the problem of youth abuse of drugs and alcohol.
