



NEW FEDERAL JUDGESHIP IN THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OF ALABAMA

We are grateful for the freedom that allows us to recommend U. S. Attorney Jefferson Beauregard Sessions, III for the above appointment.

Our Board and supporters feel we are qualified to make this recommendation based on our intense efforts over the past 5 years (without taxpayer funds) in our crusade to restore safety to our families and homes. We have closely monitored the courts, public officials, legislators and the actions of all who are charged with our safety.

We have supported your administration for its strong stance on law-order-justice, and for recognizing that protection of our borders and our people is the first order of government.

Mr. Sessions has reinforced that philosophy during his 6 years in the U. S. Attorney's office, in private practice, and even further back when he formed the first Young Republicans Club in 1965 at Huntington College. Rather than attempting to enumerate his achievements and his merit, allow me to present evidence thereof:

Mobile doesn't "freeze up" much, but it did on Jan. 22, 1985, the morning on which we sponsored a breakfast in his honor at the Holiday Inn. With pipes busted and water spewing in every home, by 7:45 a.m. the restaurant was filled to capacity with over 250 half-frozen admirers. Dozens were turned away. People drove 50-60 miles from the Eastern Shore of Baldwin County, up from Dauphin Island, and down from Citronelle, etc. That turnout would fill the eyes of any public servant, not to mention a panicked crime coordinator.

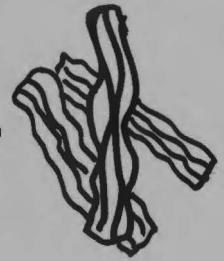


I would like to recommend U.S. Attorney J. B. Sessions, III, Southern District of Alabama, for one of the new federal judgeships in this district.
