PROPOSED STATEMENT FOR THE PRESIDENT ON ARRIVAL OF PRESIDENT BELAUNDE

MR. PRESIDENT.

IT IS A PLEASURE TO HAVE YOU BACK HERE IN THE UNITED STATES. SELDOM HAVE WE HAD A VISITOR WHO KNOWS US SO WELL, OR ONE WHO IS SO GOOD AND VALUED A FRIEND.

Your visit brings home to me, and I hope to all Americans, the dedication of the Peruvian people to liberty. Mr. President, you were elected in a vigorously contested and fair election. And as you said at the time of your inauguration two years ago. Peru has returned to the democratic traditions that alone ensure freedom for all citizens.

PERUVIAN DEMOCRACY HAS GIVEN YOUR ADMINISTRATION THE LEGITIMACY OF A FIRM FOUNDATION FOR GOVERNING. SELF-APPOINTED LEADERS, WHO ARE UNWILLING TO TEST THEMSELVES AND THEIR IDEAS IN A FAIR VOTE BY THEIR PEOPLE, HAVE NO SUCH LEGITIMACY. AND THOUGH IT IS ALL TOO OFTEN ASSUMED THAT AUTHORITARIAN OR TOTALITARIAN REGIMES HAVE AN ADVANTAGE IN NOT HAVING TO RESPOND TO AN INFORMED PUBLIC. SUCH MANIPULATION IS ULTIMATELY A WEAKNESS. DEMOCRATIC LEADERS HAVE THE SECURITY THAT COMES FROM THE CONFIDENCE OF KNOWING THEY TRULY REPRESENT THE WILL OF THEIR NATION. YOUR MANDATE WAS NOT CONTRIVED IN SOME ARBITRARY FASHION TO GIVE THE APPEARANCE OF POPULAR SUPPORT. IT IS REAL.

As a democratic President, you have strengthened Peru's PLACE AND INFLUENCE IN THE WORLD COMMUNITY. As IN Peru, the FORCE OF DEMOCRACY IS GROWING ACROSS THE HEMISPHERE -- IN CENTRAL AMERICA, THE CARIBBEAN AND SOUTH AMERICA. TWO THIRDS OF THE MEMBERS OF THE INTER-AMERICAN SYSTEM NOW HAVE GOVERNMENTS CHOSEN THROUGH COMPETITIVE, HONEST ELECTIONS. DEMOCRACY, NOT DICTATORSHIP, IS THE LIVING NORM FOR THE HEMISPHERE.

PRESIDENT BELAUNDE AND I WILL DISCUSS HOW WE CAN REINFORCE THE GAINS DEMOCRACY HAS MADE AND HOW WE MAY COOPERATE TO ENCOURAGE CONTINUING GAINS IN THE FUTURE. CONSTITUTIONAL DEMOCRACY HAS BEEN THE IDEAL OF OUR PEOPLES SINCE

INDEPENDENCE. EVEN MORE TO THE POINT, CUR INTER-AMERICAN EXPERIENCE TEACHES THAT PEACE AND COOPERATION ARE EASIER BETWEEN DEMOCRACIES. I PARTICULARLY LOOK FORWARD TO LEARNING YOUR VIEWS ON PERU'S ECONOMIC PROSPECTS AND ON WAYS TO STRENGTHEN THE INTER-AMERICAN SYSTEM.

WE UNDERSTAND, MR. PRESIDENT, THE STRENGTH OF CONVICTION YOU BRING TO OUR DISCUSSIONS AS THE REPRESENTATIVE OF A FREE PEOPLE WITH A PROUD AND RICH HISTORY. I KNOW OUR DISCUSSIONS WILL BE USEFUL TO ME. AND ON BEHALF OF ALL THE AMERICAN PEOPLE MAY I SAY WE ARE GLAD YOU HAVE COME.

WELCOME, MR. PRESIDENT.

PROPOSED PRESIDENTIAL TOAST AT STATE DINNER FOR PRESIDENT FERNANDO BELAUNDE

MR. PRESIDENT, WE COULD NOT BE MORE DELIGHTED TO WELCOME YOU BACK TO WASHINGTON. THIS IS A POLITICAL TOWN. IT WELCOMES MEN WITH POLITICAL VISION AND THE STAMINA TO FIGHT FOR IT. AND IT RESERVES A SPECIAL WELCOME FOR THOSE WHO, LIKE YOU, HAVE DEMONSTRATED THEIR SUPPORT FOR FREEDOM BOTH AT HOME AND ABROAD.

IN SOME COUNTRIES THERE ARE THOSE WHO ARGUE THAT LEADERS SHOULD NOT FACE THE RISK OF COMPETITION. THEY PROCLAIM NO NEED TO GO TO THE BALLOT BOX FOR A MANDATE. DIRECTION, THEY SAY, IS BEST GIVEN AND ENFORCED BY A SMALL VANGUARD CLAIMING TO EMBODY THE NATIONAL WILL. PEOPLE, THEY SAY, NEED ORDER AND DISCIPLINE, NOT A FREE CHOICE. THE ARGUMENTS OF THE ENEMIES OF THE PEOPLE ARE MANY: ELECTIONS CANNOT BE HELD BECAUSE THEIR COUNTRY IS DIVIDED. OR BECAUSE IT DOES NOT HAVE AN UNINTERRUPTED TRADITION OF DEMOCRACY. OR BECAUSE PRESSING PROBLEMS MUST BE SOLVED BEFORE DEMOCRACY CAN BE TRIED AT SOME DISTANT TIME IN THE FUTURE.

To these arguments Peru offers a compelling rebuttal. Your return to elected office in 1980 proved once again that democracy, whatever its setbacks over the decades, is still the guiding ideal to which the peoples of the Americas return time and again. Peruvians today have the political liberties, the institutions of an elected Congress, vigorous free press, labor unions and universities and the opportunities of private enterprise that give meaning to freedom in organized society and solidity to prospects for a better future. Your government has the strength of knowing it truly speaks for the Peruvian people.

THIS COULD NOT HAVE BEEN ACHIEVED WITHOUT THE VISION AND RESILIENCE OF LEADERS LIKE YOU, MEN WHO HAVE DEDICATED THEIR LIVES TO THE DEMOCRATIC IDEAL. WE IN THE UNITED STATES WERE HONORED AND WELL SERVED TO HAVE YOU WITH US DURING YOUR LONG YEARS IN EXILE. WE WARMLY WELCOMED YOUR RE-ELECTION TWO YEARS

AGO. SINCE THEN, YOU HAVE RETURNED PERU TO ITS PROPER PLACE AS A RESPECTED VOICE FOR REASON AND GOODWILL IN WORLD AFFAIRS. YOUR PERSONAL MORAL AUTHORITY GAVE FORCE TO YOUR PROPOSALS FOR A SETTLEMENT OF THE CONFLICT IN THE SOUTH ATLANTIC WHICH, REGRETTABLY, WERE OVERTAKEN BY THE RUSH OF HOSTILITIES BEFORE THEY COULD BE THOUGHTFULLY CONSIDERED BY THE TWO SIDES. AND THE PERUVIAN EXAMPLE AGAIN GIVES HOPE TO OTHER NATIONS NOW MOVING TOWARD DEMOCRACY. AS DEMOCRACY SPREADS, THE CAUSE OF PEACE AND FREEDOM IN THIS HEMISPHERE IS SERVED.

Your visit here is an occasion for optimism about the future. Our countries have serious troubles with the lingering world recession and the need to increase cooperation for security, peace and economic development. But your presence gives us confidence that Peru and the hemisphere will fulfill your vision of building a lasting foundation for freedom and national growth.

MAY I ASK YOU TO JOIN ME IN A TOAST TO OUR GOOD FRIEND AND A REVERED STATESMAN, THE PRESIDENT OF PERU.
