



Dear Colin:

Yesterday Anne Armstrong, Hank Greenberg, chairman of American International Group (insurance), the largest foreign investor in the Philippines, and I were sharing our worries that one of the bright achievements of the Reagan Administration -- the transition from dictatorship to democracy in the Philippines -- could be lost in the last year of this Administration, with much criticism during the campaign.

Hank met recently with the Interagency Group. He also shared his views last week with George Bush, who promised to relate them to George Shultz. But Anne and I feel that his views deserve White House attention due to his unique sources and perspective.

The action idea that the three of us have is this: Steve Bosworth -- so well respected in the Philippines and I think in both Defense and State Departments -- should be brought back, perhaps with the personal rank of Ambassador to lead the integration of total Executive Branch, Congressional and Allied efforts toward saving the Philippines. To the Executive Branch and the Congress, this would send the signal of urgency and priority. The same to the Allies. My conversations with Nakasone, Takeshita, Abe, and Miyazawa in Tokyo in June led me to believe that Japan can be induced to do much more with untied aid to the Philippines in view of Japanese dependence upon those two bases for protection of their energy lifelines.

From his own sources, Greenberg emphasizes that time is urgent. Anne and I strongly endorse this, and wanted me to write on behalf of both of us. You, by the way, would do well to meet with Hank.

Keep up your good work.







Thank you for your February 2 letter to President Reagan and
your January 11 open letter to the President and the Congress.
Both letters and the attached materials were interesting and
offer insights into the many problems the Philippines faces.

As you probably know, the Agency for International Development
(A.I.D.) is the principal U.S. Government agency providing and
administering economic assistance programs to the Philippines.
Since the early 1950's, our economic assistance has amounted
to over \$3.5 billion to the Philippines, including some
\$700 million--about 30 percent of the total--since President
Aquino came to power in February 1986.

Our current programs support many of the "Suggested Priority
Projects" you identified in the materials you shared with us.
We intend to continue providing support for rural infra-
structure, development of the private sector, primary health
care, and population issues. We also intend to continue--
as we have in the past--to monitor our programs closely, in
conjunction with the Philippine Government's own policies, to
ensure that funds are used effectively for the purposes
intended.

Finally, as you suggest, there has been much discussion
recently about a so-called "mini-Marshall plan" for the
Philippines. We applied the objectives of such an initiative
for the Philippines and have consulted with some members of
Congress about a possible multilateral effort to provide

EDITORIAL

PROPOSALS FOR BASIC HUMANITARIAN PROJECTS

After being from my recent trip to the Philippines as AUSA's Special Envoy, I have synthesized my observations regarding programs that can profitably help advance health and economic development in our neighbor.

Having consulted widely with various groups at grassroots level and with specific input from the Philippine education, rural and local medical sectors, we can now formulate a comprehensive plan of action to translate into concrete terms the proposed programs for assistance. Hopefully, these projects can initiate the cooperation that we seek with the Philippine government towards the Filipino nation.

As guidelines for these projects, we have used as criteria our particular direction: "What are the most urgently needed economic and health aids to the Philippines that can truly benefit the majority?"

1. Civil administration has to be utilized for facilities that can reach the most deprived people. Perfect example would be development of municipal health coverage cost less than P2500 and supporting the already established P2500 day care centers in the Philippines under the MCHS of the Department of Health. Personnel and infrastructure can be directed to mass vaccination of children, immunization, infectious diseases and diseases requiring needed.

2. First project of "adopting a terrain for self-help program" - self-perpetuating "small areas" (cottage industries) can be taught to families during at economic independence. U.S. \$25,000 - 500 checks to start a country \$250 weekly a hand teacher to be shared by a learning community.

3. Launching the program for Health Care Programs in cooperation with MCHS, Ministry of Health and local PMA by establishing rural health care centers, supporting health education, training medicine and planning your own staff and program in the Philippines.

4. Initiative - In rural areas we can send a local physician to provide free health services to indigent patients. Hospital facilities can be supported from domestic PMA. With ongoing support and cooperation of MCHS, MCHS, and local PMA, we can have permanent control of PMA, government and the private sector. (PMA/PHS/Philippines PMA/PHS).

4. Initiative "Adopt A Filipino Student Through School and College" by US-American families in the United States. This can be a national project for all residents in America who are willing to help our Filipino brothers in the Philippines. Once education provides the building blocks of a nation, this project is the easiest to implement based on direct communication between a Filipino-American family in the United States and a deserving Filipino student in the Philippines.

5. International Welfare Supercenter through education and selective family planning should be another project in state PMA in America under the MCHS and in cooperation with our domestic PMA counterparts. The MCHS and MCHS United Nations prediction of population explosion is likely since from 1970 to 1980 by 1980 could be increasing with our nation's health and economic progress. A national program of analysis and evaluation can assist the MCHS and MCHS to enhance their plan of action whereby more effective forms of family planning can be adopted and used to attain a balanced population growth in the Philippines.

POPULATION PROBLEMS IN THE PHILIPPINES

Among the factors that currently bear the brunt of the Philippine socio-economic structure, the most significant is the rapid population growth. This factor is a major constraint on the country's economic development and is a major cause of the country's social and economic problems.

THE NEED FOR WORLD POPULATION CONTROL

The world's population now stands at 5 billion. Unchecked, there would be at least 100 billion people a century hence. As of 1960 there are 4 babies born every second, 250 every minute, 360,000 everyday and 120 million every year. The predictable impact of unchecked population growth of this magnitude on food supply, natural resources and political stability is enormous.

As the other aspects of global problems, the UNFPA reports that the Third World suffers 90% of all infant and child mortality. Statistics reveal that more than 9 million infants die each year worldwide. Of the 17 infants and children that die each minute, 16 are in developing countries. Africa is the most hard hit. In 1960 Africa accounted for 15% of all infant and child deaths. By 1980 it suffered 34%. Today, West Africa's infant and child mortality rate is 20 times that of Northern Europe.

Similar to his World countries, the dire economic deprivation of the Philippines' population, serves as a secondary to its present socio-economic problems. Each bondage is further aggravated and severely compounded by the nation's unbalanced population growth. In Manila alone, population explosion from 2.5 to 11 million by 1990 (United Nations World Commission on Demography) is in sharp contrast with the government's projected anti-economic development strategies.

Examination of the Philippine Warbler and other related birds are reflected through changes in the bird's behavior. A recent study of the Philippine Warbler (1987-1992) gives the following data:

1. Average life expectancy from 61.1 in 1987 is estimated to increase to 65.2 years in 1992.
