Dear Mr. President:

I do not think you would remember me. My name is Andrew Baer and I am a medical student at George Washington University. I was the first person to meet you as you arrived at the Emergency Room on that frightening Monday just a few weeks ago. It happened to be my first day rotating through the service! Ironically, an hour before the hospital "white" phone rang I was having lunch with my fiance who works at the hospital and commented how slow the day was going and at the dearth of interesting patients.

When the message came to the effect that your motorcade would arrive shortly and that some shots had been fired, (Indeed, that is all that was said) all of the emergency room physicians went back to the trauma area to prepare it. I rushed out and in my fright and haste forgot to bring a stretcher - I hope you will accept my apology, I should have been more cool-headed.

I will never forget the expression on your face as long as I live. Several weeks earlier, I had been hospitilized for an acute lung problem which made it difficult for me to breathe. At the time of its onset I did not know what the etiology was and could only think that I might die.

When you came through the E.R. door I saw you struggling for air. For an instant our eyes met and I shared with you the horror of facing death. It was an experience I shall never forget and remains between us and the good Lord whose hand guided you through to health. I am not a religous man, but I am very thankful that you are alive and should soon have all of your strength back.

As a medical student I am proud to be a member of the community of professionals who could be of service in a time of national and personal crisis. I am also very proud to be an American and that you are our President. Personally, I love your style - your wit and common sense approach really

come through.

Although our national problems are very tough, and that there certainly are no easy answers, I am confident that your administration will accomplish a substantial amount in the coming years.

I really wish that I could meet you someday under different circumstances and "chew the fat" regarding the problems of the day. I know this is not too likely! However, I wish you the best of luck and the strength to accomplish your goals.
