

Mottl's vote for GOP budget could cost him seat

By William Carlson PD BUREAU

COLUMBUS - Rep. Ronald M. Mottl might become a casualty of congressional redistricting for supporting the President Reaganbacked budget yesterday.

Cuyahoga County Democratic Chairman Timothy F. Hagan had told Cuyahoga County legislators here that Mottl's party loyalty would be questioned if he sided with the GOP.

"It would not be beneficial to his cause in redistricting," Hagan said.

Mottl, D-23, of Parma, was one of 63 House Democrats who joined GOP members yesterday in passing the Gramm-Latta substitute budget

bill backed by Reagan.

Later this year, the legislature. after conferring with party leaders and the governor's office, will redraw district boundaries to reflect the 1980 census.

Population shifts will force Ohio to give up two of its 23 congressional seats, most likely those of a Greater Cleveland Democrat and a downstate Republican.

Although he is a former state senator, Mottl has few friends here who would protect his seat.

The ill will stems partly from his maverick record and partly from what veteran lawmakers say was Mottl's misrepresentation of the Ohio Lottery as a cure-all for school financing. Mottl's promise

is remembered by the public and still bedevils state officials.

Hagan said he will set up a meeting within the next month between Cuyahoga County Democratic legislators and the county's four congressmen - Mottl, M. Rose Oakar, D-20, of Clevela Louis Stokes, D-21, of Clevela and Dennis E. Eckart, D-22, of] clid - for a free and frank disc sion on redistricting.


