The exhibit is progressing well, and construction is moving along rapidly. We are currently working on obtaining the specific components for every exhibit. At this time, we would very much like to know if the Reagans would consider posing. In other countries, the First Family has posed for a hologram. It would give countless children from all over America and abroad a real thrill to see President and Mrs. Reagan represented here in that form of cinematography.

A hologram is a three-dimensional representation which is so life-like, it is amazing. The field of holography is relatively new; it is part of an area called electro-optics, an industry that is playing a role of growing importance in aerospace and defense applications.

Holography is a photographic technique in which the image appears to be three dimensional. It is part of the field of electrooptics. Holograms are the public manifestation of the electrooptics industry which is playing a role of growing importance in many sectors, especially aerospace and defense applications.

A hologram was made of Queen Beatrice and Prince Klaus of the Netherlands for the purpose of public display in the latter half of 1980. A holographic medallion was made to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of the reign of Queen Elizabeth, II.

A great allure of Washington, D. C. is the President and the First Lady. Since children identify so strongly with their President, we thought it might be appropriate to have a hologram of the President and the First Lady at the national Children's Museum. A holographic image is so powerful, one does not readily forget it. The hologram will be on display in the Film/Photo Segment of the new Communications exhibit, and I can think of no subject that would be as fitting as the President and First Lady.

A filming session requires about two hours, and with the cooperation of the Museum of Holography in New York City, I am sure that we can find an acclaimed cinematographer to do the camera work.




