Dear Mr. President,

As a combat veteran, an "expert" rifleman, and former General Dwight

D. Bisenhour's personal bodyguard, I would like to make some suggestions
that would possibly help prevent a recurrence of the tragedy you experienced.

However, I think it more likely to happen again than it was the first time.

To quote you: "We must deal with our adversary (assessin or assailant) from a position of strength." A crack outfit such as never existed before, can be selected, secured, trained, and employed, that would not have let Mr. Hinckley get off the first shot.

Please consider the following suggestions:

- Organize from all sources; seasoned, experienced combat veterans who know guns, fighting, and people.
- 2. Train these people to be as efficient at being a guard as the Green Berets, Commandoes, or U.S. Pilots are at their jobs.
- 3. Require reconnaissance of each area, place, spot, and danger before you go. Have it guarded day and night until you arrive and leave.

  If they cannot make it absolutely safe, think of your country and don't go. We need you.
- 4. You need combat-proven weapons, teams, and methods to make a crack team. I would suggest shotguns for close range, N-16's for medium

range, and sniper-scoped rifles for long range work-like Kennedy needed. I would suggest three-man teams, with each of the above weapons on four sides of you as you are out in the open and exposed.

- 5. These twelve men should observe in all directions away from you.

  (We always watched people, windows, doors, hills, rocks, trees, etc., not the General.)
- 6. Weapons and men need to be ready this instant! This split second!

  Combat experience makes you ready or you don't survive. You absolutely must get him first. You can vomit or cry or void afterwards if you like. They must get him before he gets anyone. We were ready to remove the safety aim and fire in one motion at anyone, anywhere. This kind of terror and instant death made it safetfor the General, and it will make it safer for you. This kind of team would be good for close-up and medium range. A long-range, scoped rifle like I build would be extremely deadly in the hands of a hit-man up to 1,200 yards. The only safety from this type killer is to avoid exposure to his sights, which can be effectively done most of the time.
- 7. Announce publicly that you are reorganizing and beefing up yoursecurity to keep away punks and would-be fame-seekers.
- 8. It is not a question of a guard dying in the line of duty. It is assumed that all enforcement officers may. But they, and the public, must face the following question: "would you rather be held accountable for, or blamed with (1) opening fire on a would-be assassin, killing him and an innocent bystander; or (2) hesitating to shoot for fear of killing someone else; and let the President of the United States be killed while you are supposed to protect him?"

- D. Consider a law of immunity for a guard in such cases.
- 10. Require that the M-16 and sniper handlers have vision of at least 20/05 without glasses.

I would be proud to be your quard, and could, even at the age of 62.

I walk 6 miles per day and climb 60 flights of stairs daily; but I would rather organize or help organize and train the group for you.

You are too good a man to lose because some punk mants to impress his girlfriend. Your programs are too good to be stopped. You have more courage, wisdom, and righteousness than any U.S. president that ever lived. But it only takes a punk or communist to kill you. Let's don't let them do it.
