Dear Mr. Abram:

I appreciated your recent <u>Wall Street Journal</u> op-ed on Soviet Jewry. The United States and the Soviet Union entered into an important arms reduction agreement at the recent Summit. However, as you write, there has not yet been a meeting of minds on the crucial issue of human rights. While there are positive aspects of glasnost, the Soviet Union remains a fundamentally closed society. It still denies citizens the free exercise of religion and the right to free emigration and many other basic liberties, not to mention the right to chose who shall lead them.

I agree with you that these are not just internal matters. They should concern all who are committed to the cause of freedom and peace. This is why I began my recent meetings with General Secretary Gorbachev by pointing out the necessity of further progress in the area of human rights. I especially emphasized the cause of Soviet Jewry, stressing how much this concerns all Americans. I also made certain he realizes that progress in human rights is just as vital as progress in arms reductions — that further improvements in our relations are related to appreciably improved Soviet human rights performance.

My message to the General Secretary was unmistakably clear. I hope and pray for a positive response. In any case, this administration will continue to press the human rights question until the day we leave office. As far as I am concerned, it will always be a front-burner issue.

Finally, I want to extend my congratulations to you and your colleagues on your extraordinarily successful demonstration on December 6. It deserved and received great attention throughout the world -- from the White House to the Kremlin.



# The Chapel Is Presented to the U.S.

The United States Government received a special gift on September 23, 1986—a Jewish chapel—as ownership of the West Point Jewish Chapel was formally transferred as a gift from the private, non-profit group that funded its construction.

A colorful military ceremony was held to mark the occasion, in which the U.S. Military Academy's Cadet Honor Guard and U.S. Military Academy Band participated. Cadets, faculty and staff attended the festivities, held on the grounds of the Jewish Chapel. Lt. General Dave R. Palmer, Superintendent of the Military Academy, accepted the gift on behalf of Secretary of the Army John O. Marsh, Jr.

#### A Message to the World

"The Jewish Chapel, taking its place alongside the Protestant and Catholic Chapels, emphasizes, for the world to witness, the source of strength and greatness of our democracy," Herbert M. Ames, President of the West Point Jewish Chapel Fund, stated.

The gift of the chapel to the U.S. Government is the culmination of a nearly 20-year-long effort. The Chapel was first opened for baccalaureate graduation services in the spring of 1984. Additional details of the building, including the Sanctuary's "Ten Commandment Windows," and the Ark Curtain have recently been completed and installed.

The honored speaker at the ceremonies was Marty Silverman. Mr. Silverman, an officer of the West Point Jewish Chapel Fund, is President and founder of North American Corporation, a private, New York-based computer leasing organization.

"There would be no Jewish Chapel today at West Point were it not for the genius and generosity of Marty Silverman," Mr. Ames noted.

#### Fund Raising Continues

The West Point Jewish Chapel Fund presented the Chapel to the government free and clear of any debts. The Fund, however, is still obligated for less than \$1-million of the \$7.5-million cost to build and furnish the Chapel. It will continue its fund raising efforts, which it expects to complete this year.

"To the Jewish community at West Point, the Chapel serves a wide number of religious and community functions; to new Jewish Cadets it serves as an inviting welcome; and it serves to enlighten the wider public as to the role Jewish Americans have played and continue to play in this great country's defense and statesmanship," Mr. Ames told the audience.

The President today announced the appointment of [José S. Sorzano / as Special Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs. Mr. Sorzano will succeed Raymond F. Burghardt as Senior Director of Latin American Affairs on the National Security Council staff.

Dr. Sorzano is an Associate Professor of Government at Georgetown University where he has taught since 1969. He is also President of the Cuban American National Foundation, an independent, non-profit organization dedicated to gathering and disseminating data about Cuban economic, political and social issues.

During a recently concluded leave of absence from the University, Dr. Sorzano was appointed by President Reagan as Ambassador and United States Representative to the United Nations Economic and Social Council, a position he held from 1981 to 1983. Subsequently, Ambassador Sorzano was appointed to the position of Deputy United States Permanent Representative to the United Nations with the rank of Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary. He served in that post until August 1985. During a previous leave of absence from the University (1976-1978), Ambassador Sorzano served as Peace Corps Country Director in Bogotá, Colombia, supervising the largest Peace Corps operations in Latin America.

Born in Havana, Cuba, in 1940, Ambassador Sorzano came to the United States in 1961 and became a United States citizen shortly thereafter. He received his undergraduate education at Georgetown University's School of Foreign Service (1965) and obtained a Ph.D. in Political Science from Georgetown University in 1972.

Ambassador Sorzano is married to Shannon Hogan from Portland, Oregon, and they have two children.
