Dear President Reagan:

During the David Ben-Gurion Centennial Year marking the 100th anniversary of the birth of this revered leader and prominent statesman, a governmental committee under the auspices of the President of the State of Israel has been established aimed at launching special projects associated with Ben-Gurion, his vision and his achievements.

Ben-Gurion University of the Negev, founded in 1969 by a Government resolution with the major goal of spearheading the pioneering enterprise of developing the Negev as envisaged by David Ben-Gurion, will naturally be a focus of attention in the Centennial celebrations. This University, in cooperation with the state-sponsored Ben-Gurion Foundation, has established a Centennial Endowment Fund with the purpose of financing pioneering and research undertakings in the Negev. A fund-raising campaign has been launched the world over for this purpose, which has raised to date over \$7 million.

We extend to you, Mr. President, as honorary Chairman of the Ben-Gurion Centennial Committee, an invitation to join the Honorary Board of Trustees of the David Ben-Gurion Centennial Endowment Fund whose friendship to Israel and concern for its well-being and economic development is widely acknowledged.

We sincerely hope you will honor us with your acceptance.

George Paraskevaides, OBE

George Paraskevaides, a man of global vision, is as approachable as a warm and considerate neighbor. Entrepreneur, architect, successful businessman, philanthropist and benefactor, he is at the same time down to earth, a man with no enemies, a man who makes time for people seeking him out for advice and help.



Mr. Paraskevaides was born in Athens in 1916 while his father, a Cypriot, studied medicine at the University of Athens. The family then moved to Cyprus, where the young George excelled at the Pancyprian Gymnasium in Nicosia. He continued his studies in architecture at the Milan Polytechnic Institute in Italy, and in 1940 traveled to London to return to Cyprus when Italy joined with Germany in World War II.

During those war years, construction work was mostly for military use, and he and Stelios Joannou formed "Joannou & Paraskevaides Limited" to undertake British military contracts. The company expanded steadily, becoming the leading contractor on the island. In conjunction with some 30 subsidiaries and associated companies, "Joannou & Paraskevaides Limited" today encompasses a wide spectrum of ventures.

For 25 years, George Paraskevaides has also been the managing director of Joannou & Paraskevaides (Overseas) Ltd., the international building and civil engineering contracting firm. Through his management and guidance, it has become one of the leading companies in the Middle East and the world. More than 20,000 engineers and laborers annually complete contracts worth more than \$1.2 billion in construction, commercial, financial, and technical developments internationally.

Leonie, an architect, runs her own architectural office in Cyprus and was educated at University College in London. Christina is currently studying art and design in London.


