SUBJECT: Additional Information On Your Tuesday Lunch at the Irish Embassy

Irish Ambassador Sean Donlon has given me the essentials of the scenario he and his Embassy colleagues plan to follow for your Tuesday, March 17 lunch; they look like this:

- -- The lunch will precede the ceremonies;
- -- Ambassador Donlon will present the traditional shamrock to you near the conclusion of the dessert course;
- -- He will present at the same time the Reagan family tree done on vellum;
- -- Following these presentations, there will be the exchange of toasts.

During the presentations and the toasts a pool of 16 reporters (11 American and 5 Irish) will be admitted to the dining room for appropriate coverage.

To give you some idea of the luncheon participants, I attach a copy of the guest list as the Irish have communicated it to us (Tab A).

NB. I have received late word that Irish Prime Minister Charles Haughey may try placing a call to you at some point in the course of the luncheon, simply to wish you a Happy St. Paddy's Day and to express the hope that you will soon be able to visit his country.

PRIME MINISTER FITZGERALD'S DIPLOMATIC ADVISOR TOLD US LATE JULY 14 THAT THE H-BLOCK PROBLEM, IF NOT RESOLVED SOON, COULD HAVE SERIOUS CONSEQUENCES NOT ONLY FOR IRELAND--NORTH AND SOUTH--BUT FOR ANGLO-IRISH RELATIONS, HE SAID THAT THE GOI HAS DONE EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO CONVINCE THE UKG OF THE SERIOUSNESS OF THE SITUATION AND THAT THE IRISH ARE NOW TURNING TO THE PRESIDENT IN THE HOPE HE CAN MAKE BRITISH PRIME MINISTER THATCHER UNDERSTAND THE GRAVITY OF THE PROBLEM. FINALLY, LILLIS SAID THAT THE IMMINENT DEATH OF HUNGER-STRIKER KIERAN DIHERTY, ELECTED TO THE DAIL JUNE 11, WOULD NECESSITATE A BYRELECTION "IN AN ATMOSPHERE WHICH PROBABLY WOULD BE REMINISCENT OF THE WORST DAYS OF THE IRISH CIVIL WAR" (SEE PARA 2, REF B), HE ACKNOWLEDGED THAT THE FITZGERALD GOVERNMENT IS ACUTELY AWARE OF ITS THIN MARGIN OF PARLIAMENTARY SUPPORT AND NATURALLY ANXIOUS TO AVOID ANY BY-ELECTION. HE INSISTED, HOWEVER, THAT THE GOI IS FAR MORE WORRIED ABOUT THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THIS SPECIFIC BY-ELECTION THAN THE RESULT. 5. EMBOFF POLITELY QUESTIONED SEVERAL OF LILLIS'S PREMISES. HE NOTED THAT PUBLIC REACTION HERE TO THE MOST RECENT HUNGER STRIKE DEATHS HAS BEEN MINIMAL, HE ASSUMED THAT THE WRIT MOVING A BY-ELECTION IN CAVAN-MONAGHAN (DOHERTY'S CONSTITUENCY) WOULD PROBABLY BE MADE ONLY DURING THE OCTOBER DAIL SESSION, THUS PROVIDING SOME TIME TO RESOLVE THE H-BLOCK PROBLEM. HE OBSERVED THAT H-BLOCK SUPPORTERS HAD SCATHINGLY ATTACKED THE OUT-GDING FIANNA FAIL GOVERNMENT FOR ITS HANDLING OF THE ISSUE AND THAT THE COALITION GOVERNMENT HAD BEEN WORKING ENERGETICALLY ON THE SUBJECT SINCE ITS FIRST DAY IN OFFICE. EMBOFF WONDERED THEREFORE WHETHER ANY PARTY POLITICAL ADVANTAGE COULD BE SOUGHT OR EXPECTED BY EITHER FIANNA FAIL OR FINE GAEL. FINALLY HE OPINED THAT EITHER FIANNA FAIL OR FINE GAEL LAS OPPOSED TO ANOTHER HUNGER STRIKER) WOULD LIKELY WIN THE BYRELECTION (AN OPINION SHARED BY OTHER OBSERVERS HERE); A FIANNA FAIL VICTORY WOULD PUT IT WITHIN ONE SEAT OF THE COMBINED FINE GAEL/ LABOR TOTAL BUT FIANNA FAILIS OWN LACK OF SUCCESS IN MOVING THE UKG ON THE HABLOCKS WOULD HARDLY ENABLE IT TO TOPPLE THE COALITION OVER THAT ISSUE. 6, LILLIS CONCEDED THE VALIDITY OF THE ABOVE POINTS AND SAID THE GOVERNMENT IS SEEING THINGS A BIT PESSIMISTICAL. HE ADDED THAT PEOPLE ARE "MAKING UP THEIR MINDS NOW" ABOUT THE PROBLEM AND WILL BLAME THE CURRENT GOT FOR LACK OF SUCCESS IN PUSHING FOR A SOLUTION --NOT THE PREVIOUS FIANNA FAIL REGIME FOR PAST LACK DF

PRESS GUIDANCE (If Asked)

LETTER FROM IRISH PRIME MINISTER FITZGERALD ON NORTHERN IRELAND

Q: Can you confirm press reports that the President received a letter yesterday from Irish Prime Minister FitzGerald on Northern Ireland?

A: The President did receive such a letter.

- Q: Can you comment on the content of the Prime Minister's letter?
  - A: We do not comment on the substance of what we regard as private diplomatic correspondence. I can say only that the President will be replying to the letter shortly.
- Q: What is the US Government's position on the Northern Ireland hunger strike?
  - A: Throughout the period of the hunger strike, we have made clear our regret at the deaths it has brought about, including of those persons innocently caught up in the violence it has engendered. The recent deaths of Mr. Martin Hurson and Mr. Joseph McDonnell were all the more tragic at a time when it appeared a way might be found to resolve this issue. We sincerely hope that the hunger strike can be brought to a peaceful conclusion and that there can be an end to the violence in Northern Ireland.



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- Q: There are six other hunger strikers at the Maze Prison. Does the United States plan to intervene with the British Government to prevent them from dying?
  - Q: While we do not intend to intervene in the current situation in Northern Ireland, both the President's personal feelings and this country's policy, as outlined in the President's March 17 statement, are well known.
- Q: What is that policy?
  - A: We will continue to urge the parties to come together for a just and peaceful solution, and we will continue to condemn all acts of terrorism and violence. The President has also called on all Americans to question closely any appeal for financial or other aid from groups involved in the Northern Ireland conflict to ensure that contributions do not end up in the hands of those who perpetuate violence, either directly or indirectly.
- Q: In his March 17 statement, President Reagan offered the "good offices of the US" to help bring peace to Northern Ireland. Does this mean the US intends to assume a role as mediator in the conflict?
  - A: No. The statement means that the US is prepared to support in any way possible a just and peaceful solution to the conflict.



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
