Dear President Reagan:

The sovereignty of the Falkland Islands is by natural law and should be by political law vested exclusively in the collective will of the two thousand people who call those islands their home.

If Mrs. Thatcher and the Argentine government need a face-saving device for resolution of the Falkland Island dispute, then the role of the United States should clearly be to conduct a plebiscite among the two thousand or so Falklanders to determine their wishes. The ballot issues should be posed: (1) Home rule, (2) Argentine rule, (3) British rule.

This is clearly the only solution with any merit to the present crisis and, indeed, the only solution our government should entertain and support to the numerous political crises abounding in this political world of nuclear intimidation.

And finally, what a nice pragmatic solution for, hopefully, the United Nations to endorse, and if that group flounders, for us to propose.



Dear Mr. Kellyn

First off, thank you for your generous words of support. I'm most grateful. May I also say I wish you well in your plan to enter law school. I don't believe we've done anything budget wise to interfere with your plans.

There has been a great deal of misinformation and downright demagoguery about our student aid programs, so I can understand your concern. Our 1983 budget proposal calls for seven million loans and grants. It is true we've targeted some of these to those with the greatest need and some graduate school loans will be at commercial interest rates but they will still be government guaranteed.

About the budget deficits -- yes, they are projected higher than was previously thought but this is the result of the continuing recession and increased unemployment. One added percentage point of unemployment adds \$25 billion to the deficit through increased benefit costs and lowered tax revenues. Another factor is one I can't really feel sorry about; we've reduced inflation so much faster than we thought we could that our tax revenues will be less than had been estimated. Yes, inflation is a tax.

Incidentally, you might tell your roommate to check and see if a \$90 billion deficit isn't a smaller percent of Gross National Product than the \$60 and \$70 billion dollar deficits of the years between 1975 and 1980. Our proposed budget for 1983 will begin a reduction of deficits down to \$39 billion by 1985 and to a balanced budget soon after.

With regard to the arms situation, let me olarify something. I agree with you that it wouldn't make sense to build up to parity with the Soviets and then propose a mutual reduction. I've studied the nineteen previous efforts we've made since WW II to persuade them to join us in reducing nuclear weapons. I don't believe there will be a move on their part, however, so long as they have superiority and we are continuing to disarm unilaterally.

I'm sure you know that we are in negotiations now with them in Geneva regarding their intermediate range nuclear missiles targeted on Europe. The negotiations were agreed to when we announced we would place Pershing missiles in Europe as a counter to their SS 20's.

Tomorrow I am announcing our invitation to the Soviets to join us in strategic nuclear arms reduction talks. I believe such talks will take place if they are convinced that the alternative is an arms race. A cartoon recently said it all; Brezhnev was speaking to a Russian General. He said, "I liked the arms race better when we were the only ones in it."

(and hopefully later, other countries too) that would include on-site inspection and other guaranties to ensure strict adherence to the agreement. The U.S.S.R. with their pathetically sick economy and massive committments in Poland and Afghanistan are longing for an honorable way of getting out of the arms race. For us, we would be removing a tremendous strain from our economy so that it could once again be a shining example for all those countries looking for a model to follow.

Your ideas that you expressed last night on arms_control deserve the negative response they received. It seems cockeyed to spend enormous sums to reach parity with the Russians and then start scaling down the weapons. If one looks at the remarkable repetoire of our delivery systems and advanced technical designs, almost no one will believe we have any catching up to do. Moreover, catching up to kill them more times over is hardly a worthwhile mission.

You should have told the world that your negotiators are ready to present the most far reaching offer on arms control ever made-but at Geneva where it should be presented. If it is accepted, we will increase our non-military aid to 2% of our gross national product to those countries that are trying to encourage democracy and to improve the lot of their people. (This will put world opinion on our side and win a ton of allies for us.) If it is not accepted, we will make public our terms for the world to judge whether the Russians or us are prolonging the agony and threatening the destruction of the world.

If you would care to continue this dialogue with someone who is one of your fans but believes you are poorly advised on some matters, I am available. Give me a few hours notice and I will pay my own airfare to meet you anywhere. No one-especially the press-will know of the meeting or what was said, unless you want it otherwise.
