Dear Mr. President,

It was wonderful to learn a few weeks ago, first on "Crossfire" and then from talking with Dick Allen on the phone, all that he and you and Mr. Haig did to secure my release from Evin Prison in February 1981.

The return home three years ago was so tiring and so confusing that I overlooked sending you a Thank-you note then. I did write to the U.S. Ambassadors to the United Arab Emirates and Switzerland, and several of their staff, as well as the Swiss officials who were so helpful and wonderful. In fact, I have maintained a corresponding friendship with an excellent Swiss diplomat, Wilhelm

Schmid, who did the legwork, the
Consoling, and the support at my
trial that I so desperately needed.

I shall always be proud of
having tried to help a few hostages,
and I do not mind having served
nine months in prison for my attempt.
I conducted myself like the American
my parents raised me to be, and both
respected my jailers and got them to
respect me. It was a fantastic learning
experience for a writer and journalist,
and I do not regret having gone or
been there.

Because I am a pacifist and a
passionate believer in human rights,
I do not always agree with your
foreign policy. However, I think the
role you played vis-a-vis Iran during
the campaign and immediately after
the election was very good and must
have helped free the hostages - and

certainly me.

I hope that you will not "tilt" the United States toward Iraq and against Iran. Most Iranians are willing to be friends of the United States - you should have heard how the women prisoners cheered upon news of your election - and we need them as our friends. Not Khomeini and his immediate circle, but Iranians who have an ancient culture, a good religion, and an intelligence in the ways of that part of Asia.

I pray also that you will remain friends with the good people of the Muslim Arab world and settle the problems in Lebanon and bring our men home.

I prayed for your recovery while I was writing my Iranian memoirs for a local paper, and shall pray God to guide you always.

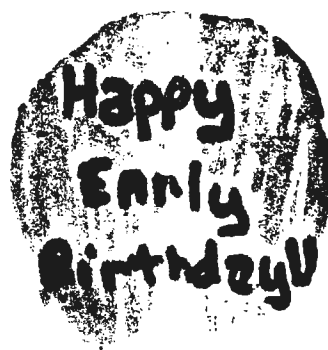
